*Will the Minister In-charge of the Capital Administration and Development Division be pleased to state:*

- (a) whether it is a fact that the underground water level is being decreased in Islamabad;*
- (b) if so, the year-wise underground water level decreased in Islamabad during the last five years till date alongwith reasons thereof?*

*(Deferred during 40th Session)*

*Will the Minister In-charge of the Cabinet Division be pleased to state:*

- (a) whether it is a fact that the construction works of few hospitals started by the Federal Government in Rawalpindi and said construction works have been stopped due to non-release of funds therefor;*
- (b) if the answer to part (a) above is in the affirmative, whether the Ministry has taken notice thereon; if so, the details thereof; and*

(c) *the steps being taken by the Ministry to release funds for the said hospitals?*

**Minister In-charge of the Cabinet Division:** (a) Yes, it is a fact that construction of a Hospital under the title “400 Bed Women Hospital & Chest Diseases Centre” started in Rawalpindi, has been stopped due to non-release of funds. The funds were stopped on account of certain reasons including cost and scope of work deviations in the wake of 18th constitutional amendment.

(b) Cabinet Division has taken notice. Further detail is in part (c).

(c) Cabinet Division has prepared a revised PC-I in consultation with NESPAK for conversion of above hospital into a “400 bed hospital for Gynaecology & Obstetrics”. The phase-I (200 Bed of this revised PC-I) is under submission to M/o Planning, Development & Reforms for onward placement before Central Development Working Party (CDWP). The funds would be released for the said hospital subject to approval by the relevant forum (**Annex-I**).

*Will the Minister In-charge of the Establishment Division be pleased to state:*

- (a) *whether it is a fact that the Federal Government has upgraded post of the Lower Division Clerk (LDC) from BPS-07 to BPS-09 and post of the Upper Division Clerk (UDC) from BPS-09 to BPS-11 during the budget 2016-17;*
- (b) *whether it is also a fact that the post of LDC has upgraded from BPS-07 to BPS-11 and the post of UDC has upgraded from BPS-09 to BPS-14 by the Government of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Punjab during last years;*
- (c) *if answers to part (a) and (b) above are in the affirmative, the justification thereof; and*
- (d) *whether there is any proposal under consideration of the Government to upgrade the post of the LDC from BPS-09 to BPS-11 and the post of the UDC from BPS-11 to BPS-14 in near future; if so, the time by which it will be implemented?*

**Minister In-charge of the Establishment Division:** (a) Yes. Establishment Division vide its O.M. dated 10-8-2016 had conveyed approval of competent authority for up-gradation of the post of LDC from BS-7 to BS-9, UDC from BS-9 to BS-11.

(b) In all Provincial Governments, the post of Junior Clerk was up-graded from BS-7 to BS-11 and Senior Clerk from BS-9 to BS-14. As per available record no post LDC and UDC has been up-graded in Provincial Governments. These posts are not comparable with each other. Further, Federal Government is not bound to up-grade its posts on the analogy of up-gradation in Provincial Governments under the up-gradation policy.

(c) Answer to part (a) is affirmative and (b) is not.

(d) No proposal is under consideration for the reason stated at part (b) above.

1. **\*Sheikh Salahuddin:**

*Will the Minister In-charge of the Establishment Division be pleased to state whether it is a fact that in-service training facilities for present employees are very limited at the training institutes; if so, the steps being taken by the Government in this regard?*

**Minister In-charge of the Establishment Division:** In-service training facilities comprise of mandatory trainings for promotion to BS-19, 20 and 21 and non-mandatory trainings which are aimed at augmenting specific skills of employees.

The in-service mandatory training facilities for present employees are quite sufficient to cater to the needs, however, in service non mandatory training facilities for present employees offer a huge potential for harnessing.

With regard to mandatory trainings, National School of Public Policy (NSPP) through its constituent units *i.e.* National Institutes of Management (NIMS) in ICT and provincial headquarters and National Management College at Lahore impart the following mandatory courses twice a year;

- MCMC for promotion to BS-19
- SMC for promotion to BS-20
- NMC for promotion to BS-21

In addition to above, National Defense University also offers in service mandatory training titled National Security & War Course for civil servants aspiring for promotion to BS-21.

The existing training infrastructure is adequate to train requisite number of officers who are due for promotion. There has been no instance where question of inadequacy of training to such employees has ever arisen.

