



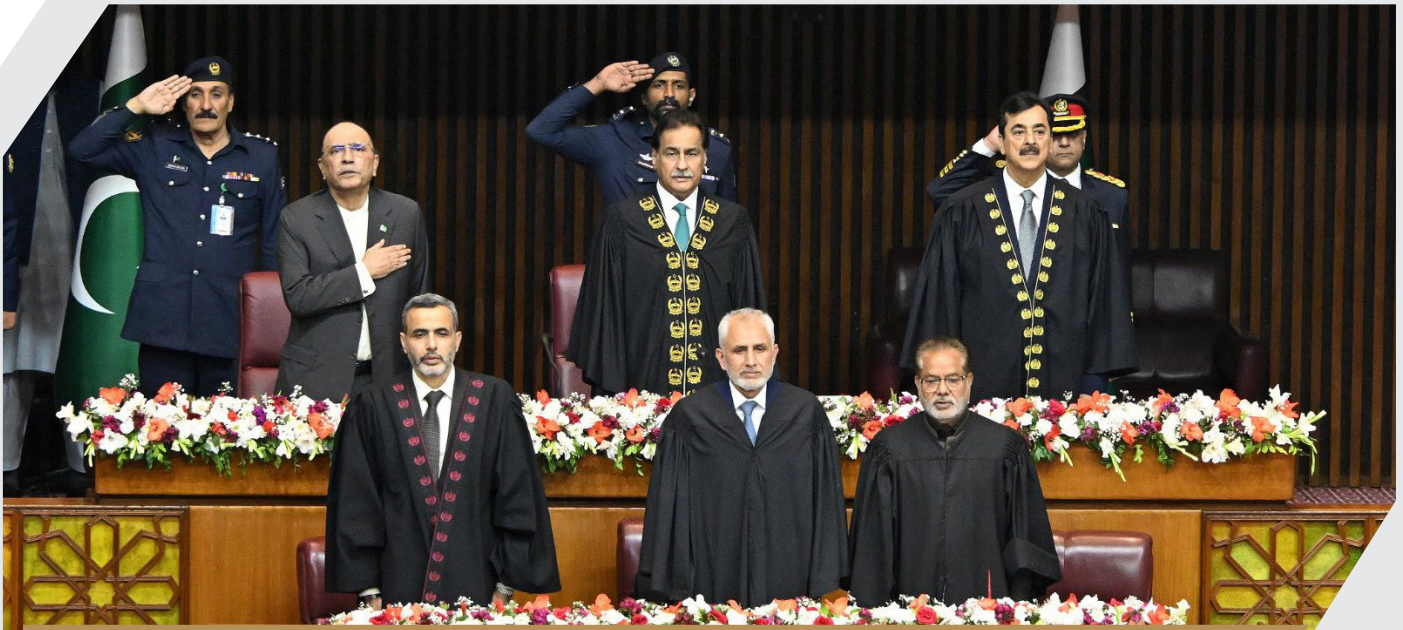

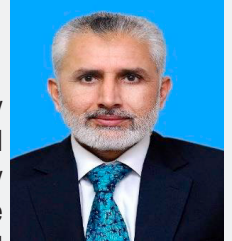

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MESSAGE OF THE ACTING SECRETARY



It is my pleasure to present this edition of the National Assembly Newsletter, highlighting the major parliamentary activities and accomplishments undertaken during the period from February to April 2026. This period was marked by active legislative engagement, strengthened parliamentary oversight, enhanced international outreach and continued efforts to promote democratic governance and institutional development.

Under the able leadership of the Hon'ble Speaker National Assembly, Sardar Ayaz Sadiq, the National Assembly remained steadfast in fulfilling its constitutional responsibilities and serving as an effective forum for legislation, accountability, representation and parliamentary diplomacy.

The House maintained an active legislative agenda introducing and passing Government and Private Members' Bills that contributed to strengthening the legal and institutional framework of the country. These efforts resulted in the enactment of 18 Acts of Parliament, reflecting Parliament's commitment to addressing national priorities and advancing governance reforms.

Parliamentary oversight remained a central feature of the Assembly's work. The 36 Standing Committees collectively held 58 meetings and examined 20 legislative proposals, demonstrating the vital role of committees in scrutinizing legislation, reviewing public policies and ensuring executive accountability.

Parliamentary diplomacy continued to serve as an important instrument for strengthening Pakistan's engagement with the international community. The Hon'ble Speaker represented Pakistan at major regional and international parliamentary forums, including the Commonwealth Parliamentary Association (CPA) conferences and the 152nd Assembly of the Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU).

The National Assembly also continued to deepen bilateral parliamentary relations through high-level exchanges and diplomatic engagements with friendly countries.

