MESSAGE OF THE ACTING SECRETARY

It gives me pleasure to present the May–July 2026 issue of the Newsletter of the National Assembly of Pakistan, highlighting the key legislative, parliamentary, diplomatic and institutional activities undertaken during the reporting period.



The consideration and approval of the Federal Budget 2026–27 constituted a significant part of the Assembly's legislative business during the period, involving debate, scrutiny and consideration of public expenditure priorities. The Standing Committee on Finance and Revenue actively scrutinized the Federal Budget 2026–27, focusing on taxation, revenue mobilization and fiscal reforms. It emphasized fair taxation, taxpayer protection, transparency and sustainable economic growth.

To facilitate Honourable Members during the Budget Session, the Secretariat, particularly the Research Directorate, established a special budget facilitation desk to provide timely research support, briefing material and relevant information on budgetary matters.

Legislative activity remained substantive, with Government and Private Members' Bills considered by the House, while Standing Committees continued their detailed examination of legislation, policy matters and issues of public importance.

The publication of the Coffee Table Book, "National Assembly of Pakistan – Democracy at Work," represents a significant contribution to documenting the country's parliamentary journey and enhances public understanding of democratic

institutions.

Parliamentary diplomacy remained an important component of the Assembly's work, with engagements involving diplomatic missions and Parliamentary Friendship Group (PFG). Foreign parliamentary delegations contributed to strengthening bilateral relations and parliamentary cooperation.

The Secretariat also continued its efforts to strengthen institutional capacity through digital transformation, including initiatives related to artificial intelligence, parliamentary research and academia–Parliament linkages.

I hope this issue provides readers with a useful overview of the work of the National Assembly and its Secretariat during the period.

Federal Budget 2026–27: Parliamentary Presentation and Consideration

Islamabad | 10th to 24th June, 2026

The National Assembly's Budget Session, held from 10th–24th June 2026, remained a key feature of the parliamentary calendar, with the House undertaking detailed debate and scrutiny of the Federal Budget 2026–27. The proceedings culminated in the passage of the Finance Bill, 2026, marking the completion of the parliamentary consideration of the Budget.

On 12th June 2026, Senator Muhammad Aurangzeb, Minister for Finance and Revenue, presented the Federal Budget 2026–27 before the House.

The Budget envisages total resources of Rs18,771 billion, comprising net revenue receipts of Rs11,751 billion and financing resources of Rs7,020 billion. Gross revenue receipts are estimated at Rs20,600 billion, including Federal Board of Revenue (FBR) tax revenues of Rs15,264 billion and non-tax revenues of Rs5,336 billion. Following the transfer of the provincial share amounting to Rs8,848 billion, net revenue receipts are projected at Rs11,751 billion. Financing requirements are expected to be met through non-bank borrowing (Rs2,034 billion), net external receipts (Rs813 billion), bank borrowing (Rs4,012 billion) and privatisation proceeds (Rs161 billion).

Total expenditures have been budgeted at Rs18,771 billion, including current expenditure of Rs17,495 billion and development and net lending expenditure of Rs1,276 billion. Major expenditure heads include interest payments (Rs8,054

billion), defence affairs and services (Rs3,000 billion), grants and transfers (Rs2,680 billion), pension payments (Rs1,169 billion), subsidies (Rs1,091 billion), running of civil government (Rs1,071 billion) and emergency and other expenditures (Rs430 billion). The Federal Public Sector Development Programme (PSDP) has been allocated Rs1,000 billion, while Rs276 billion has been earmarked for net lending.

The Budget introduces several relief measures aimed at supporting economic activity and easing the burden on taxpayers. These include reductions in income tax rates for selected salaried income groups, abolition of the 9 percent surcharge on salaried individuals, withdrawal of taxes on sanitary pads and contraceptives, and reduction in withholding tax on foreign debit and credit card transactions from 5 percent to 0.5 percent. The Final Tax Regime for IT and freelance exporters has also been extended until FY2030 to support the digital economy and export growth.

The Federal Budget 2026–27 provides for a 7 percent increase in salaries and pensions of government employees and a 10 percent increase in the minimum wage. The allocation for the Benazir Income Support Programme (BISP) has been increased by 17 percent to Rs838 billion, with coverage expected to reach approximately 12 million families. The Kafaalat Programme and educational scholarship initiatives have also been expanded, benefiting around 9.2 million children. These measures form part of the approved Federal Budget 2026–27.