As regards, non-mandatory in service trainings, the following training institutions under Establishment Division are extending short training courses;

Following training institutions cater for mandatory trainings;

- (i) National Institute of Public Policy (NIPP), Lahore
- (ii) Executive Development Institute (EDI), Lahore
- (iii) Pakistan Academy for Rural Development (PARAD), Peshawar
- (iv) Secretariat Training Institution (STI), Islamabad
- (v) Akhter Hameed Khan for National Rural Development (AHK,NCRD), Islamabad.

Following are details of training facilities offered by in service training institutes under Establishment Division.

### **NATIONAL SCHOOL OF PUBLIC POLICY (NSPP)**

#### **Types of Facilities and Courses Administered**

The training facilities under the Establishment Division for in-service training of government employees include *inter alia* the National School of Public Policy and its allied institutions *i.e.* National Institute of Public Policy (NIPP) and Executive Development Institute (EDI). As such National School of Public Policy consists of National Management College at Lahore, National Institutes of Management at Islamabad, Lahore, Karachi, Quetta and Peshawar.

These institutions are catering for training of BS-20 through the National Management Course at the National Management College at Lahore, BS 19 in Senior Management Course (SMC) under the Senior Management Wings of National Management College and BS 18 Mid-Career Management Course (MCMC) at the Provincial and the federal capitals as reflected at the following table:

However, National Institute of Management at Quetta and Peshawar are only administering training courses namely Mid-Career Management Course for BS-18 officers. Campuses at Peshawar, Islamabad and Lahore for MCMC Courses are shared with PARD, NCRD and Civil Services Academy (PAS) Campus.

### **Trainees**

These institutions are mandated for in service training of officers of Provincial Government in case of BS-19 and 20, *Ex-cadre* employees for BS.18-20 and for officers of the Centrally constituted Superior Cadres from BS.18-21.

### **Total Civil Servants & Training Facilities**

According to the Annual Statistics Bulletin of federal employees 2012-13, there are 202,156 civil servants in BS.17-22 and 424,660 civil servants in BS 1-16. As the officers in BS-17 and above form a little percentage of total officers as most of the officers belong to technical cadres and hence not required to undergo mandatory in service trainings for promotion to next grades. To the extent of in service non mandatory trainings, training infrastructure needs augmentation.

To this end, National School of Public Policy is anxiously pursuing this an agenda of 11 PSDP Projects (**Annex B reflecting schemes regarding transportation, IT Center, Tube Well, NIPP, Hostels, Library etc.**) to solicit developmental allocations for enhancing and augmenting training facilities and the same has been proposed to be included in PSDP 2017-2018.

With a view to fulfill the objective of Pillar-III of Vision 2025 “Civil Service Reform” the Establishment Division through National School of Public Policy has secured a PSDP project titled “**Establishment of IT Centre and online Training Facility at NSPP**” (Annex-C) which targets training of total of 2000 Civil Servants in BS.5- 16 from 10 federal divisions through the Establishment Division during the initial stages of the project through collaboration of Virtual University. Subsequently, online training shall be extended to include officers in BS-17 and above through specialized online courses and through this initiative, the outreach of training mechanism at the disposal of National School of Public Policy shall be augmented manifold. This is in consonance with the concepts of democratic governance, institutional reforms and modernization of public sector contemplated in “Vision 2025”. However, the scheme is held up for want of requisite federal government clearance of MOU with Virtual University.

### **PAKISTAN ACADEMY FOR RURAL DEVELOPMENT (PARDA)**

Pakistan Academy for Rural Development is a premier training institution which is fully equipped with all required facilities has no shortage of facilities Academy:

- Instructor 06.
- Research Associates 06.
- A fully equipped Library with almost 62000 books.
- Two computer Labs with 60 work stations.
- Two Hostels consisting of 39 rooms each with double occupancy
- One Auditorium with 175 seating capacity.
- Four class rooms with 50 seating capacity each equipped with state of the art AV equipments. Cafeteria for 300 persons.
- Indoor & outdoor games facilities *i.e.* Lawn Tennis, Badminton, Squash, Table Tennis, Basket Ball etc.
- Gym Club for participants.
- Two Mosques.
- Dispensary.