Parliamentary Friendship Groups, parliamentary caucuses, and thematic forums remained actively engaged in fostering international cooperation, promoting youth participation, advancing gender equality, supporting child rights and contributing to the achievement of the Sustainable Development Goals.

I am pleased to note that the Assembly's efforts toward institutional modernization, enhanced public engagement, and improved parliamentary services continued during this period. These initiatives reflect our collective commitment to building a more responsive, transparent, inclusive and future-ready Parliament.

I extend my sincere appreciation to the Hon'ble Speaker, Honourable Members, parliamentary committees, officers, and staff of the National Assembly Secretariat for their dedication and professionalism in strengthening democratic institutions and serving the people of Pakistan

President Addresses Joint Sitting of Parliament

Islamabad, 2nd March 2026

The President of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan, Mr. Asif Ali Zardari, addressed a Joint Sitting of the Majlis-e-Shoora (Parliament) convened under Article 56(3) of the Constitution. The sitting was jointly presided over by the Chairman Senate, Syed Yousaf Raza Gillani, and the Hon'ble Speaker of the National Assembly, Sardar Ayaz Sadiq, and was attended by the Prime Minister, Members of Parliament, provincial dignitaries, and members of the diplomatic corps.

In his address marking the commencement of the new parliamentary year, the President outlined the Government's priorities relating to national security, economic stability, provincial harmony, and foreign relations. He reaffirmed Pakistan's commitment to safeguarding its sovereignty, combating terrorism, promoting regional peace, and strengthening democratic institutions.

The President highlighted Pakistan's principled positions on Jammu and Kashmir and Palestine, emphasized the importance of dialogue and diplomacy in resolving regional conflicts, and reiterated support for international peace and cooperation. He also underscored the significance of cooperative federalism, effective functioning of constitutional institutions, and equitable resource distribution among federating units.

Reviewing the country's economic outlook, the President acknowledged improvements in key economic indicators and stressed the need for inclusive growth, employment generation,

energy sector reforms, poverty alleviation, and climate resilience. He emphasized the importance of empowering women, expanding social protection programmes, and leveraging innovation and technology to support sustainable development.

Concluding his address, the President called for national unity, institutional reforms, and collective efforts to strengthen democracy, ensure economic prosperity, and advance the welfare of the people of Pakistan.

Advancing Democratic Values through Regional Parliamentary Cooperation

The Hon'ble Speaker of the National Assembly of Pakistan, Sardar Ayaz Sadiq, addressed the inaugural session of the 7th CPA Asia Regional Conference and the 2nd Joint CPA Asia and South-East Asia Regional Parliamentary Conference as Chief Guest. The conference, hosted by the Provincial Assembly of Sindh, brought together Speakers, parliamentarians, ministers, and senior parliamentary officials from thirteen Commonwealth Parliamentary Association (CPA) member countries and provincial legislators.

Welcoming the distinguished delegates, the Hon'ble Speaker emphasized the importance of parliamentary cooperation in strengthening democratic institutions, promoting inclusive governance, and advancing regional collaboration. Hon'ble Speaker noted that Pakistan's parliamentary leadership, including the Chairman Senate, Speakers of Provincial Assemblies, and representatives from Azad Jammu and Kashmir and Gilgit-Baltistan, continue to work collectively to strengthen democratic governance and enhance inter-parliamentary coordination.

Highlighting Pakistan's efforts toward parliamentary harmonization, the Hon'ble Speaker observed that extensive

consultations among legislative bodies had resulted in the adoption of uniform parliamentary rules across national and provincial legislatures, marking a significant milestone in promoting institutional coherence and democratic consistency. Referring to the conference theme, "Trust, Inclusion, Innovation and Peace," the Hon'ble Speaker described these principles as essential foundations for modern democratic systems. He underscored the importance of fostering public trust, ensuring inclusive representation, embracing technological innovation, and promoting peaceful dialogue to address contemporary governance challenges.

The Hon'ble Speaker drew attention to the need for greater youth participation in democratic institutions, noting that young people constitute a significant proportion of Pakistan's population. He emphasized the importance of creating meaningful opportunities for youth engagement through leadership development initiatives, parliamentary internships, advisory mechanisms, and participation in committee processes.

Underscoring the significance of inclusive governance, the Hon'ble Speaker reiterated that the effective representation of

women, minorities, marginalized communities, and persons with disabilities remains fundamental to democratic development. He observed that diverse and representative legislatures contribute to more responsive policymaking and stronger democratic outcomes.

Addressing the role of technology in governance, the Hon'ble Speaker innovation in parliamentary processes. He noted that digital documentation systems, technology-driven legislative research, and citizen engagement platforms can enhance transparency, efficiency, and public participation in democratic institutions.

