124. **\*Sheikh Salahuddin:**

*Will the Minister for Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatization be pleased to state the steps being taken to control corruption in various departments working under the Ministry except FBR?*

**Minister for Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatization (Mr. Muhammad Ishaq Dar):** Details of steps/measures being taken in the Ministry of Finance and its attached departments to control the corruption are as under:

A. **Finance Division (Main)**

Services of Officers/Officials working in the Finance Division (Main) are governed under Civil Servants Act, 1973. Whenever, a case of corruption unearths/surfaces, it is dealt in according with the provisions of the Civil Servants Act, 1973.

So far no case of corruption has been unearthed / surfaced in the Finance Division (Main). A monitoring mechanism has, however, been devised to ensure proper reporting about the conduct and performance of each officer/official.

B. **Central Directorate of National Savings:**

Being a financial institution, Central Directorate of National Savings has a comprehensive internal audit system in addition to the external audit to unearth the cases of corruption and initiating action under the relevant rules.

Zero tolerance is shown to the person if found involved in corruption.

### C. **Auditor General of Pakistan**

The following steps have been taken to control corruption in the Office of the Auditor General of Pakistan:

- A regular audit and inspection is carried out of all offices of the Department by Inspection, Regulation and Vigilance Wing, headed by a Deputy Auditor General and a report is submitted to the Auditor General.
- An inquiry is conducted on every complaint received from any quarter at the earliest and strict disciplinary action is taken against guilty officers.
- A Code of Ethics has been implemented through introduction of Financial Audit Manual.
- Field Audit Activity is supervised and monitored by Deputy Directors and Directors, who are designated quality assurance managers.
- Over all supervision is made by the Director General and detailed documentation requirements are implemented and monitored.
- Two Quality Assurance Committees have been constituted each at the level of Deputy Auditor General (BS-21) and Addl. Auditor General (BS-22) to oversee and ensure quality of output of the Department.

Zero tolerance is observed for any acts of corruption, malpractices and misdeeds on the part of the employees and vendors interacting with the office of the Auditor General of Pakistan.

### D. **Controller General of Accounts**

Following steps have been taken by the Office to control corruption in the CGA to control payments/transactions:—

- Automation through SAP System:
  - A “Bill Tracking System has been installed and implemented in field offices including DAOs throughout Pakistan.
  - Production of accurate and reliable Reports *i.e.* Monthly Accounts, budget Execution Reports (BER) etc through SAP System.
  - GPF final payments are being made by the system through respective bank accounts of employees maintained in the scheduled banks.
- PPRA rules are complied with while making the procurement.
- Periodical inspection as per approved Annual Plan of the Field Accounts Offices is conducted in administrative and financial matters. Inspection reports are submitted to CGA. The observations are communicated to Field Accounts Offices for corrective actions / measures.
- Financial Statements and Appropriation Accounts are submitted to the office of AGP for their authentication and forwarding to the concerned government(s).
- Vigilance Section of CGA Office scrutinizes the complaints of general public and seeks redressal from the Field Accounts Offices.
- Quality Assurance Cell (QAC) is established in CGA office to review the various system Generated reports.
- Vigilance & Monitoring Sections in every Field Accounts Office are in place to control corruption.

#### E. **Pakistan Mint, Lahore**

Ministerial instructions received time to time are circulated amongst the officers/staff for compliance.

**F. Office of the Federal Treasury Officer, Islamabad**

The e-mail IDs, telephone numbers have been placed on notice board to facilitate general public to lodge any complaint. Moreover, the AAO (Admn) and Federal Treasury Officer himself are in touch with the general public during the office hours to control and dispose off any complaints regarding corruption.

**G. Privatization Division**

Following steps have been taken to control corruption in the Privatization Commission:

- Pre-audit, internal & external audit have been strengthened and manned with responsible officer (s) to conduct timely audit.
- Discipline is enforced as per law across the board.
- Office procedures have been streamlined.