- Conference room with video conferencing facilities Agricultural Farm, Fish Farm for training of participants from Agriculture Departments and farmers.
- Well managed power supply back up system.
- Fool proof security system
- Walking Track
- Transport facilities for field trips/study tours.

### **SECRETARIAT TRAINING INSTITUTE (STI).**

STI offers a variety of in-service training courses at its campus at H-9, Islamabad. Annual Capacity Building Training requirement is sufficiently met through accommodating approximately 2000 nomination from Federal Government Ministries / Divisions / Departments and Organizations. Necessary facilities for appropriate learning environment are also available.

### **AKHTER HAMEED KHAN, NATIONAL CENTRE FOR RURAL DEVELOPMENT (AHK-NCRD)**

Akhtar Hameed Khan National Centre for Rural Development (AHKNCRD), an attached department of Establishment Division, is responsible for promoting the cause of rural development in Pakistan through its programmes of training and research. Training is imported, *inter alia* to officials of the Local Government and Rural Development Departments elected representatives, functionaries of National Building Department (NBD's) to improve their professional skill and promote sharing of experience concerning rural development in Pakistan.

AHKNCRD is functional since 1983 as an attached Department of the Ministry of LG&RD and as a result of 18th Amendment in Constitution of Pakistan; it has become an Attached Department of Establishment Division.

AHKNCRD imparts orientation (one week) trainings on various themes related to Rural Development such as Poverty Alleviation, Natural Resource Management, Environmental Concern, Women Empowerment etc.

AHKNCRD organizes 35-40 courses and trains 1400-1500 participants, on average, per year.

The invitations for the training courses are circulated among different Federal and Provincial Government departments, Universities and NGO's involved in Rural Development. AHKNCRD accommodates all Government employees on priority basis and also as there are no fixed slots in the training courses, therefore, we have not received any complaint so far regarding the accommodation of government employees in our courses.

2. **\*Ms. Shahjehan Munir Mangerio:**

*Will the Minister for Railways be pleased to state:*

- (a) *whether it is a fact that a large number of labourers are working in the Pakistan Railways on contract basis at present; if so, the date and station-wise number thereof; and*
- (b) *whether it is also a fact that wages and facilities are being provided to said labourers according to the prescribed rules/procedure; if so, the details; if not, the reasons thereof?*

**Minister for Railways (Khawaja Saad Rafique):** (a) At present, there are 1290 labourers working on contract in Pakistan Railways. The detailed information of contract date and station is annexed at "Annexure-A".

(b) The wages, perks & privileges are being provided to the said contract employees as per basic scales of pay under the rules including Pay, House Rent, Medical Allowance, Conveyance Allowance, Adhoc Relief, Leave travelling and medical facilities except entitlement for pension and General Provident Fund (GPF).

*(Annexure has been placed in the National Assembly Library)*

*Will the Minister In-charge of the Capital Administration and Development Division be pleased to state:*

- (a) *the total funds allocated for Model and Federal Government Colleges of Islamabad during the financial year 2016-17; and*

(b) *the total number of students getting education therefrom at present?*

**Minister In-charge of the Capital Administration and Development Division:** (a) An amount of Rs. 3,469.806 million has been allocated to Federal Government Colleges working under Federal Directorate of Education during the financial year 2016-17. Detail is as under:—

12 degree Colleges	819.526 million
44 higher Secondary Schools upgraded to College level	958.823 million
20 model colleges	1691.457 million

(b) At present a total number of 98967 students are getting education in above schools/colleges.

4. **\*Ms. Parveen Masood Bhatti:**

*Will the Minister for Railways be pleased to state whether it is a fact that the entire railway track from Peshawar to Karachi is double at present?*

**Minister for Railways (Khawaja Saad Rafique):** The double track on Karachi- Peshawar mainline existed only on Karachi - Lodhran (843 Km) and Raiwind - Lahore Sections (47 Km) at the time of independence. The track between Lodhran - Raiwind has now been dualized in two phases *i.e.* Lodhran -Khanewal (121Km) and Khanewal - Raiwind (246 Km). The Section between Sahiwal- Raiwind was opened for traffic on 09-01-2016.