During the session, the Speaker highlighted the establishment of a dedicated Budget Desk at the National Assembly Library to provide research and analytical support to Members. The House also unanimously adopted a resolution appreciating diplomatic efforts for peace and stability between the United States and Iran.

The National Assembly considered the general recommendations of the Senate of Pakistan on 20th June 2026. Discussions and voting on Demands for Grants in respect of voted expenditure were held on 21st and 22nd June 2026. Cut motions relating to the Ministries of Interior, National Food Security and Research,

and Poverty Alleviation and Social Safety were debated; however, all demands were granted without reduction after the House rejected the motions through voting.

On 23rd June 2026, Senator Muhammad Aurangzeb, Minister for Finance and Revenue, moved the Finance Bill, 2026, seeking to give effect to the financial proposals of the Federal Government for the financial year beginning on 1st July 2026 and to amend certain laws. The Bill was subsequently passed by the National Assembly, concluding the legislative consideration of the Federal Budget 2026-27.

Role of Standing Committee on Finance & Revenue during Budget 2026–27:

The Committee held at least 6 sittings/days of intensive deliberations during 13th–21st June 2026, including post-budget analysis and clause-by-clause examination of the Finance Bill, 2026.

Key Areas of Focus

- Post-Budget analysis of macroeconomic assumptions, revenue, expenditure and fiscal outlook.
- Clause-by-clause examination of the Finance Bill, 2026.
- Tax reforms, revenue mobilization and broadening of the tax base.
- Taxpayer rights, transparency, due process and data privacy.
- Faceless audit/assessment and AI-based tax administration.
- Retailer Tax Scheme and documentation of the economy.
- Customs, tariffs, petroleum levy and sector-specific taxation.
- Debt management, subsidies and development expenditure.
- Climate and gender-responsive budgeting.
- Aviation, mobile phone and industrial-sector taxation.

Key Recommendations of the Finance Committee

1. **Broaden the Tax Base:** Revenue generation should focus on bringing new taxpayers into the tax net rather than placing additional burdens on existing taxpayers.
2. **Realistic Revenue Targets:** The Committee raised concerns over the FBR tax collection target of approximately Rs.15 trillion and called for realistic targets supported by structural reforms.
3. **Debt Management:** With debt servicing exceeding Rs.8 trillion, the Committee emphasized a comprehensive debt-management strategy to reduce borrowing costs and create fiscal space for development.
4. **Phased Tariff Reforms:** Tariff reforms involving an estimated revenue impact of Rs.143.4 billion should be implemented gradually, with periodic impact assessments and safeguards for domestic industries.
5. **Petroleum Levy Recovery:** The Committee recommended suspension of petroleum supplies to defaulting OMCs after 30 days of non-payment, while eliminating discretionary extensions and installment facilities.
6. **Fair & Digital Tax Administration:** Faceless assessment, AI-based systems and digital reforms should be accompanied by strong safeguards for taxpayer rights, privacy, transparency and accountability.
7. **Retailer Tax Scheme:** The proposed scheme should initially operate as a one-year pilot, with effective monitoring to prevent under-reporting and ensure expansion of the tax base.
8. **Reasonable Tax Penalties:** The proposed terminal-operator penalty was recommended to be reduced from Rs.10 million to Rs.5 million, along with an impartial mechanism for dispute resolution.
9. **Support Digital & Aviation Sectors:** Taxes on entry- and mid-range smartphones should be rationalized to promote digital inclusion, while equivalent fiscal concessions should be extended to eligible airlines from 1st July 2027.



Parliamentary Diplomacy and International Engagement

The National Assembly strengthened parliamentary diplomacy through 6 calls on the Honourable Speaker, 12 Parliamentary Friendship Group engagements, and other high-level diplomatic interactions with foreign dignitaries and ambassadors. These engagements focused on strengthening bilateral and inter-parliamentary relations, facilitating official visits, and promoting cooperation and goodwill with international counterparts.

Legislative Business

During May and June 2026, the National Assembly witnessed significant legislative activity, with 7 Government Bills and 1 Private Member's Bill laid, while 17 Government Bills and 2 Private Members' Bills were passed. The legislation covered key areas including economic and fiscal management, aviation and maritime affairs, education, healthcare, telecommunications, environmental protection, and public-sector governance. During the period, 10 Acts of Parliament received Presidential assent, including legislation concerning Special Economic Zones, plastic book covers, fiscal responsibility, Pakistan Airports Authority, nursing and midwifery, and the Finance Act, 2026. In addition, one Ordinance relating to the Pakistan International Airlines Corporation was laid before the National Assembly, reflecting continued legislative and regulatory activity during the period.