The Hon'ble Speaker further emphasized the importance of accountability, effective parliamentary oversight, and cooperative federalism in strengthening democratic governance. He noted that constructive collaboration between federal and provincial institutions remains essential for national cohesion, equitable development, and institutional stability.

On regional and international issues, the Hon'ble Speaker reaffirmed Pakistan's principled support for the right to self-determination of the people of Jammu and Kashmir in accordance with relevant United Nations Security Council resolutions. He also called for greater international efforts to address humanitarian challenges and promote peace, justice, and human dignity worldwide.

Concluding his address, the Hon'ble Speaker underscored that ethical leadership, transparency, institutional modernization, and active citizen engagement are essential for sustaining public

confidence in democratic institutions. He stated that future-ready parliaments must continue to evolve as more representative, accountable, and innovative institutions capable of effectively responding to the aspirations of their citizens.

Pakistan and Morocco Deepen Parliamentary Cooperation Through High-Level Bilateral Engagements

A high-level parliamentary delegation of Pakistan, led by Mr. Sardar Ayaz Sadiq, Hon'ble Speaker of the National Assembly of Pakistan, undertook an official visit to the Kingdom of Morocco from 12th to 17th February 2026 at the invitation of Mr. Rachid Talbi El Alami, Speaker of the House of Representatives of Morocco.

As part of the visit, the Hon'ble Speaker held separate meetings with Mr. Rachid Talbi El Alami, Speaker of the House of Representatives, and Mr. Lahcen Haddad, Vice President of the House of Councillors (Upper House) of the Kingdom of Morocco. The delegation also visited the premises of both the Upper and Lower Houses of the Moroccan Parliament.

Prior to the official engagements, the Hon'ble Speaker, accompanied by members of the delegation, visited the Mausoleum of Mohammed V¹, where he offered Fateha and signed the Guest Book in tribute to the late monarch.

The Hon'ble Speaker of the National Assembly of Pakistan, Sardar Ayaz Sadiq, addressed the 152nd Assembly of the Inter-Parliamentary Union (IPU) in Istanbul, Türkiye, and expressed appreciation to the Grand National Assembly of Türkiye for its warm hospitality and successful hosting of the Assembly.

Addressing parliamentarians from across the world on the theme, "Nurturing Hope, Securing Peace and Ensuring Justice for Future Generations," the Hon'ble Speaker emphasized the critical role of parliaments in addressing contemporary global challenges and strengthening international cooperation. He observed that the international system is confronting a period of significant uncertainty marked by unresolved conflicts, humanitarian crises, and emerging global challenges that continue to undermine peace and stability.

Reaffirming Pakistan's commitment to parliamentary diplomacy, the Hon'ble Speaker highlighted its importance as a vital instrument for building trust, promoting dialogue, and supporting the peaceful resolution of disputes. He underscored the continued relevance of the principles enshrined in the United Nations Charter, including sovereign equality, territorial integrity, non-interference, self-determination, and the peaceful settlement of disputes, as essential foundations for lasting

international peace and security.

Referring to regional developments, the Hon'ble Speaker reiterated Pakistan's principled position on the Jammu and Kashmir dispute and emphasized the importance of resolving the issue in accordance with relevant United Nations Security Council resolutions and the aspirations of the Kashmiri people. He stressed that sustainable peace in South Asia requires dialogue, restraint, and adherence to international law.

The Hon'ble Speaker also expressed concern over the humanitarian situation in Palestine and reiterated Pakistan's longstanding support for the legitimate rights of the Palestinian people, including their right to self-determination and the establishment of an independent State of Palestine in accordance with relevant United Nations resolutions.

Highlighting Pakistan's contribution to regional peace efforts, the Hon'ble Speaker noted the country's continued support for diplomatic engagement and constructive dialogue aimed at reducing tensions and promoting stability. He emphasized that peaceful negotiation remains the most effective means of resolving conflicts and advancing shared prosperity.

Addressing regional security challenges, the Hon'ble Speaker

underscored the need for collective efforts to combat terrorism and promote stability. He reiterated Pakistan's commitment to safeguarding regional peace while advocating dialogue and cooperation as key instruments for addressing common security concerns.

The Hon'ble Speaker further drew attention to the growing threat of climate change, describing it as one of the defining challenges of the twenty-first century. He highlighted Pakistan's vulnerability to climate-related disasters and outlined national initiatives aimed at strengthening resilience, promoting

sustainable development, and supporting the transition towards a green economy.

Concluding his address, the Hon'ble Speaker reaffirmed Pakistan's commitment to working closely with member parliaments of the Inter-Parliamentary Union to advance peace, justice, sustainable development, and international cooperation. He emphasized that parliaments have a shared responsibility to transform collective commitments into meaningful action that safeguards the interests of present and future generations.