5. **\*Mr. Sher Akbar Khan:**

*Will the Minister for Information, Broadcasting and National Heritage be pleased to refer to the Starred Question No.67 replied on 14-04-2017 and to state:*

(a) *the year in which PTV Booster Project for Buner was included in the Public Sector Development Programme;*

- (b) *the time by which said project will be completed;*
- (c) *the reasons for delay in the said project; and*
- (d) *the action taken against responsables therefor?*

**Minister for Information, Broadcasting and National Heritage:** (a) PTV Booster Project for Buneer was included in the Public sector Development Programme. on **06-04-2004**.

- (b) The said project will be completed on **31-12-2017**.
- (c) The reasons for delay the said project are as under:—
  - i. Land acquisition process was started on **05-03-2005** for selection of sites *i.e.* transmitter building, TV tower, approach road and residential colony. In this regard. various meetings were arranged with Mr. Sher Akbar Khan MNA of Buneer District, and local management with PTV. The acquisition of land is a long procedure which took time due to hurdles from local administration and people. This acquisition of land was completed on **23-07-2007**.
  - ii. After that, consultant was asked to prepare site plan, contouring, soil investigation, preliminary drawings and cost estimate which was prepared by consultant on 08-10-2008 and the same was approved by the Managing Director, Pakistan Television Corporation on 28-01-2010.
  - iii. For award of job to civil contractor, prequalification process was started and price tender was invited from prequalified firms and opened on **28-07-2010**. According to the lowest price bidder, revised PC-I was submitted to Ministry of Information Broadcasting & National Heritage on **24-08-2010**.
  - iv. Revised PC-I was approved by DDWP on **09-10-2013** and job was awarded to M/s Zain-ul-Abdeen & Sons, Mingora swat *vide* letter NO. ENG/PLG/B-293/9588 dated **15-01-2014**.
  - v. Contractor and his team were mobilized at site but due to law & order situation in the area and dispute on the approach road with

local people, contractor could not complete the work in time. However, it will be completed upto 31-12-2017 in all respects.

(d) As per record, the delay was mainly due to land dispute, late revision of PC-I and law & order situation in the area, which was beyond control of PTV management.

6. **\*Ms. Tahira Aurangzeb:**

*Will the Minister In-charge of the Capital Administration and Development Division be pleased to state:*

- (a) *whether there is any proposal under consideration of the Government to upgrade the Capital Hospital, Islamabad;*
- (b) *if so, the time by which the said Hospital will be upgraded?*

**Minister In-charge of the Capital Administration and Development Division:** (a) Capital Hospital works under the Administrative control of Capital Development Authority.

Following proposals have been approved in order to upgrade Capital Hospital:

- 1. Establishment of Cardiac Surgery Facility.
- 2. Construction of New Block.
- (b) 1. Equipment for Cardiac Surgery has been purchased and recruitment of Human Resource is under process which will be completed in next 06 months.
- 2. PC-I for construction of new block has been approved by the relevant forum with completion period of 02 years. Hopefully the work will start in the next financial year after allocation of budget.

7. **\*Ms. Mussarrat Ahmadzeb:**

*Will the Minister for Federal Education and Professional Training be pleased to state:*

- (a) *the details of need based scholarships awarded to the students of the Federal Urdu University since 01-01-2015 to 31-12-2016 alongwith the dates of payments thereof; and*
- (b) *the prescribed criteria/system for the monitoring thereof?*

**Minister for Federal Education and Professional Training:** (a) The detail of need based scholarships awarded to the students of Federal Urdu University for the financial year 2015-16 and 2016-17 alongwith payment is as under:

**Annex-I.**

#### **THE PRESCRIBED CRITERIA FOR THE MONITORING**

The Higher Education Commission (HEC) acquires consolidated fund utilization report of entire amount transferred to the university along with the funds provided under Needs Based Programs. HEC also collects and compiles the data of the students and funds utilized annually.

Respective university has been established Student Financial Aid Office (SFAO). SFAO is responsible for running the outreach campaigns, convening the Institutional Scholarship Award Committee (ISAC) meetings and interviews of the applicants, data achieving of the awardees and compiling the records. Each and every awardee has to sign an agreement with the university wherein he/she agrees to keep the academic performance to a pre-set standard, will be careful about the attendances and follow the conduct SOPs of the university.

The performance of the students are monitored through the following documents:

- Academic Performance Reports
- Semester-wise Transcripts

To carry out the Needs Based activities, Vice Chancellor of the respective university nominates an official as “Focal Person” of the program who is fully responsible to share all the information about the awardees with HEC as and when asked. All the correspondences with the university are made through SFAO and focal person.

