“QUESTIONS FOR ORAL ANSWERS AND THEIR REPLIES”

to be asked at a sitting of the National Assembly to be held on

57. ***Mr. Muhammad Moin Aamer Pirzada:**

Will the Minister for Energy (Power Division) be pleased to state:

- (a) *the average number of electricity consumers and the total monthly electricity consumption in each district alongwith the percentage of feeders facing more than 10 hours of loadshedding per day; and*
- (b) *the steps being taken by the Government to improve power distribution and billing recovery in the most affected districts?*

Minister for Energy (Power Division) (Sardar Awais Ahmad Khan Leghari): (a) The tabulated details regarding No. of electricity consumers, total monthly district wise consumption of last 6 months i.e., July 2025 to December 2025 along with No. of feeders facing more than 10 hours of load shedding per day is attached as Annex-A. However, summary of the data is as below:

(b) Following steps are being taken to improve power distribution and billing recovery in a prioritized manner based:

Power Distribution Improvement Measures:

- Execution of High Tension(HT)/ Low Tension(LT) proposals for network strengthening
- Timely Maintenance of HT/LT system
- Chain augmentation of distribution transformers
- Use of Geographical Information System (GIS) Enterprise Management system

Billing Recovery Improvement Measures:

- Installation of Arial Bundled Cable (ABC) for electricity pilferage control

- Installation of Advanced Metering Infrastructure (AMI) Meters
- Rigorous anti-theft campaign with the support of law enforcement agencies & lodging of FIRs against individuals involved in theft of electricity
- Accurate data retrieval of replaced / removed meters for accurate billing
- 100% combing of High Loss feeders (in phases)
- Timely replacement of defective Meters
- Achieving 100% accuracy ratio of mobile meter reading for general consumers
- Continuous enhancement in snap accuracy for other customers
- Timely billing of new connections
- Disconnection of defaulter consumers through live availability of defaulter connections on Management Information System (MIS) Reports

58. ***Mr. Asif Khan:**

Will the Minister for Energy (Petroleum Division) be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Division has taken notice of the alleged unauthorized changes in ownership and management control involving Spud Energy Limited, Frontier Holdings Limited and Jura Energy; if so, the details thereof;*
- (b) reasons for not initiating any action so far, under rule 69(d) of the Petroleum rules, despite the fact that the said rules*

empowering suspension or revocation of licenses in cases of un-authorized transfer; and

- (c) *what steps are being taken by the Division for regulatory compliance, to safeguard regulatory oversight and national interests in the oil and gas sector?*

Minister for Energy (Petroleum Division) (Mr. Ali Pervaiz): (a) The Directorate General of Petroleum Concessions (DGPC), Petroleum Division has taken cognizance of the matter and initiated regulatory action by issuing a Show Cause Notice dated 18 July 2025 to M/s Jura Energy Corporation, M/s Frontier Holdings Limited, and M/s Spud Energy Pty Limited under Rule 68(d) of the Pakistan Petroleum (Exploration & Production) Rules, 1986, Rule 69(d) of the Pakistan Petroleum (Exploration & Production) Rules, 2001, read with Rule 71(c) of the 1986 Rules and Rule 52(f) of the 2001 Rules.

(b) DGPC has already initiated action in accordance with the prescribed statutory procedure by issuing the Show Cause Notice dated 18 July 2025 under the relevant provisions of the Petroleum Rules. The Rules expressly require completion of the show cause process as a mandatory precondition before revocation or suspension proceedings can be undertaken.

(c) As a first step, a Show Cause Notice dated 18 July 2025 has been issued under the relevant provisions of the Petroleum Rules.

The said Rules also requires affording the licence holder an opportunity to explain the alleged breach and, where applicable, to remedy the same or offer reasonable compensation. Accordingly, the issued Show Cause Notice requires the companies to submit detailed explanations along with relevant documentary evidence

Revocation is an available remedy under the Rules and shall be considered upon completion of all codal formalities, including evaluation of the replies and supporting documents submitted by the concerned companies. The matter involves multi-jurisdictional corporate arrangements and potential tax and securities implications, necessitating a careful, evidence-based assessment before the imposition of severe regulatory sanctions.

It is also informed that the matter also remained subjudice before the Islamabad High Court and has been recently disposed by honorable court on 6th February 2026 with the direction to proceed as per show cause notice in accordance with Law, after affording a reasonable hearing to the parties.