On the sidelines of the 152nd IPU Assembly in Istanbul, the Hon'ble Speaker, held a series of bilateral meetings with parliamentary leaders from friendly countries to strengthen inter-parliamentary cooperation, promote dialogue, and advance regional and international collaboration.

Legislative Activities Overview

The National Assembly remained actively engaged in legislative business during the reporting period. A total of ten Government Bills and five Private Members' Bills were introduced in the House, covering a wide range of areas including governance, infrastructure, finance, education, energy, social welfare, and regulatory reforms. The Assembly further passed fifteen Government Bills and seven Private Members' Bills, reflecting its commitment to addressing emerging policy challenges and strengthening the legislative framework. These efforts culminated in the enactment of eighteen Acts of Parliament, while one Ordinance was also laid before the House. The legislative output of the Assembly demonstrates its continued role in advancing legal, institutional, and socio-economic reforms in the country.

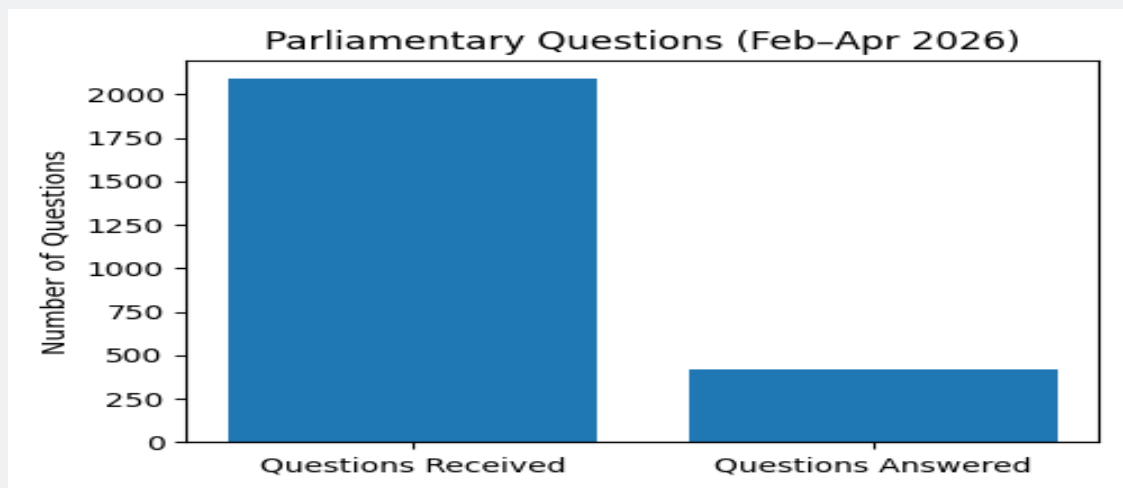

Islamabad, 14th April 2026: Rana Muhammad Qasim Noon, Chairman of the Parliamentary Committee on Kashmir, and Federal Minister for Communications, Abdul Aleem Khan, during a meeting on regional connectivity and infrastructure projects in Azad Jammu and Kashmir and Gilgit-Baltistan.

The Chairman of the Parliamentary Committee on Kashmir, Rana Muhammad Qasim Noon, chaired a high-level meeting with Federal Minister for Communications, Abdul Aleem Khan, to review the progress of key infrastructure and connectivity projects in Azad Jammu and Kashmir (AJK) and Gilgit-Baltistan (GB). The meeting was attended by senior officials from the relevant ministries and agencies responsible for the planning and implementation of development projects in the region.

The participants undertook a comprehensive review of ongoing and proposed initiatives aimed at improving regional connectivity, facilitating economic activity, and enhancing access to essential services for local communities. Particular emphasis was placed on accelerating the implementation of strategic infrastructure projects, including the Mansehra–Muzaffarabad Motorway, which is expected to significantly improve transportation links, reduce travel time, and promote trade and tourism between different regions. The meeting also examined the status of various road networks and connectivity projects designed to strengthen integration between remote areas and major economic centers. Participants discussed existing challenges affecting project execution and explored measures to ensure efficient coordination among federal and regional stakeholders.

Highlighting the strategic importance of Azad Jammu and Kashmir and Gilgit-Baltistan, Rana Muhammad Qasim Noon emphasized that modern and reliable infrastructure is essential for fostering regional integration, attracting investment, creating employment opportunities, and improving the overall quality of life of the people. He noted that enhanced connectivity would not only facilitate socio-economic development but also contribute to greater national cohesion and long-term regional stability.

Federal Minister for Communications Abdul Aleem Khan reaffirmed the Government's commitment to prioritizing infrastructure development in the region and assured that all ongoing projects would be pursued with renewed focus and efficiency.