The performance monitoring is carried out through consistent interaction with the focal person and record sharing with HEC. During visits to the participating universities the record is checked and verified.

8. **\*Shaikh Rohale Asghar:**

*Will the Minister In-charge of the Capital Administration and Development Division be pleased to refer to the Starred Question No. 216 replied on 17-3-2017 and to state:*

- (a) *whether it is a fact that 95 employees have been appointed in the Centre for Liver Diseases and Liver Transplant, PIMS, Islamabad;*
- (b) *whether it is also a fact that the said Centre is non-functional at present; if so, the justification to appoint said employees; and*
- (c) *the duties being performed by the said employees at present?*

**Minister In-charge of the Capital Administration and Development Division:** (a) 95 posts have been sanctioned in Liver Transplant Centre PIMS, Islamabad 57 person were appointed against these posts.

(b) It is stated that liver transplant is a multi-disciplinary specialty. The liver transplant team comprises of Interventional Radiologist, Liver Anesthetist, Liver Intensivist, Per-fusionist and Liver transplant surgeon etc.

These entire professional are equally important for meaningful liver transplant. Unfortunately there is acute shortage of these professionals in Pakistan. PIMS have been advertising to hired the services of these professional. However so far the liver transplant team could not be hired to resume the liver transplant activities. Special salary packages are being processed to attract the competent professionals. Last time advertisement for recruitment against these posts was published in the press on 01-09-2016.

(c) The list of 57 employees of Liver Transplant Unit is enclosed who are performing duties in departments of PIMS Annex-A.

**Minister for Railways (Khawaja Saad Rafique):** (a) The double line track on Karachi-Peshawar main line existed only between Karachi-Lodhran (843 Km) and Raiwind-Lahore (47 Km) at the time of independence. The track between Lodhran-Raiwind has now been dualized and formally opened for traffic on 09-01-2016.

The dualization of track from Shandra to Peshawar ( 455 Km) is included in up-gradation of Main Line-I (ML-I) project under the CPEC.

The following important cities fall on the track being dualized under this project:

- 1 Gujranwala
- 2 Wazirabad
- 3 Gujrat
- 4 Lala Musa
- 5 Jhelum
- 6 Rawalpindi
- 7 Attock City
- 8 Nowshera
- 9 Peshawar

(b) The completion period of the project is five (05) years (2017 to 2021) subject to signing of Inter-governmental Framework Agreement.

Thirty Two (32) locomotives have been received in Pakistan while remaining 23 Nos. are in transit and expected to reach Karachi by end of July, 2017. A tender for procurement of twenty (20) D.E locomotives has been finalized and Letter of Intent (LOI) has been issued in favour of M/s. General Electric, USA.

(b) Five (05) Nos. of D.E locomotives of 3000 HP have been manufactured / assembled by Risalpur Locomotive Factory during the said period.

(c) Above mentioned five (05) Nos. D.E locomotives of 3000 HP locally manufactured / assembled were utilized for Railway operations during the said period.

**Minister In-charge of the Capital Administration and Development Division:**

**PIMS**

(a) PIMS providing health care services in 35 specialties of Medical & Allied, Surgical & Allied, Paeds Medicine, Paeds Surgery, Neonatology, Mother and Child Health, Burn Surgery (BCC) and Cardiology. The workload of PIMS is as under:—

The data given above indicate the huge work load of patient's managed by the PIMS hospital. It is pointed out that the patients from all parts of country are being provided quality health services even beyond the capacity of this Institute.

**FGPC**

The Federal Government Polyclinic (PGMI), Islamabad (FGPC) was established as Central Government Polyclinic, in 1966. Initially it was Central Government Hospital (Benazir Bhutto Hospital). In the beginning, it had only 8 indoor beds designed for 10,000 populations. It was re-designated as the Federal Government Services Hospital (FGSH), Islamabad in April 1986 with 253 beds. The hospital bed strength was increased over time to the current 545 beds. Its original plot size is 3.3 acres. In order to ensure appropriate access to static

medical services, the Emergency Services are managed round-the-clock and Outpatient services (**OPD's**) are being offered in two shifts. With the increase in the population, there is a dire need to widen the area of facilities in the hospital to provide up to the mark treatment to the people of twin cities because FGPC provides medical care facilities to federal government employees, their families and the all general population of Islamabad and its suburbs. An additional land piece of 2.54 acres has been allocated and extension of the hospital into 1100 beds modern tertiary teaching hospital is also under process.