60. ***Syed Ali Qasim Gillani:**

Will the Minister for Energy (Petroleum Division) be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether it is a fact that the sale of substandard Gas cylinders in the country has resulted in repeated explosions, causing the loss of precious human lives;*
- (b) *whether the Government has issued safety standards and regulatory measures in this regard;*
- (c) *if so, the details thereof; if not, the reasons therefor?*

Minister for Energy (Petroleum Division) (Mr. Ali Pervaiz): (a)

It is clarified that while investigating such cases, it is found that majority of the reported explosions have primarily resulted from unsafe handling of gas cylinders that results in gas leakage and on catching electric circuit from nearby sources. Further investigation by OGRA and provincial authorities have revealed that such incidents are largely attributable to:

- i. Improper handling and unsafe usage by consumers.
- ii. Illegal decanting and filling operations at unauthorized locations/shops.
- iii. Non-compliance with prescribed safety standards by certain market players/decanterers.

(b) As per Federal Government policy & LPG Rules, OGRA is regulating the LPG sector as per safety standards mentioned therein, including cylinder manufacturing, filling, safe handling, transportation, storage, and marketing. These includes public advisories and safety guidelines for consumers on safe handling/use of LPG cylinders. Consumers are advised to purchase LPG only from licensed distributors

and avoid uncertified cylinders. The details of authorized LPG cylinder manufacturing are also available on OGRA website and the same has been advertised as well. OGRA's Enforcement Department conducts routine and surprise inspections of LPG storage / filling plants and marketing operations. Non-compliance results in sealing of facilities with the help of District Authorities, issuance of show-cause notices, financial penalties, suspension or cancellation of licenses. In addition, OGRA coordinates with Provincial Governments, District Administrations, and law enforcement agencies to curb illegal decanting and sale of substandard cylinders. Furthermore, OGRA has transferred powers under Section-29 of OGRA Ordinance 2002 to the local government for taking action against the illegal activities.

61. ***Ms. Naeema Kishwar Khan:**

Will the Minister for Communications be pleased to state the details of the roads protection walls constructed by National Highway Authority (NHA) in Lahore and names of its surrounding projects during the last three years?

Minister for Communications (Mr. Abdul Aleem Khan): (i) In last three years, following projects in vicinity of Lahore were executed by NHA:

1. **Construction of Imamia Colony Railway Flyover Project:**

Remarks: The project has been completed and opened to traffic w.e.f. 15.03.2024.

2. **Construction of Kot Pindi Das Interchange at KM 30+000 on Lahore - Islamabad Motorway:**

Remarks: The project has been completed and opened to traffic w.e.f. 15.03.2025.

(ii) No road protection wall was constructed in the vicinity of Lahore or its surrounding projects.

62. ***Dr. Shazia Sobia Aslam Soomro:**

Will the Minister for Energy (Petroleum Division) be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government has taken notice of the recurring Liquefied Petroleum Gas (LPG) related accidents across Pakistan, including recent fatal incidents in Islamabad, Multan, Lahore and Mardan;*
- (b) the role of the Oil and Gas Regulatory Authority (OGRA) in regulating LPG safety standards;*
- (c) the actions taken against violators during the last three years; and*
- (d) whether the Government intends to introduce stricter regulations or amendments to existing laws to prevent LPG related accidents and protect public safety?*

Minister for Energy (Petroleum Division) (Mr. Ali Pervaiz): (a) Yes, the Government has taken serious notice of recurring LPG-related accidents in various parts of the country, including the incidents reported in Islamabad, Multan, Lahore, Mardan, and other cities. Oil and Gas Regulatory Authority (OGRA), in coordination with provincial governments and district administrations, have reviewed these incidents and are actively engaged in strengthening regulatory oversight, enforcement actions, and public safety awareness measures. Preliminary investigations have indicated that most accidents are attributable to illegal decanting practices, use of substandard or uncertified cylinders, unauthorized filling facilities, and non-compliance with prescribed safety standards.

(b) OGRA grants license to the LPG sector under the OGRA Ordinance, 2002, LPG (Production and Distribution) Rules, 2001, and the LPG Policy, 2016.

- i. Issuance of licenses to LPG marketing companies, storage/filling plants, and registration of LPG equipment /cylinder manufacturers / bowsers.

- ii. Ensuring compliance with license conditions
- iii. Conducting inspections of licensed facilities.
- iv. Taking enforcement actions against illegal/ non-compliant licensees.