**H. Statistics Division**

Statistics Division and its attached department namely Pakistan Bureau of Statistics (PBS) have circulated among all concerned, the instructions contained in Cabinet Division's U.O. No.13/2/2013-Cab. dated 01-07-2013 through Prime Minister's Message to Curb Corruption, Nepotism, Un-friendly attitude towards Public and inefficiency for strict compliance.

**I. Economic Affairs Division**

Economic Affairs Division has developed and maintained a proper system of check and balance in all official tasks within the prescribed ambit of the Division.

The EAD's accounts audited from time to time have indicated no element of corruption during the course of audit.

**125. \*Shaista Pervaiz:**

*Will the Minister for Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatization be pleased to state:*

- (a) *the year-wise total amount earned by the Government after privatization of the Government Units during the last five years alongwith the utilization thereof; and*

(b) *the benefits accrued therefrom to the Government during the said period?*

**Minister for Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatization (Mr. Muhammad Ishaq Dar):** (a) During the last five years (01.07.2008 to 30.06.2013) only one transaction was carried out *i.e.* Hazara Phosphate Fertilizers Limited of 100% shares at a gross sale proceeds of Rs. 1,340 million and the net proceeds of Rs. 1,290 million were transferred to Federal Government Account (State Bank of Pakistan) Islamabad for Debt Retirement and Poverty Alleviation, in accordance with Clause 16 of PC Ordinance 2000 (**Annex I**). The remaining amount of Rs.50 million was utilized on account of Golden Hand Shake (GHS), Voluntary Separation Scheme (VSS), valuation and other transaction related costs.

(b) The main objective of privatisation is to put national resources and assets to optimal use, particularly to unleash the productive potential inherent in State Owned Enterprises (SOEs). The privatization policy specifically aims at enhancing the value of Government's shareholding, maximization of profits, modernization and up-gradation of SOEs, exploration and creation of new assets, management and technological transfer benefits and generation of employment. However, it may be noted that privatisation cannot be carried out in isolation and is dependent on both domestic and international regulatory, financial, economic and political environment. The global financial crisis emerging in 2007-08 coupled with the weak domestic environment, which was suffering from political instability and war on terrorism stalled the privatisation programme in the last five years. Despite these challenges, GoP has reinvigorated the privatisation program by preparing a comprehensive privatisation road map to be implemented in near future.

### Annex-I

#### PRIVATISATION COMMISSION ORDINANCE 2000

##### 16. **Privatisation Fund.**

(1) The Commission shall establish and maintain a distinct and separate Privatisation Fund in which all privatisation proceeds shall be deposited. The Commission shall, out of the moneys so deposited, withdraw and contribute to the Commission's Account such amount or amounts as may be needed by it from time to time but only to supplement the other resources therein if and to the extent necessary. The remaining privatisation proceeds shall be kept in trust for and

distributed to the Federal Government or the enterprise owned or controlled by the Federal Government entitled to such proceeds:

- Provided that the Commission may, if so required by the Federal Government, withhold a specified amount out of the privatisation proceeds, of Government of Pakistan's shares in the oil and gas fields specified in the Schedule to this Ordinance:
- Provided further that the amount withheld under the foregoing proviso shall be paid to the Federal Government and shall not exceed the sum equivalent to such proceeds as may be necessary to compensate the Federal Government for the investments made by it in such oil and gas fields.

(2) The privatisation proceeds distributed to the Federal Government pursuant to sub-section (1), shall be utilized by the Federal Government as follows:—

- (a) ten percent shall be used for poverty alleviation programmes; and
- (b) the remaining ninety percent for retirement of the Federal Government debt.

**Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control (Ch. Nisar Ali Khan) :**

- Ministry of Interior is a federal coordinating body. If any threat is perceived by the Intelligence agencies against parliamentarians the same is conveyed to the worthy Speaker. Any request for security

required for Parliamentarians, direct or through Speaker are immediately processed and concerned Provinces/ICT is conveyed to provide appropriate security.

- It is submitted that following measures are being taken by the ICT Police for protection of Parliamentarian under threat :
  - a. Deployment of 182 Police personnel during Session of Parliament.
  - b. Deployment of 336 Police personnel during joint Session of Parliament.
- DIG/Security, Islamabad is responsible and focal person for the security of both Parliamentarians and Parliament Lodges.