*Will the Minister for Federal Education and Professional Training be pleased to state:*

- (a) *the details of skills/trainings imparted through the Prime Minister's (PM's) Youth Training Program and PM's Youth Skill Development Programme; and*
- (b) *the province-wise total number of persons benefitted therefrom so far?*

**Minister for Federal Education and Professional Training:** (a) The present Government demonstrated keen interest in the empowerment of youth in the country. The Government of Pakistan launched different programs for youth under Prime Minister's Youth Program. PM's Youth Training Program is implemented by Ministry of Inter Provincial Coordination. Prime Minister's Youth Skill Development Program being one of the component programs is being implemented by NAVTTC. This Program initially focused to produce 25,000 Pakistani skilled Workforce / manpower each year commensurate to the needs of local and International market and to enhance the employability of Pakistani Youth in the light of directives by Prime Minister, Islamic Republic of Pakistan. In Phase-I of PMYSDP, 24,834 out of 25,000 trainees successfully completed the training. In Phase-II again 25,000 trainees were enrolled and 24,459 trainees successfully completed the course. In PMYSDP Phase-III 50,000 youth was targeted to be trained in two batches of 25,000 each. In Batch-I of PMYSDP Phase-III, 23671 trainees have passed out while training of 25,252 under batch-II of phase-III had started *w.e.f* 2nd January, 2017 and will complete on 30th June, 2017. The prime targets of the Program are:

- To create competent, motivated, entrepreneurial, adaptable, creative and well trained / skilled workforce for local and international market.
- Better earning and livelihood will abstain the diversion of mindset of the young generation towards the negative activities.

- Contribution towards poverty reduction, social and economic developments through facilitating demand driven, high quality technical and vocational training.
- Provision of an equal access of training for women all across the country, empowering them to utilize their acquired hand-on skill to meet up their household expenditures through entrepreneurship.
- Disadvantaged sectors of society *i.e.* Orphans, widows, unemployed, less educated, minorities and senior-age persons (up-to 40 years) were prioritized for the training courses for their economic empowerment, making them an important pillar of the economy of country.

22. **\*Ms. Shaza Fatima Khawaja:**

*Will the Minister for Federal Education and Professional Training be pleased to state the progress achieved from the dual education system including technical/vocational and formal education by the Ministry during the tenure of the present Government?*

**Minister for Federal Education and Professional Training:** No dual education system project encompassing both technical / vocational and formal education was implemented during the enquired tenure by NAVTTC. However, it developed a Cooperative Vocational Training (CVT) based training program for technical / vocational education sector. The project was approved in NAVTTC's Project Steering Committee meeting held on 31st of May, 2016. However, the project could not be implemented due to the discontinuation of funding for NAVTTC's regular PSDP program in the TVET sector *i.e.* Prime Minister's Hunarmand Pakistan Program in F.Y. 2016- 17. However, vocational secondary school program was started in current tenure through National Education Foundation (NEF). So far 12 vocational secondary schools have been established (3 in ICT, AJK, Gilgit Baltistan, FATA each)

23. **\*Ms. Kishwer Zehra:**

*Will the Minister In-charge of the Aviation Division be pleased to state:*

- (a) whether it is a fact that the non-Pakistani Officer has been appointed in the Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) at a very important post;*
- (b) whether it is also a fact that the said Officer has been assigned to purchase aeroplanes for the PIA on lease;*
- (c) if the answers to parts (a) and (b) above are in the affirmative, whether the said Officer has misused his power therefor;*
- (d) whether it is further a fact that an eligible Officer was not available in Pakistan therefor;*
- (e) the authority who granted the approval therefor; and*
- (f) whether it is also further a fact that any inquiry has been conducted against the said authority?*

**Minister In-charge of the Aviation Division:** (a) It is a fact that Mr. Bernd Hildenbrand, a German national, has been appointed as Chief Operating Officer of Pakistan International Airlines *w.e.f.* 12th February, 2016. He has been appointed on contract basis, for a period of 02 years.

(b) Effective 9th May, 2016, he was assigned responsibility as Acting Chief Executive Officer of PIACL. Subsequently, the PIACL Board of Directors, authorized Acting CEO to finalize and sign Wet Lease agreement with Sri Lankan Airlines.