Coordinating with provincial and district authorities to curb illegal LPG operations.

(c) During the last three years, enforcement actions have been taken against violators in proportion to the severity of the violations. Substantial penalties were imposed, and in cases involving loss of life or injuries, compensation was recovered from the responsible violators in accordance with the applicable legal framework. Details are provided in **Annex-I**.

(d) In order to curb illegal LPG activities by the culprits, OGRA has proposed amendments in the section 285 & 286 of Pakistan Penal Code to create deterrence.

63. *Dr. Shazia Sobia Aslam Soomro:


Will the Minister for Energy (Power Division) be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the Government maintains data regarding the total circular debt outstanding against each Distribution Company (DISCO) as on the latest available date;*
- (b) the DISCO(s)-wise position of circular debt alongwith a comparison with the corresponding figures of the previous Financial Year; and*
- (c) the measures taken or proposed to reduce circular debt recorded increase in Distribution Companies?*

Minister for Energy (Power Division) (Sardar Awais Ahmad Khan Leghari): (a) & (b) DISCO wise position of circular debt along with comparison with previous year is attached as **Annex-I**.

(c) To resolve circular debt issue, Government of Pakistan has signed a financing facility amounting to Rs. 1,225 billion with a consortium of eighteen (18) banks of Pakistan for settlement of circular debt liabilities of the power sector. A Task Force constituted by the Government conducted a comprehensive review of the circular debt issue in the power sector and held multiple consultative sessions with relevant stakeholders, including financial institutions through the Pakistan Banks Association (PBA). After detailed deliberations, the Task Force, in consultation with the Ministry of Finance and leading banking institutions, recommended a plan to restructure the existing financing arrangements by swapping the short term high-cost debt with a longer-term tenor facility of six (6) years at a concessional rate of KIBOR minus 0.9%, in comparison to the existing average cost of KIBOR plus 2% being paid on the circular debt stock. The repayment of this facility will be made through the Debt Servicing Surcharge (DSS) / Financing Cost Surcharge (FCS) component already incorporated in the consumer tariff.

64. ***Syed Rafiullah:**

Will the Minister for Communications be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether the Government is aware at the boundary walls alongwith several Motorways are broken or damaged at multiple locations, there by posing serious risks to the lives and valuable property of daily commuters; if so, the details thereof;*
- (b) *whether any assessment has been conducted in recent times in this regard; if so, the Motorway-wise details thereof;*
- (c) *whether the absence of effective oversight, inadequate patrolling and lack of regular monitoring has aggravated security and safety concerns on these Motorways; and*
- (d) *whether the Government intends to take corrective steps, including the repair of damaged boundary walls, installation of protective bars or fencing, strengthening of patrolling mechanisms and implementation of a system of regular monitoring to ensure the safety and security of Motorway users?*

Minister for Communications (Mr. Abdul Aleem Khan): (a) Yes, Government of Pakistan is fully aware of the issue of broken fence along motorways of Pakistan which may cause serious threat to road commuters due to unwanted entries of stray animal and pedestrians. In this regard a comprehensive plan was made with the directions of the Honorable Prime Minister of Pakistan to assess the extent of damages of fence along motorways network of Pakistan and its re-installation. Accordingly, all fence gaps were plugged on war footing for the safety of the road commuters. Furthermore, for prevention of the fence from future theft and damages, detailed Standard Operating Procedures were developed by NHA and NHMP for safety and security of this vital asset and to ensure plugging of gaps in case of theft/damage (Copies enclosed at **Annex-A**).

Since then NHA and NHMP field formations maintain record of installed fence and in case of any theft or damage, immediate cognizance of offence is taken in which FIRs are lodged against the offenders. The same is also followed up by NHMP for recoveries of the theft asset from the culprits (copies of some FIRs are enclosed at Annex-B) and immediate plugging of fence gaps by NHA is also ensured.

It is pertinent to mention here that damage and theft of fence is recurring process. However, in this regard, amendment in relevant laws is also under process with recommendations of Law & Justice Division for increase in penalties against offenders. Joint Survey of amaged/theft fence for the month of January 2026 has been prepared (enclosed at **Annex-C.**)

(b) Yes, Joint Assessment of damaged/theft fence along motorways is carried out by NHA & NHMP on monthly basis and its report is shared with Ministry of Communications The latest assessment of damaged/theft fence along motorways for the month of January 2026 has been made jointly by NHA and NHMP (enclosed at **Annex-C.**)

(c) A comprehensive oversight mechanism is in place to ensure security on Motorways. Patrolling operations are monitored in real time through technology-based systems, supplemented by mandatory daily supervisory patrolling at all levels. Random checks by supervisory officers further ensure compliance with prescribed standards. Patrols are deployed as per approved strength to maintain adequate coverage. Consequently, crime has decreased by 40%, from 81 cases in 2024 to 48 cases in 2025, due to focused identification of crime-prone areas, enhanced patrolling, deployment of anti-crime squads and strengthened liaison with other LEAs.