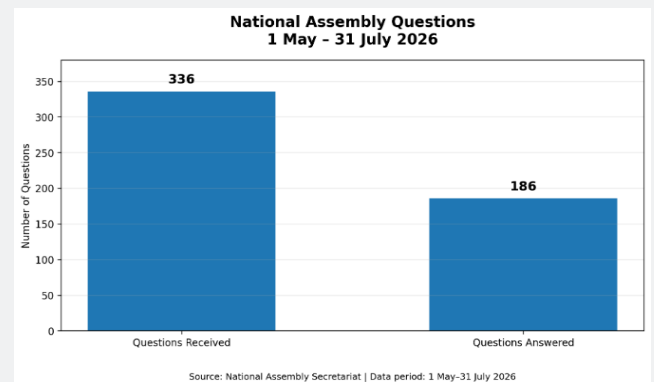

The 27th Session (11–22 May 2026) recorded higher activity in terms of bills introduced and resolutions received, while the 28th Session (10–24 June 2026) saw six bills transmitted by the Senate and five Government Bills becoming Acts, indicating comparatively stronger progress in the enactment stage.

Questions

During the period from 1 May to 31 July 2026, the National Assembly received a total of 336 questions, of which 186 questions were answered. The data reflects continued parliamentary activity and the role of the National Assembly in facilitating questions and responses as part of the parliamentary oversight process. The volume of questions received during the period indicates sustained engagement by Members of the National Assembly in seeking information and clarification on matters brought before the House.



COMMITTEES AT WORK

Standing Committees:

During the reporting period, 36 Standing Committees of the National Assembly held 54 meetings to examine legislation, institutional performance, and matters of public importance. The Committees considered referred Bills and reports, reviewed policy matters, and examined legislative and administrative issues. A total of 09 Bills were referred, 10 were disposed of, while 07 remained pending, reflecting the Committees' continued role in legislative scrutiny and parliamentary oversight across various sectors.

The Public Accounts Committee (PAC), chaired by Shahida Begum, continued its oversight of public expenditure during the reporting period, focusing on audit paras, recovery of public funds, and compliance with its decisions. The Committee is addressing a backlog of more than 40,298 audit paras/grants accumulated over the preceding 15 years. Five Sub-Committees, including the Monitoring and Implementation Sub-Committee, were constituted to support the examination, follow-up and implementation of PAC decisions which emphasized timely compliance with its decisions and directives by Principal Accounting Officers (PAOs), highlighting the need for stronger follow-up and effective implementation.

During May–June 2026, the PAC facilitated the recovery of Rs. 9,994.20 million and examined issues related to budgetary discipline, scheduled payments, and unclaimed dividends of State-Owned Enterprises. The Committee continued to strengthen financial accountability, audit follow-up, and oversight of public funds.

The Special Committee on Gender Mainstreaming

Islamabad, 9th July 2026: Dr. Nafisa Shah, MNA, Chairperson of the Special Committee on Gender Mainstreaming, chairs a meeting at Parliament House.

The Special Committee on Gender Mainstreaming, chaired by Dr. Nafisa Shah, MNA, held four meetings to review gender-responsive policies, budgeting, women's economic participation, and institutional reforms. The Committee emphasized stronger accountability, effective implementation, and policy measures to advance gender equality and women's empowerment. Following meetings was held:

1. Pakistan Bait-ul-Mal, Islamabad | 6th May, 2026

The Special Committee on Gender Mainstreaming, chaired by Dr. Nafisa Shah, MNA, reviewed Pakistan Bait-ul-Mal's welfare programmes, institutional reforms and service delivery. The Committee emphasized transparency, effective monitoring, beneficiary verification, gender-responsive reforms and stronger coordination to ensure equitable outreach.

2. Parliament House, Islamabad | 19th May, 2026

The Committee reviewed gender-responsive budgeting, women-focused PSDP initiatives and institutional accountability. It expressed concern over low allocations for women-specific programmes and the delayed appointment of the National Commission on the Status of Women (NCSW)

Chairperson, calling for stronger gender budgeting, monitoring and implementation.