(c) The matter of leasing A-330 aircraft from Sri Lankan Airlines is currently under scrutiny of the Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) and their inquiry in this regard is currently underway. Any alleged irregularities in the subject deal or any alleged misuse of authority in lieu thereof can only be ascertained / established subject to the outcome of the said inquiry.

(d) As per result of a advertisement, a total of 23 candidates applied for the position of Chief Operating Officer. The 04 short listed candidates went through preliminary interview. In the second phase two candidates including one Pakistani were interviewed by a duly constituted selection Board, which selected Mr. Hildenbrand as COO of PIACL.

(e) The approving authority for the said appointment of COO being referred is the Chairman / Board of Directors PIACL which is the competent authority as per rules.

(f) Subject to our understanding as narrated in Para (e) above, there has been no irregularity as far as the appointment process of the COO is concerned. Furthermore, no such allegation was ever leveled by any quarter concerned. Hence the question of inquiry against the appointing authority does not arise.

**Minister In-charge of the Capital Administration and Development Division:** According to the Sr. No. 10 (page 16) of ESTA CODE the doctors who intend to do the private practice they surrender Non Practicing Allowance (NPA) (copy enclosed).

26. **\*Mr. Muhammad Muzammil Qureshi:**

*Will the Minister In-charge of the Aviation Division be pleased to state:*

- (a) *whether it is a fact that extra amount was collected from pilgrims by the Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) during Hajj-2008; if so, the details thereof;*

**Minister In-charge of the Aviation Division:** (a) The Hajj fares are advised and approved by the Government of Pakistan for every Hajj season. However, Competition Commission of Pakistan issued a Show Cause Notice No. 55 of 2009 dated 5th May 2009 wherein the commission leveled misconceived allegations against the PIAC for unreasonably increasing Hajj fares.

(b) The Competition Commission passed Order dated 20th November 2009 whereby it imposed on PIA a penalty of Rupees ten million. The Commission further directed PIA to work out an amount of refund to be paid back to the Hajjis based on the difference of fare between regular passengers and Hajjis within two months from the date of this order.

(c) PIA has not given any amount as the orders of Competition Commission were challenged in the Court of Law and the matter is still subjudice.

(d) Since the impugned order was passed by the Commission without appreciating the material facts and compelling circumstances, therefore, PIAC challenged the above order before the following for:

- C.P.L.A No. 29/2010 titled PIA Vs Competition Commission of Pakistan which is pending before the Supreme Court of Pakistan at Islamabad.
- Appeal titled PIA Vs Competition Commission of Pakistan which is pending before the Islamabad High Court, Islamabad.

**Minister In-charge of the Capital Administration and Development Division:** (a) Global System of Integrated Studies (GSIS), located at Sector

H-8/1, Islamabad charges monthly tuition fee of summer vacations from students on installment basis. In this regard, a payment plan is offered to the parents to pay whole year (12 months) fee in 9 installments spread over the year. GSIS has a student's strength of 1,796. 70% parents have opted this payment plan of 9 installments. Whereas, rest of the 30% parents are paying fee spread over 12 months.

(b) Islamabad Capital Territory — Private Educational Institutions Regulatory Authority (ICT-PEIRA) is mandated for registration, regulation and functioning of Private Educational Institutions (PEIs) in Islamabad Capital Territory (ICT) under Islamabad Capital Territory — Private Educational Institutions (Registration & Regulation) Act, 2013.

In pursuance of various provisions of this Act, it is a statutory requirement that all Private Educational Institutions (PEIs), imparting education formally or informally upto HSSC level and equivalent or 'O' and 'A' level within the territorial jurisdiction of ICT, register themselves with ICT-PEIRA. The operations of PEIs without valid registration are illegal.

The management of GSIS had applied for registration of its three campuses/ branches on 3rd December, 2014. Accordingly, the inspection of all three campuses was carried out by the inspection committee of ICT-PEIRA on 9th December, 2014. The management was issued a list of observations, in case of each campus separately, for compliance. Unfortunately, no compliance was ever made by the institution.

Therefore, the functioning and fee being charged by the institution is contrary to the provisions of Islamabad Capital Territory — Private Educational Institutions (Registration & Regulation) Act, 2013 and the Rules made there under and thus illegal.