*Will the Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control be pleased to state:*

**Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control (Ch. Nisar Ali Khan) :**

- (b) *the per unit total electricity tariff which will be increased during the said period alongwith consumer-wise breakup thereof;*
- (c) *whether there is any proposal under consideration of the Government to change the policy of a unified tariff throughout the country; if so, when it will be implemented; and*
- (d) *whether there is any proposal under consideration of the Government to privatize any of the power companies; If so, the details thereof?*

*Will the Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control be pleased to state the steps being taken by the Government to secure Government Institutions from terrorist attacks?*

**Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control (Ch. Nisar Ali Khan) :**

- (a) The Federal Government promptly shares threat alerts and relevant intelligence information with Provincial Government/ concerned organizations, and also provides security assistance through CAFs when requested.
- (b) Provincial Government of KPK has reported as under:

The following steps have been taken to protect the Government installations from the terrorists attacks:

- a. All the important Government installations/institutions have been identified and the local police carry out foot/mobile patrolling of the area.
  - b. Watchmen/security guards have been directed to be vigilant.
  - c. Close liaison between Police and head of the concerned department .
  - d. In case of threat Quick Response Force (QRF) has been raised.
  - e. SOP has been prepared and circulated to all the district formations in this regard.
- (c) Information from remaining provincial governments is being collected.

9. **\*Syed Waseem Hussain:**

*Will the Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control be pleased to state:*

- (a) the number of Afghan Refugees to whom NADRA has issued the Pakistani National Identity Cards alongwith details thereof; and*
- (b) whether there is any proposal under consideration of the Government to enter blood group in the Computerized National Identity Cards; if so, when it will be implemented?*

**Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control (Ch. Nisar Ali Khan) :**

(a) Computerized National Identity Cards (CNICs) are not issued to Afghan refugees, unless they obtain citizenship/naturalization certificate after fulfilling codal formalities.

(b) NADRA is already maintaining Blood group records of the citizens during data acquisition of applicants but does not print on CNIC. However, it can be embedded in chip encoding data in Smart CNIC.

@11. **\*Seema Mohiuddin Jameeli:**

*Will the Minister for Planning and Development be pleased to state:*

- (a) *whether it is a fact that the ratio of poverty increased in the country from 15 March, 2008 to 15th March 2013;*
- (b) *if so, the province-wise total number of Pakistanis living below the poverty line at present?*

**Minister for Planning and Development (Mr. Ahsan Iqbal):** (a) There is no empirical evidence that the ratio of poverty in the country increased from 15 March 2008 to 15th March 2013.

(b) Pakistan does not report official poverty estimates province-wise, poverty estimates are released only at national level.

13. **\*Dr. Azra Fazal Pechuho:**

*Will the Minister for Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatization be pleased to state whether there is any proposal under consideration of the Government to give incentives to the regular tax payers especially to small companies; if so, when it will be implemented alongwith the details thereof?*

**Minister for Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatization (Mr. Muhammad Ishaq Dar):** There is no proposal under consideration at the moment for any incentive to the small companies. However, as part of drive to encourage corporate business, the rates of Income Tax for all companies have been reduced from 35% to 34% in the Budget of 2013.

14. **\*Dr. Nafisa Shah:**

*Will the Minister for Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatization be pleased to state the allocations of funds that will be required to pay off the current circular debt of Rs.62 billion?*

**Minister for Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatization (Mr. Muhammad Ishaq Dar):** Ministry of Finance does not provide any separate allocation for clearance of circular debt under normal budgetary process. Hence, presently, there is no such proposal under consideration. However, the Ministry of Finance provides tariff differential subsidy to the DISCOs to meet the gap between the tariff determined by NEPRA and the tariff notified by Ministry of Water & Power. For this purpose an amount of Rs.220 billion has been allocated for the current financial year.