(d) Yes, the Government has taken corrective measures for the repair and reinstallation of missing/damaged fence along the motorways for which Standard Operating Procedures have been developed, both by NHA & NHMP. As theft/damage to the fence is a recurring process therefore, for the safety of road users, the repair/re-installation of fence is carried out on daily basis. NHMP has developed a regular monitoring mechanism, elaborated in part-c of the question.

65. ***Dr. Sharmila Faruqi:**

Will the Minister for Energy (Power Division) be pleased to state:

(a) whether it is a fact that National Electric Power Regulatory Authority (NEPRA)'s Financial Year 2026 tariff decision shows anomalies in residential consumer classification,

including a rise is found in protected consumers from 17 million to 21.5 million and 12.53 million households in the 101-200 kwh slab, despite consumption suggesting only about 26 kwh per household per month;

- (b) if so, the reasons for these anomalies, including administrative re-classification, policy adjustments, or methodological issues and the impact on subsidy fairness;*
- (c) whether the official estimate of off-grid and net-metered solar capacity 12,629 MW and 6.539 MW respectively is accurate, given import data indicating around 50,000 MW;*
- (d) whether the meters residential or commercial solars are included behind estimates and data in above;*
- (e) what measures being taken by the Government to ensure tariff calculations, demand side planning and grid management reflecting actual consumption; and*
- (f) whether NEPRA will publicly share its methodology and data to improve transparency and scrutiny?*

Minister for Energy (Power Division) (Sardar Awais Ahmad Khan Leghari): (a) It is a fact that the number of protected consumers increased from about 9.5 million in October 2021, when the protected category was introduced, to approximately 21.55 million by June 2025.

However, the inference that 12.53 million households in the 101-200 kWh slab use an average consumption of only 26 kWh per month is incorrect, as consumers move in and out of the protected category throughout the year depending on their monthly usage. For instance, the Jun-25 data shows 162 kWh per consumer per month.

(b) The rise in protected consumers is mainly attributable to behind-the-meter solar systems and multiple household connections, which have enabled some non-eligible consumers to qualify as protected, thereby increasing the subsidy burden on the system as well as leading to grid instability and rise in other consumer tariff.

(c) As of December 2025, the installed net-metering capacity has reached 7,000 MW, while off-grid solar capacity is estimated at approximately 12.629 MW based on a GIS-based assessment.

(d) Yes, both residential and commercial solar meters are included in the above estimates and data.

(e) The tariffs for generation, transmission and distribution sectors are issued by Regulator after proper due diligence. The IGCEP and TSEP provide a data-driven framework for sectoral planning by synchronizing future energy needs with grid capabilities. The IGCEP uses 10-year forecasting to ensure only “least-cost” generation is added, preventing the high tariffs caused by overcapacity, while the TSEP strategically maps out transmission upgrades to ensure that projected demand is met without infrastructure bottlenecks. To improve grid stability, current efforts focus on integrated generation and transmission planning alongside net-metering reforms to better manage distributed energy. Tariff incentive schemes are being implemented to balance load, while the transition of captive power units to the national grid and increased transmission interconnection capacity ensure a more resilient and flexible power infrastructure.

(f) NEPRA’s data and methodology is publicly available on its website through its State of Industry Report that includes detailed sector statistics.

Will the Minister for Foreign Affairs be pleased to state the details of agreements signed during the recent visit of the President of the United Arab Emirates to Pakistan?

Minister for Foreign Affairs (Senator Mohammad Ishaq Dar):
No agreement was signed during the visit of President of UAE to Pakistan.