(c) GSIS is charging Rs. 8,000/- as annual fund and as per statement of its management, the annual fund is being utilized for sports facilities, co-curricular activities and maintenance of the campuses.

(d) As per statement of the management of GSIS, the amount of annual funds *i.e.* Rs. 8,000/- is the same for the last 03 years and no enhancement has been made on this account, so far.

(e) During the phase of fee determination, the said practice shall be scrutinized and streamlined in line with Private Educational Institutions (Registration & Fee Determination) Rules, 2016. Recently, a Public Notice has been published in leading National Daily Newspapers, warning such PEIs to register themselves with ICT-PEIRA. The management has not applied so far. The deadline is closing on 8th May, 2017. Afterwards, action shall be initiated as per the Act and the Rules.

- (f) The said school has three branches, detailed as under:
- i. Head Office/Main Campus at Pitras Bukhari Road, Sector H-8/1 Islamabad (Grade-VI to A' Level).
  - ii. Montessori Branch at House No. 07, Sahibzada Abdul Qayyum Road, Sector 1-8/2, Islamabad (Pre-Nursery to KG).
  - iii. Primary Branch at Plot No. 86, Street No. 03, Sector H-8/1 Islamabad (Grade-I to V).

**ANNEX-A**

**PAKISTAN INSTITUTE OF MEDICAL SCIENCES( PIMS)**

The medicines of both multinational and local companies are purchased in PIMS.

The PIMS tender for the purchase of medicines on basics of generic names of the medicines. Only those medicines which are registered with DRAP are selected for purchased as per PPRA rule.

In current financial year (2016-17) PIMS annual tender of drug / medicines 64 medicines manufactured by multinational companies and 287 by national companies have been approved for procurement.

**FEDERAL GOVERNMENT POLYCLINIC (FGPC)**

This hospital is purchasing medicines from both National / Multi - National companies. Medicines are selected by the Procurement Approval Board constituted by the hospital. Selection is done on quality, experience and need of the hospital.

**NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF REHABILITATION MEDICINES (NIRM)**

The medicines are purchased through annual tender from the lowest bidding firms following the PPRA rules. No medicines is directly purchased from any multinational company.

**FEDERAL GENERAL HOSPITAL (FGH)**

The Federal General Hospital purchases medicines through open tender. The ones which quote lowest are purchased after approval of the competent authority.

**CAPITAL HOSPITAL (C.H):**

Capital Hospital works under the administrative control of Capital Development Authority. Medicines are being purchased from well reputed national and multi - national companies through open bidding under relevant PPRA rule on recommendations of the Technical Committee constituted for the purpose.

and Communications Technology (ICTs) operators/ system owners who take appropriate measures to ensure security of their systems in line with the international best practices and standards as well as the relevant regulatory requirements and contracts with the users. Under the PECA, the Federal Government and Pakistan Telecommunication Authority can also issue any directives/guidelines to the owners and operators of designated information systems in the interest of preventing any criminal activity. Federal Investigation Agency (FIA) has been designated as an investigation agency under the PECA whereas Pakistan Telecommunication Authority (PTA) is mandated to remove/ block any unlawful content.

National Telecommunication and Information Technology Security Board working under the Cabinet Division, is responsible for issuing policy directives with regard to use and security of Information and Telecommunication Technologies (ICTs) in the government sector.

(c) Yes, no appointment have been made so far. The Competent Authority constituted a committee to scrutinize the applications. The committee scrutinized applications and recommended 11 candidates who met the eligibility criteria and conducted the shorthand/typing test. No candidate could qualify test for the said posts. Therefore, the committee decided to re-advertise the posts.

(d) The appointments are in pipeline and will be re-advertised very soon.

(e) Yes, the university advertised the vacant posts of Assistant Private Secretaries on 23-05-2013 on Provincial/Regional Quota (2-Punjab, 1-Sindh(R),

and 1 Khyber Pakhtunkhwa). In response, no candidate applied against Sindh (R) quota whereas, 11 candidates applied against the quota of Punjab and Khyber-Pakhtunkhwa. The committee scrutinized the applications and conducted shorthand test of the eligible candidates. No candidate of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa quota could qualify the shorthand test whereas 2 candidates on Punjab quota qualified the shorthand test and interview. One of them joined as Assistant Private Secretary, whereas, the other did not join Quaid-i-Azam University, Islamabad.