The GoP expects that as a result of combination of measures that include tariff rationalization, recovery maximization, reduction in losses/theft, revenues of power sector companies will significantly increase and reemergence of circular debt will be greatly contained.

17. **\*Dr. Raja Aamer Zaman:**

*Will the Minister for Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatization be pleased to state:*

- (a) *whether the currency of Pakistan is being devalued against international currencies;*
- (b) *if so, the steps being taken by the Government to control the devaluation of the currency of Pakistan; and*
- (c) *the value of the currency of Pakistan against the dollar of the United States of America at present?*

**Minister for Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatization (Mr. Muhammad Ishaq Dar):** (a) State Bank of Pakistan follows a flexible exchange rate regime where the value of Pakistani rupee *vis-a-vis* other currencies is determined in the foreign exchange market through the forces of supply and demand in both domestic and international markets. Devaluation is a term used for fixed exchange regimes where the Central Bank or Government decides the value of exchange rate from time to time. Thus the concept of devaluation does not arise. However, the Pak rupee depreciated in the interbank market against Euro, Great Britain Pound (GBP), Japanese Yen (JPY) and US\$ by 6.9%, 4.7% and 5.5% respectively in FY 14 (from 1st July to September 10, 2013) in FY 14.

(b) In the budget for FY14, the government has planned substantial official foreign exchange inflows including 3G license fee, PTCL privatization proceeds, and loans from multilateral and bilateral sources. The timely and full realization of planned official financial inflows will help the buildup of foreign exchange reserves and in turn the stability in exchange rate. IMF program has already been started. First tranche of \$ 544 million has already been received. The program will not only result in buildup of foreign exchange reserves directly but will also facilitate in revival of other financial inflows from other financial institutions like World Bank, ADB etc.

(c) In the interbank market Pak rupee depreciated against US\$ by 4.5% in FY 13, while up till September 10, 2013 in FY 14, it has depreciated by 5.5% to reach Rs. 104.8 per US dollar.

*Will the Minister for Finance Revenue Economic Affairs and Statistics and Privatization be pleased to state:*

- (a) *whether a comprehensive mechanism is available with the Ministry for the Privatization of Government entities/units;*
- (b) *whether the Government entities particularly KESC and PTCL have been privatized without such mechanism; and*
- (c) *whether the targets set for the privatization of KESC and PTCL have been achieved; if not, the steps being taken in this regard?*

23. **\*Najaf Abbas Sial:**

*Will the Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control be pleased to state:*

- (a) *whether it is a fact that there are two main entry routes/points in the Punjab at present; if so, the details thereof;*

- (b) *whether it is also a fact that the said entry points are being used for terrorist activities, smuggling of drugs and non-custom paid vehicles;*
- (c) *the total number of check posts of the Rangers and Anti Narcotics Force (ANF) which have been established on the said routes/ points separately so far; and*
- (d) *the total number of employees of Rangers and ANF working over there to control said activities alongwith the steps taken by the Government in this regard?*

**Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control (Ch. Nisar Ali Khan) :**

(a) Afghanistan produces more than 90 % of the world's opium, much of it is harvested in provinces that border Pakistan in sizeable quantities. The large quantities of opiates and cannabis are trafficked from Afghanistan into Pakistan through porous borders of Balochistan and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. All the routes leading to Punjab from both the provinces can be used for domestic distribution of drug and further trafficking to other countries through seaport.

(b) No permanent check post on any of the entry / exit point of Punjab Province has been established by ANF. The checking by ANF is mostly information based.

(c) Not applicable.

(d) Not applicable.

**27. \*Chudhary Hamid Hameed:**

*Will the Minister for Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatization be pleased to state:*

- (a) *whether there is any proposal under consideration of the Government to conduct an enquiry regarding the loans obtained and utilized during the last five years; if so, when it will be implemented; and*
- (b) *the steps being taken by the Government to make the economy selfreliant?*

**Minister for Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatization (Mr. Muhammad Ishaq Dar):** (a) There is no such proposal under consideration in EAD to conduct an inquiry regarding loans obtained and utilized during the last five years.