3. Parliament House, Islamabad | 18th June, 2026

The Committee reviewed budgetary measures for women's economic participation and implementation of the Prime Minister's Women Empowerment Package 2024. Members highlighted delays in women-focused funds and called for transparent expenditure tracking and adequate resources for women parliamentarians.

4. Parliament House, Islamabad | 9th July, 2026

The Committee examined female labour force participation and the Care Economy, stressing the need for a comprehensive national policy framework. It recommended legal recognition and registration of care and domestic workers, expanded daycare facilities, improved data systems and stronger inter-ministerial coordination.

The Committee also directed relevant ministries to prepare comprehensive policy proposals and rejected inadequate briefings, deferring further consideration to the next meeting.

Key discussions focused on the implementation of the 18th Constitutional Amendment, parliamentary autonomy, institutional strengthening, and harmonization of legislative practices. The forum also reviewed proposals relating to capacity building, procedural reforms, and inter-parliamentary coordination. The meeting concluded with consensus on several agenda items, while others were deferred for further deliberation, reflecting a collaborative commitment to strengthening parliamentary governance and enhancing the effectiveness of legislative institutions across Pakistan.



Coffee Table Book: Tracing Pakistan's Parliamentary and Constitutional Journey

The National Assembly Secretariat finalized and published the Coffee Table Book "National Assembly of Pakistan – Democracy at Work" under the direction of Honourable Sardar Ayaz Sadiq, Speaker, National Assembly of Pakistan, in collaboration with the European Union's Mustehkam Parliament Project and authored by renowned parliamentary expert Mr. Zafarullah Khan.

The publication presents a visually rich account of Pakistan's parliamentary and constitutional evolution, featuring archival photographs and historical records highlighting key constitutional milestones, the 1973 Constitution, major constitutional amendments, and institutional reforms. It documents the National Assembly's legislative journey and its role in strengthening democratic governance, transparency and public engagement. Copies are being disseminated among parliamentarians, constitutional institutions, academic bodies, parliamentary forums and libraries to promote greater public understanding of Pakistan's parliamentary system and democratic heritage.

AI Tools for Parliamentary Research: 9th–11th July 2026| Murree

The National Assembly Secretariat, in collaboration with UN Women Pakistan, successfully facilitated a specialized training programme on AI Tools for Parliamentary Research. The training was conducted by Mr. Emad Karim, Advocacy, Campaigns and Innovation Coordinator at the UN Women Regional Office for Asia and the Pacific and was tailored for Research Officers of the Secretariat.

The programme focused on enhancing participants' capacity to effectively utilize artificial intelligence tools for parliamentary research, evidence-based policymaking, and analytical work. Emphasis was placed on the responsible, ethical, and gender-



responsive use of AI, equipping officers with practical skills to integrate emerging technologies into legislative research processes.

A key component of the training involved hands-on development of AI-based projects and customized GPT tools aimed at addressing institutional research needs. Participants conceptualized innovative solutions to support parliamentary functions, with selected projects later shortlisted for presentation at the national-level launch of the Gender-Responsive AI School.

The initiative marks a significant step towards strengthening the research and analytical capacity of the National Assembly Secretariat, aligning with global best practices in digital governance and reinforcing Pakistan's commitment to inclusive and responsible AI adoption in parliamentary processes.



Academic – Parliament Linkages

The National Assembly Secretariat continued efforts to strengthen academia–Parliament linkages through engagements with leading academic institutions, including Air University and the National University of Modern Languages (NUML). Discussions focused on research support, internships, capacity building, policy engagement, and youth participation. These collaborations aim to leverage academic expertise for evidence-based legislative work while providing students and researchers with greater exposure to parliamentary processes, thereby strengthening the Parliament's research, analytical, and knowledge-based capacity.

Engagement with Development Partners

The Project Management Unit (PMU) continued its engagement with key development partners, including UN Women, UNDP, the European Union, Mustehkam Pakistan (IP5), and Shoor Foundation, focusing on parliamentary democracy and institutional capacity. Consultations focused on enhancing legislative effectiveness, oversight, evidence-based policymaking, and support to the Secretariat and Directorate of Parliamentary Forums. These partnerships continue to provide expert knowledge, international best practices, and technical assistance, contributing to improved parliamentary performance, transparency, accountability, and institutional effectiveness.