67. ***Mr. Muhammad Bashir Khan:**

Will the Minister for Energy (Power Division) be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that PESCO, LESCO, FESCO, IESCO etc, and other similar electricity distribution companies are incurring losses;*
- (b) whether such losses amounts to Billions of Rupees;*
- (c) the total number of Hydro Electric Projects in Pakistan and the province-wise locations thereof;*
- (d) the electricity generation capacity of each Hydro Electric Project;*
- (e) the total electricity generated in the country and the total consumption thereof;*
- (f) the locations where thermal electricity is produced and the total number of solar power plants in the country;*
- (g) the financial losses incurred to the country due to Independent Power Produces (IPPs); and*
- (h) the date by which the first agreement with (IPPs) was signed alongwith details of terms and conditions of the agreement?*

Minister for Energy (Power Division) (Sardar Awais Ahmad Khan Leghari): (a) & (b) It is informed that Electricity Distribution Companies (DISCOs) are striving continuously to reduce the losses in the context of the targets assigned by NEPRA. The detail of the same as comparison between FY 2023-2024 and FY 2024-25 is as below:

(d) Electricity Generation Capacity is Attached as **Annex-I**.

(e) Electricity generated in 2nd quarter of FY 2025-26 is attached as **Annex-II** and Electricity consumption is attached as **Annex-III** for the same period.

(f) List of Thermal Power Plants along with site location is attached as **Annex-IV** and list of Solar Power plants is attached as **Annex-V**.

(g) It is clarified that the legitimate costs payable to IPPs under Power Purchase Agreements (PPAs), as approved and allowed by the regulator, are pass-through costs in the tariff and are recovered from consumers in accordance with the regulatory framework. Accordingly, payments to IPPs as such do not constitute a fiscal burden or financial loss to the state being part of the regulated electricity pricing mechanism.

(h) The first Power Purchase Agreement was signed with HUBCO on 03-08-1992. The agreement was on Take or Pay basis.

68. ***Ms. Asiya Naz Tanoli:**

Will the Minister for Communications be pleased to state:

- (a) whether the authorities concerned have taken the notice of the fact that the helpline 130 of Motorways and National Highways often remain non-functional;*
- (b) whether in most of the cases calls made by travelers are not attended to;*
- (c) whether any inquiry, inspection or audit has been conducted to ascertain the reasons for such repeated failures of the said helpline; if so, the findings thereof; and*
- (d) what corrective measures taken or proposed to be taken to ensure the continuous, efficient and reliable functioning of the said helpline for the safety/convenience of the road users?*

Minister for Communications (Mr. Abdul Aleem Khan): (a) updated NHMP ensures the provision of information 24/7 callers, along with assistance to distressed commuters, through its Toll-Free Helpline-130 without unnecessary delays. However, during special circumstances such as long weekends, public holidays, adverse weather conditions especially foggy and snowfall seasons, political rallies or law and order situations, a significant surge in call volume is experienced, resulting in increased load on the system. Such situations may occasionally lead to temporary call disruptions; nevertheless, NHMP ensures prompt rectification measures to restore and sustain uninterrupted service delivery.

(b) It may be noted that NHMP Helpline-130 handles a substantial volume of calls on a daily basis and the majority of callers are effectively facilitated. Distressed callers are promptly connected with the concerned field formations to ensure immediate and appropriate assistance. However, on certain occasions, calls may remain unattended due to technical reasons such as network coverage limitations at the caller's end.

(c) Progress of NHMP Helpline-130 is closely monitored in three shifts on daily basis and strict departmental action is taken in cases where

any undue delay is reported on the part of NHMP officers. During 2025, unsatisfactory feedback was received in 87 cases, therefore, departmental proceedings / disciplinary action was taken accordingly. Moreover, proactive and corrective measures are being implemented to further improve and enhance the services of Helpline-130, reduce response time, and ensure safety and security of distressed callers.

(d) Corrective measures have been implemented, including the replacement of weak UPS batteries, rectification of phase failures, enhanced coordination to address power tripping issues, and ensuring the availability of backup generators. Furthermore, the Helpline-130 facility is being upgraded with the latest tools, software, and equipment to effectively address existing shortcomings and to meet future operational requirements.

69. ***Mr. Muhammad Moin Aamer Pirzada:**

Will the Minister for Communications be pleased to state:

- (a) *the length of Highways and Motorways passing through each district in the country;*
- (b) *the number of ongoing National Highway Authority (NHA) Projects in each district alongwith cost and details of percentage of their completion so far; and*
- (c) *the measures taken to ensure quality control and timely completion of these projects?*

Minister for Communications (Mr. Abdul Aleem Khan): (a) The National Highway Authority is administering 48 National Highways, Motorways and Strategic Roads with a total length of 14,480 km, traversing through 118 districts out of 160 across the country. The province-wise length of the NHA network along with number of districts covered is provided below, while the detailed district-wise length is attached at **Annex-A.**

(b) Presently, there are 71 projects on NHA PSDP portfolio funded through GOP / Foreign Loans / PPP valuing Rs. 3.4 trillion. An expenditure of Rs. 681.37 billion has been incurred so far. The details of 39 ongoing projects is as **Annex-B**.