(b) The key to self reliance is to have a sustainable level of national public debt. In the recent past Debt has become a problem as at the close of 2012-13 the debt stock rose to Rs. 14366 billion that is 62.7 % of GDP, which is beyond the permissible limit of 60 % under the Fiscal Responsibility and Debt limitation Act (FRDLA), 2005.

Present Government has accorded high priority to bring down the Debt to a sustainable level. Besides bring it within the limits imposed under law. Following measures, have therefore, been adopted:

- I. Institutionalize execution of Medium Term Debt Strategy (MTDS) and revamping the Debt Policy Coordination Office into a debt management unit with enhanced authority to independently administer the government's financial obligations and cash flows. It will ensure:
  - (a) Government's financing at the lowest possible cost given risk exposure parameters, and will seek to improve the benchmarking of issues to develop a deeper financial market.
  - (b) Using public savings and cheap foreign borrowings to finance deficit and reduce the burden of debt servicing. New domestic saving schemes are being introduced aimed at enhancing public access to government securities and reducing the dependence on the banking sector to avoid private sector crowding out.
- II. To resolve the energy crises, the energy policy has been finalized. Moreover, circular debt issue has been resolved to generate electricity and enhance productive capacity of industrial sector to reap the potential growth of the economy.
- III. Food security policy is also being finalized on fast track basis.
- IV. Various measures are being taken to accelerate economic growth including:

- (a) preparing long term and medium term Plans.
  - (b) 50 percent increase during current year in PSDP to accelerate public investment.
  - (c) creating a favorable environment for private investment in the country by overcoming the energy shortages and improvement in the law and order situation.
- V. Steps have been taken to control rising inflation through effective monetary policy and price control mechanism.
- VI. Fiscal austerity measures and tax reforms to reduce fiscal deficit.
- VII. Ensuring a transparent auction of 3-G license, PTCL proceeds to strengthen BOP.
- VIII. Recent Investment agreement with China is also a step to attract foreign investment.
- IX. Incentivizing home remittances through Pakistan Remittances Initiative Program.
- X. Entered into IMF program to strengthen the reserves position and further stabilize the Balance of Payment position and open the window for multilateral, bi-lateral foreign funding for our mega development projects.
- XI. The government is committed to take cumulative exports to \$ 95 billion under Strategic Trade Policy Framework (2012-15), by focusing on regional trade, market and product diversification.

28. **\*Sahibzada Muhammad Yaqub:**

*Will the Minister for Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatization be pleased to state:*

- (a) *whether it is a fact that the quantum of domestic and foreign loans of the country is increasing; if so, the reasons thereof; and*

- (b) *the year and sector-wise utilization of said loans obtained by the Government during the year 2012-13 till date?*

**Minister for Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatization (Mr. Muhammad Ishaq Dar):** (a) The quantum of domestic loans is increasing to finance budget deficit. However, the quantum of foreign loans has actually decreased owing to less inflows against outflows, mainly due to repayments of IMF loan.

(b) The domestic loans are mainly obtained to finance budget deficit, therefore, sector-wise breakup is not applicable. However, foreign loans were utilized against agriculture, education and training, energy/power, floods, fuel, governance research and statistics, health and nutrition, industry and commerce, physical planning and housing, rural development and poverty reduction, science and technology, social welfare, transport and communication, and water from July 2012 to July 2013.

*Will the Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control be pleased to state:*

- (a) *whether there is any proposal under consideration of the Government to conduct survey at Union Council level in the country to know about the culprits and addicts involved in Narcotics;*

- (b) *if so, the time by which said survey will be started?*

**Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control (Ch. Nisar Ali Khan) :**

**Minister for Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatization (Mr. Muhammad Ishaq Dar):** There is no such credible study or research that quantifies corruption in FBR. The figures of Rs. 500 billion quoted as yearly corruption in FBR or other such estimates are just conjectures and speculations, having no nexus with reality. Moreover, the quantification of corruption in value terms is extremely difficult and would involve huge funds to carryout study in this regard. However, corruption is a phenomenon the extent of which varies in different organizations depending on levels of discretionary powers, loopholes in the system and nature of governance.

