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RESOLUTION

The following resolution was moved by Dr. Tariq Fazal Chaudhary, Minister for Parliamentary Affairs and other MNAs, was unanimously adopted by the House:-

"یہ ایوان بلوچستان میں حالیہ دہشت گردی کے واقعات کی شدید ترین الفاظ میں مذمت کرتا ہے۔ جن میں نہ صرف معصوم شہریوں کو نشانہ بنایا گیا اور بلکہ خواتین کو بطور ہتھیار استعمال کرنے جیسے گھناؤنے اور غیر انسانی حربے اپنائے گئے۔

یہ ایوان اس امر پر گہرے رنج و غم اور تشویش کا اظہار کرتا ہے کہ دہشت گرد networks خواتین کے لیے استحصال، زبردستی، ذہنی دباؤ اور blackmailing کے ذریعے انہیں ریاست اور معاشرے کے خلاف استعمال کرنے کی کوشش کر رہے ہیں۔ جو اسلامی، پاکستانی اور بلوچ اقدار کے سراسر منافی ہے۔

یہ ایوان Security Forces قانون نافذ کرنے والے اداروں، صوبائی حکومت بلوچستان اور سول انتظامیہ کے بروقت اور موثر اقدامات کو سراہتا ہے اور شہداء اور زخمیوں کے اہل خانہ سے مکمل یکجہتی کا اظہار کرتا ہے۔

یہ ایوان واضح کرتا ہے کہ شہری آبادی، خواتین اور بچوں پر حملے ناقابل معافی جرائم ہیں، اور ریاست ایسے عناصر کے خلاف zero tolerance رکھتی ہے اور ان کے خلاف فیصلہ کن کارروائی کی جائے گی۔

یہ ایوان اس امر کی طرف توجہ دلاتا ہے کہ متعدد واقعات میں دستیاب crime بیرونی سرپرستی کی جانب اشارہ کرتے ہیں، بالخصوص ہندوستان کے کردار کے حوالے سے سنجیدہ خدشات موجود ہیں۔ جبکہ بعض ہمسایہ ممالک میں logistic اور operational سہولت کاری، مالی معاونت، تربیت، علاج، نقل و حرکت اور propaganda سے

networks کے ذریعے دہشت گردی کو تقویت دی جاتی ہے۔

یہ ایوان مطالبہ کرتا ہے کہ ان بیرونی sponsors اور اندرونی سہولت کاروں funding, smuggling اور propaganda کے خلاف فوری، جارحانہ اور مربوط اور ہنگامی بنیادوں پر موثر قومی رد عمل یقینی بنایا جائے۔ جس میں سیاسی، سفارتی، عسکری، intelligence قانونی اور تمام جو محاذ ہیں یہ یکجا ہوں۔
یہ ایوان اس عزم کا اعادہ کرتا ہے کہ دہشت گردی کے خلاف جنگ پوری قوم کی جنگ ہے۔ اس میں سیاسی اختلافات سے بالاتر ہو کر، ہمہ جماعتی قومی اتحاد و وقت کی اہم ترین ضرورت ہے۔ اور ریاست اپنے عوام کے تحفظ، امن اور قومی سلامتی پر کسی صورت compromise نہیں کرے گی اور اسے یقینی بنایا جائے گا۔"

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MOTION

The following motion was moved by Rana Muhammad Qasim Noon, which was adopted by the House:-

“that under rule 288 of the Rules of Procedure and Conduct of Business in the National Assembly, 2007 that the requirements of rule 51, 55, 57 and 158 of the said Rules in respect of the Ballot of the Private Members’ Resolution, Orders of the Day and Notice of the Resolution for today may be suspended in order to take up Resolution.”

RESOLUTION

The following resolution was moved by Rana Muhammad Qasim Noon, MNA, which was unanimously adopted by the House:-

“The Parliamentary Committee on Kashmir, in its meeting held today, adopted the following resolution;

The Parliamentary Committee on Kashmir reaffirms that Jammu and Kashmir remains an unresolved international dispute and that the people of Jammu and Kashmir continue to be denied their inalienable right to self-determination, in accordance with the United Nations Security Council resolutions on Jammu and Kashmir;

Expresses its unwavering solidarity with the people of Jammu and Kashmir, who continue to suffer under prolonged occupation and repression by India;

Welcomes and appreciates the presence of British member of Parliament Honourable Imran Hussain, and lauds his consistent and principled efforts in raising awareness and forcefully advocating the Jammu and Kashmir dispute in the Parliament of the United Kingdom;

Welcomes and acknowledges the debate held in the UK Parliament on Jammu and Kashmir, initiated through the efforts of Honourable Imran Hussain, Chairman of All Parties Parliamentary Group on Kashmir, as a positive step towards international awareness of the dispute;

Strongly condemns the ongoing Indian atrocities and grave human rights violations in Indian Illegally Occupied Jammu and Kashmir;

Notes with serious concern the report of the United Nations Special Mandate Holders released in November 2025, which highlights systematic violations of human rights in Jammu and Kashmir;

Condemns India’s draconian laws such as Public Safety Act (PSA), Unlawful Activities Prevention Act (UAPA) and Armed Forces Special Power Act (AFSPA)- illegally and indiscriminately use to suppress political dissent, restrict fundamental freedoms;

Pays rich tribute to the brave and resilient people of the Indian Occupied Jammu and Kashmir, who continue their struggle for self-determination despite severe repression and atrocities by Indian forces;
 Strongly condemns India's illegal and unilateral actions of 05 August 2019, through which it abrogated Articles 370 and 35-A, in blatant violation of international law, United Nations Security Council resolutions, and the aspirations of the people of Jammu and Kashmir;
 Resolved that the Committee demands that India immediately reverses its illegal actions of 05 August 2019 and refrain from any measures aimed at altering its demographic, political, or legal status.
 Rejects the cosmetic changes in the IIOJK and reaffirms that Jammu and Kashmir is an internationally recognized dispute, the final settlement of which awaits implementation of relevant United Nations Security Council resolutions;
 Calls upon the international community to force India to immediately end human rights violations in IIOJK, lift all repressive measures, release all political prisoners and allow unhindered access to international human rights organizations and observers;
 Further calls upon the international community, including the United Nations to play its due and effective role in resolving the Jammu and Kashmir dispute in accordance with the aspirations of the Kashmiri people;
 Welcomes the US president Donald Trump's initial offer of mediation in third country to resolve the Jammu and Kashmir dispute after May 2025 conflict between Pakistan and India.
 Rejects any unilateral decision by India regarding the Indus Waters Treaty (IWT) and stresses that such actions threaten regional peace and stability; and considers this illegal step as an "act of war".
 This Committee declares its complete and unwavering solidarity with the Kashmiri People and pledges to stand with them in all circumstances until their legitimate aspirations are realized in accordance with the wishes of the people as enshrined in the relevant United Nations Security Council Resolutions."