(c) NHA ensures quality control by appointing independent supervisory consultants to enforce strict compliance with standards and specifications, supplemented by monitoring and inspection through dedicated M&I teams of NHA at different construction stages. Prior to issuance of Defect Liability Certificate, the M&I team thoroughly check the quality of works and upon satisfactory performance, the contractor is relieved from the performance.

Furthermore, to ensure the quality, “The Engineer” of the project has a vital role under FIDIC provisions, ensuring quality and timely completion through impartial contract administration and dispute resolution.

The alignment of funds flow with project timelines is critical, as financial delays often hinder completion within the stipulated timeframe.

70. ***Jam Abdul Karim Bijar:**

Will the Minister for Science and Technology be pleased to state:

(a) *whether it is a fact that the Federal Cabinet has approved the right sizing policy in January, 2025;*

- (b) if so, the reasons for not completing the right sizing process despite the lapse of one year;*
- (c) specify the legal, constitutional or administrative implements hindering its completion; and*
- (d) the concrete legal and administrative measures being taken by the Government to ensure for protecting the service structure, salaries, pension and other service benefits of the concerned council and its employees, after the proposed right-sizing process?*

Minister for Science and Technology (Mr. Khalid Hussain Magsi): (a) Yes.

(b) The process of implementation of said Cabinet Decision was started immediately. Delay is caused due to lengthy involvement of legal and administrative matters. i.e. repeal of Acts, Ordinance and matters and Resolution, employees related settlement of organizational liabilities etc.

(c) Summaries for winding-up of Pakistan Council for Renewable Energy Technologies (PCRET) and Council for Works & Housing Research (CWHR) have been submitted to the Prime Minister's office through Establishment Division on 30-01-2026.

Civil servants of the said organizations shall be placed at the disposal of surplus pool of Establishment Division. However, policy for the non-civil servants is awaited from Establishment Division which is also a hindrance for completion of the process.

(d) Upon merger of National Institute of Electronics (NIE) into Pakistan Council of Scientific and Industrial Research (PCSIR), its employees will be transferred to the PCSIR.

Upon winding-up of Pakistan Council for Renewable Energy Technologies (PCRET) and Council for Works & Housing Research (CWHR), their employees will be placed at the disposal of surplus pool of Establishment Division being civil servants.

Pakistan Council for Science & Technology (PCST) has two track employment i.e. civil servants & non-civil servants. The civil servants will

be placed at the disposal of surplus pool while policy of the Federal Government for non-civil servants is awaited.

71. ***Mr. Muhammad Nawaz Khan:**

Will the Minister for Energy (Power Division) be pleased to state:

(a) *whether approval was granted for the transmission line from Allai Khurd Power House to Thakot Grid Station, on which substantial work has already been carried out but not completed so far;*

(b) *if so, the time by which work is expected to be completed?*

Minister for Energy (Power Division) (Sardar Awais Ahmad Khan Leghari): (a) Yes, it is a fact that an approval had been granted by PESCO under STG (Secondary Transmission & Grids) head for construction of 132-KV transmission line from Allai khurd Power House to Thakot Grid Station.

Yes, substantial work i.e. 58% of the total quantum has been completed. However, the work has been transferred to HAZECO after execution of Business Transfer Agreement between PESCO and HAZECO, on 01.07.2025.

Currently, the work progress has become slow due the issues of Right of Way (RoW). To resolve the RoW issues, several Jirga's with the elders of the community have been convened, with no outcome so far.

12 No. poles in the project could not be installed due to RoW issues in Thakot Bazar.

(b) The project has been halted only due to RoW issues as mentioned above, it will be completed as soon as possible, subject to clearance of RoW.

72. Disallowed on re-consideration.

73. ***Syeda Shehla Raza:**

Will the Minister for Human Rights be pleased to state whether the Ministry has conducted any awareness campaigns during 2024 to 2025 to educate citizens on their fundamental rights?