As far as FBR is concerned, various policy and administrative measures have been taken from time to time to ensure transparency, minimum contact between taxpayers and tax collectors, strict internal audit, efficient use of information technology and action against delinquent officials.

It is pertinent to mention that during last ten years, the performance of FBR has been generally satisfactory despite various economic and political challenges. During last ten years *i.e.* 2003-04 to 2012-13 FBR revenues have jumped from Rs. 520 billion to 1,939 billion with increase of Rs 1.4 trillion in absolute term. Average growth during this period has been about 16%. However, tax to GDP Ratio did not increase for various reasons and this government is committed to enhance this ratio through broadening of the tax base and better administrative practices in FBR. Effective controls and zero tolerance policy in FBR will result in minimization of corrupt practices.

Surveys on corruption conducted by the Transparency International and other agencies have shown decline in the level of corruption in FBR.

**Minister for Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatization (Mr. Muhammad Ishaq Dar):** The completion of Tax Administration Reform Project (TARP) in December 2011 has resulted in infrastructural and IT – Support developments which in turn has initiated the process of transforming FBR into an effective organization. As the reforms are a continuous process, therefore, a new Project with the name of Project Preparation Facility (PPF) amounting to US \$ 3 million has been taken up in April, 2012. This PPF is infact a study to conceive the contours of a broader upcoming proposed “Revenue Mobilization program (RMP)”. During the year 2012-13 no reforms project was under-way nor any specific programme of reforms was implemented during that period, however a study based PPF (\$3 million) was negotiated with World Bank. This PPF will end in June 2014 and shall culminate into a Broader “Revenue Mobilization Programme” which in turn will enhance the capacity to make FBR a more effective organization in terms of generating more revenues with the tools of professionalism, transparency and technology.

138. **\*Dr. Azra Fazal Pechuho:**

*Will the Minister for Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatization be pleased to state:*

*(a) whether there is any proposal under consideration of the Government to privatize the Pakistan Steel Mills;*

**Minister for Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatization (Mr. Muhammad Ishaq Dar):** Project Document for Diameer Basha Dam Project is under preparation with the Ministry of Water and Power. This project document when prepared will be formally presented to the donors for inviting their funding. This is a mega project having more than US\$ 10 billion as estimated cost and hence, EAD is of the view that a single donor will not be in a position to fund this Project. As and when the project preparation is completed it would be forwarded to the group of donors for funding and the modalities of investment package will be determined at that point of time.

141. **\*Dr. Raja Aamer Zaman:**

*Will the Minister for Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatization be pleased to state:*

- (a) *the foreign exchange reserves in terms of US billion dollar as on June 30, 2008 and 2013, respectively;*
- (b) *the amount in terms of US billion dollar to be paid to IMF and other institutions separately by the end of current financial year under the head of debt retirement;*
- (c) *whether the current state/deposits of of foreign exchange reserves have potential to deal with internal and external affairs of the economy; and*

- (d) *the steps being taken to maintain reasonable size of foreign exchange reserves, smooth flow of imports, avoid default, and maintain prudent budget and current accounts deficit of budget?*

**Minister for Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatization (Mr. Muhammad Ishaq Dar):** (a) The total Liquid foreign exchange reserves as on 30th June, 2008 and 28th June, 2013 were \$ 11.362 billion and \$ 11.005 billion respectively.

(b) An amount of \$ 3.1 billion is due for payment to IMF and \$ 4.2 billion to other institutions (multilateral and bilateral) during the CFY.

(c) Though the foreign exchange reserves of the SBP have declined in recent months, they are within a manageable level to meet the scheduled repayments over next years. In terms of its outlook, two points need to be highlighted. First, the external current account deficit in FY13 has declined to 0.9 percent of the GDP and is fairly low compared to Pakistan's own and international standards. Also, the inflows of worker's remittances have remained strong and the trend is likely to continue in FY14. Secondly, the GOP has recently signed an agreement with IMF under EFF program and the first tranche of US \$ 544.0 million has already been received. In addition inflows from other IFIs are also expected to follow. Together these flows will provide support to overall balance of payments position.

Given these recent developments and outlook, we do not foresee any serious difficulties for SBP in making various international payments including IMF debt repayments etc.

(d) To support a sustained increase in supply of foreign exchange, SBP in coordination with Ministry of Finance and Ministry of Overseas Pakistanis has introduced Pakistan Remittance Initiative to ensure efficient flow of remittances into Pakistan. Workers remittances have continued to show robust growth during the last few years and have become a major source of foreign exchange inflow in the country. During FY13, inflow in workers remittances was at historic high level of US \$ 13.9 billion. The FY 14 workers remittances inflow is likely to be even higher.

In the budget for FY14, the government has planned substantial official foreign exchange inflows including 3G license fee, PTCL privatization proceeds, and loans from multilateral and bilateral sources. The timely and full realization of planned official financial inflows will help the buildup of foreign exchange reserves.

Nevertheless, to improve and stabilize the external position and build foreign exchange reserves over the medium-term would require growth and diversification of exports both in terms of products and markets; and improving foreign investment inflows particularly foreign direct investment.

142. **\*Sajid Ahmed:**

*Will the Minister for Interior and Narcotic Control be pleased to state whether it is a fact that criminals are taking refuge in Kachi Abadis of Islamabad; if so, the steps taken against those criminals during the year 2012-13 till date?*

**Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control (Ch. Nisar Ali Khan) :**

Yes.

With effect from 01-01-2012 to 16-09-2013, 115 cases have been registered against the criminals who took refuge in Kachi Abadies of Islamabad. Besides, 170 refugees were arrested and sent to judicial custody within ICT.

2. However, following steps have been taken by ICT Administration.
  - (a) The movement of Afghan Refugees has been restricted to their camps.
  - (b) The ICT Administration has been directed to approach the UNHCR for repatriation of Afghan Refuges.
  - (c) The survey is also being conducted against illegal foreigners residing in Islamabad.
  - (d) All SDPOs / SHOs have been directed to deploy their staff at all inlets / outlets to check the activities of foreigners and immigrants residing in the jurisdiction of ICT in Islamabad.

143. **\*Belum Hasnain:**

*Will the Minister for Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatization be pleased to state:*

- (a) *whether there is any proposal under consideration of the Government to launch any awareness Programme for Overseas Pakistanis to enhance the foreign remittances;*
- (b) *if so, the details; if not, the reason thereof?*

**Minister for Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatization (Mr. Muhammad Ishaq Dar):** (a) There is a proposal for PRI plus to enhance foreign remittances being finalized by SBP. Awareness programme will follow, after the approval of such proposal.

(b) The Government of Pakistan has already taken various steps for the awareness for Overseas Pakistanis to enhance the foreign remittances including launching of Pakistan Remittance Initiative (PRI) in order to provide for an ownership structure in Pakistan for remittance facilitation. PRI is a joint initiative of Ministry of Finance, State Bank of Pakistan (SBP) and Ministry of Overseas Pakistanis. This initiative has been taken to achieve the objective of facilitating, supporting, faster, cheaper, convenient and efficient flow of remittances.

*Will the Minister for Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatization be pleased to state the names of departments which will be privatized during the next five years alongwith the department-wise justification thereof?*

(a) *the achievements made for security in Islamabad through those scanners which were imported from China during the years 2002 to 2007; and*

(b) *whether those scanners are in working condition at present; if so, the details thereof?*

**Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control (Ch. Nisar Ali Khan) :**

(a) During 2002-07, no such scanners were purchased. However, two Mobile Scanners were imported from China in December, 2009 and were initially installed near Golra Toll Plaza, and Rawat Toll Plaza, sites, Islamabad during May / June, 2010.

Subsequently, the ICT Police submitted performance report of the installed scanners in July 2011, which depicted that these scanners did not detect explosives / weapons, laden in a vehicle. However, its differentiate organic / in organic material, loaded in a container.