Minister for Human Rights (Senator Azam Nazeer Tarar):

According to the Rules of Business, 1973, the Ministry of Human Rights, is mandated to inter-alia develop and conduct information programmes to foster public awareness about human rights. Accordingly, awareness raising activities are a regular feature of the Ministry. The Ministry is implementing a full-fledged PSDP Project, titled “Human Rights Awareness Programme” for such initiatives.

The Ministry has conducted Awareness Campaigns and activities during 2024 and 2025 to educate citizens about their fundamental rights. Besides awareness of the general masses about human rights, the MoHR has focused rights of women under the Prime Minister’s Women Empowerment Package, 2024. The Ministry is also implementing Action Plan on Human Rights, approved by the Prime Minister of Pakistan and undertaking activities concerning Human Rights Education, Awareness and Sensitization. Moreover, Huqooq-e-Pakistan Project (Phase-II), is also being implemented for similar initiatives. The detail of awareness activities conducted during the last two years, is as under:

1. 52 nationwide awareness sessions, engaging religious scholars, community leaders, public officials, academia, LEAs, journalists, media, NGOs/CBOs, and lawyers to foster a deeper understanding of human rights, have been conducted under the Awareness Programme, during the last two years. These activities were carried out in collaboration with federal and provincial stakeholders including Regional Offices of Human Rights.
2. Keeping in view the merger of FATA with Khyber Pakhtunkhwa, the MoHR has also implemented a PSDP project, titled “Establishment of Sub-Office of Human Rights at Merged Districts of Khyber Pakhtunkhwa” with a budget of Rs. 65 million to mainstream the human rights component in the newly merged areas. During the last two years, 11 activities including awareness-raising seminars, meetings with concerned authorities and community elders, training sessions of LEAs were conducted, during the last three years.

3. The MoHR, in collaboration with the Higher Education Commission (HEC), organized 151 seminars in universities and higher education institutions across Pakistan during 2024. The objective was to raise awareness and prepare youth against the threats of cybercrimes and the misuse of social media, helping them avoid involvement in heinous crimes.
4. During the last two years, the MoHR celebrated international days at national level in a befitting manner, including International Human Rights Day (10th December), International Women's Day (8th March), World Children's Day (20th November), International Day for the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (3rd December), 16 Days of Activism Against Gender-Based Violence (25th November-10th December), International Day of Older People (1st October), National Minorities Day (11th August), National Working Women's Day (22nd December). This year, International Day for Tolerance was also observed on 16th November, for the first time by MoHR.

The above mentioned events were instrumental for promotion of human rights, with a renewed commitment towards the protection of rights of citizens particularly women, children, minorities, PWDs, and other vulnerable segments of society.

The MoHR on the recommendations of National Assembly's Standing Committee on Human Rights has also recently launched activities for youth empowerment on the following themes:

- i. Seminars in educational institutions to create awareness among the students about the dangerous consequences of drugs.
- ii. Awareness activities to differentiate between right & erroneous usage of social media so that our young generation could play a constructive role to bring prosperity in Pakistan.

As part of the above initiative, the MoHR conducted Seminars at Punjab University Lahore on 3rd November, 2025 and at GIFT University, Gujranwala on 21st November, 2025 to create awareness among students about the dangerous consequences of drug addiction. The events

emphasized the vital role of academia and social work in empowering youth, preventing substance abuse, and promoting community well-being. Such sessions are also planned for other educational institutions across Pakistan.

74. ***Mr. Changaze Ahmad Khan:**

Will the Minister for Communications be pleased to state:

- (a) whether it is a fact that the infrastructure of the Pindi Bhattian-Faisalabad section of M-4 Motorway is in a dilapidated condition at several places; if so, the details thereof;*
- (b) the total number of road accidents reported on the said section during the last one year, alongwith the number of fatalities and injuries caused thereof;*
- (c) whether the said accidents were investigated; if so, the causes identified in each case;*
- (d) the steps taken or proposed to be taken by the Government and the National Highway Authority to improve road safety, infrastructure condition and accident prevention on the said section;*
- (e) the total funds allocated and spent on repair, maintenance and safety improvements of the said motorways section during the last one year; and*
- (f) the total toll tax collected from the Pindi Bhattian-Faisalabad section of the M-4 Motorway during the last one year and the manner in which the same has been utilized?*

Minister for Communications (Mr. Abdul Aleem Khan): (a) Construction of Pindi Bhattian to Faisalabad Motorway (old M-3) was completed in 2003 and opened for traffic. Present road condition is very dilapidated at some locations particularly on the outer lanes due to heavy traffic movement. Further, after completion of M4 (Faisalabad to Multan) and M-5 (Multan to Sukhur), more traffic volume is plying on Pindi

Bhattian to Faisalabad section which supported further damage to road surface being (04) lane motorway.