(b) Yes, these scanners are in working condition. On the directive of *ex*-Minister for Interior one Mobile scanner was shifted to the Pakistan Rangers, Sindh for installation at Karachi, while other is under the use of ICT Police near Golra Toll Plaza Site.

147. **\*Khalida Mansoor:**

*Will the Minister for Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatization be pleased to state the year-wise total amount earned by the Government through privatization of Government units during the period from 2002 to 2008 alongwith the utilization of the said amount?*

148. **\*Tahira Aurangzeb:**

*Will the Minister for Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs Statistics and Privatization Interior and Narcotic Control be pleased to state:*

- (a) *whether it is a fact that a large number of Livestock are being smuggled at present;*
- (b) *if so, the steps being taken to control the said smuggling; and*
- (c) *the total number of persons involved therein during last five years alongwith the punishments awarded to the culprits?*

**Minister for Finance, Revenue, Economic Affairs, Statistics and Privatization (Mr. Muhammad Ishaq Dar):** (a) Pakistan borders are manned by different law-enforcement agencies like Frontier Constabulary and the Political Administration of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Balochistan. However, in view of long porous border with Afghanistan and Iran, smuggling of livestock across the borders does take place.

All the law-enforcement agencies along the borders have been given anti-smuggling powers and which is a deterrent for the smugglers of livestock.

(b) i. The operation of the Customs is restricted to the notified border Customs Stations *i.e.* Torkham (Khyber Agency), Ghulam Khan (North Waziristan), Chaman, Taftan only. The long porous border between Pakistan and Afghanistan along with the tribal belt is controlled by the personnel of F.O Khyber Pakhtunkhaw/ Balochistan and the political administration; however, the Customs has been directed to foil attempts of smuggling of live animals to Pakistan-Iran and Afghanistan borders.

ii. The political administration has been vested with powers of Customs Act, 1969 in terms of SRO 60(I)/2000 dated 14.02.2000 to control smuggling across Pak-Afghan border and similarly F.C Balochistan, Khyber Pakhtunkhaw including FATA are entrusted to operate within 20 K.M of the international border *vide* SRO 1090(I)/2010 dated 01-12-2010 to curb the menace of smuggling. To assist in interdicting smuggling, joint efforts between Customs and other law enforcement agencies are being encouraged.

(c) No case of smuggled livestock has been reported during this period.

149. **\*Shaikh Rohale Asghar:**

*Will the Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control be pleased to state:*

- (a) *the number of days within which new Passports are issued in the country at present; and*
- (b) *whether there is any proposal under consideration of the Government to impose fine on those employees responsible for non issuance of Passports within the stipulated period; if so, when it will be implemented alongwith the details thereof?*

**Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control (Ch. Nisar Ali Khan) :**

(a) Presently passports are being issued as per prescribed schedule of delivery. The passports applied against ordinary fee are issued after 12 days and Urgent passports after 05 days.

(b) No proposals regarding imposition of fine on the employees responsible for non-issuance of passports within the stipulated period is under consideration. Explanation of defaulting officials are called and they are dealt in accordance with E&D, Rules, 1973.

150. **\*Munaza Hassan:**

*Will the Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control be pleased to state:*

- (a) *whether it is a fact that there is a shortage of forensic laboratories in the country;*
- (b) *if the answer to part (a) above is in the affirmative, whether there is any proposal under consideration of the Government to increase the number of said laboratories to equip the police force with latest devices of investigation; if so, when it will be implemented?*

**Minister for Interior and Narcotics Control (Ch. Nisar Ali Khan) :**

(a) It is a fact that there is a shortage of forensic facilities in Pakistan.

(b) The National Forensic Science Agency is functional (Annex-A) and working in a rented place. The PC-I for NFSA had already been approved by the ECNEC (Annex-B). Tender for construction of building have also been floated in the press. After 18th Amendment, law and order is the responsibility of the provinces and consequently establishment of Forensic Agencies is their own responsibility. Punjab has developed its Forensic Science Agency and Sindh, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa and Baluchistan are further developing the facilities. However, where ever required, the Federal Government is extending cooperation in this regard.

## CHAPTER IX