(b) As per NH&MP report, only two accidents occurred during last year, as per detail given below:

(c) Reasons/investigation report provided by the NH&MP of each accident happened during last year is given below:-

(d) It is to apprise that widening of Faisalabad-Pindi Bhattian Section of M-4 upto (06) lane has been proposed to be executed through BOT basis

which is under process at Planning Section, NHA HQ. Moreover, to improve the condition, Periodic Maintenance Schemes from Sangla Hill to Pindi Bhattian (NBC) amounting to Rs.317.37 Million and Pindi Bhattian to Sahianwala (SBC) amounting to Rs.565.46 Million has been allocated under AMP 2025-26 which is in process for approval of the National Highway Council With these measures, infrastructure conditions and safety will be improved.

(e) Total amount of Rs. 53,955,551/- has been spent for maintenance of Faisalabad-Pindi Bhattian Section (M-4) during last one year. Out of which, Rs. 15,567,939/- has been used for filling of pot holes, cut vegetation repair of signage and rectification of fence etc through four routine maintenance contracts and an amount of Rs. 38,387,612/- has been consumed on account of special maintenance contract (patch work) at Km.

267-269 (outer lane) SBC near Sangla Hill interchange and Faisalabad - Lahore, Faisalabad Islamabad, and Islamabad Faisalabad loop area Pindi Bhattian Interchange at Km 292-293.

(f) During the last one year (from 01-01-2025 to 31-12-2025), total amount of Rs.1,778.29 Million has been collected from toll tax revenue of Pindi Bhattian - Faisalabad Section (M-4). However, as per O&M share, Rs. 1,200.34 Million (67.50%) deposited into NHA accounts for further utilization as per requirements.

75. ***Syed Hussain Tariq:**

Will the Minister for Energy (Petroleum Division) be pleased to state:

(a) *the details of daily production of natural Gas, located at the Qadirpur Oil and Gas Field, Sindh;*

(b) *the key terms and details of the contract governing the supply of natural Gas from the said field to Sui Northern gas Pipelines Limited (SNGPL), including contract duration and pricing framework; and*

(c) *the details of variation in supply of gas to SNGPL maximum to lowest gas supplied per day?*

Minister for Energy (Petroleum Division) (Mr. Ali Pervaiz): (a) The daily and monthly production details of natural gas from Qadirpur Field for the month of December 2025 are;

Daily Gas Production (MMCFD): 87.78

Monthly Gas Production (MMCFT): 16259.67

(b) The key terms and details of the contract governing the supply of natural gas from the Qadirpur Field are attached as Annex-A. The pricing framework for Qadirpur Gas Field is governed by the Natural Gas (Well-Head Price) Regulations, 2009, under which the Oil & Gas Regulatory Authority (OGRA) has the legal power to determine and notify a field-specific well-head gas price. As per OGRA's pricing notification dated 7th February, 2025, the wellhead price of natural gas of agreed

specification, produced from Qadirpur Gas Field effective from January, 2025 is Rs. 839.87 per MMBTU.

(c) The details of current daily production of natural gas from Qadirpur Oil and Gas Field is as under:-

SNGPL NETWORK (Processed Gas):

- Average supply = 38 MMCFD
- Maximum supply = 71 MMCFD
- Minimum supply = 14 MMCFD

LIBERTY DAHARKI POWER (Raw Gas):

- Average supply = 32 MMCFD

ENGRO ENERGY (Permeate Gas):

76. ***Mr. James Iqbal:**

Will the Minister for Energy (Power Division) be pleased to state:

- (a) *the steps being taken by the Government in near future for the provision of inexpensive electricity to the public; and*
- (b) *whether Government is making any plan in this regard?*

Minister for Energy (Power Division) (Sardar Awais Ahmad Khan Leghari): (a) & (b) Regarding affordable Energy cost, it is submitted that the National Average tariff (including tax) declined from Rs. 53.04 (Mar-2024) to Rs. 41.32 (Jan-2026) showing 22% decline in tariff, through various interventions including;

- Termination of inefficient plants
- Renegotiation of power purchase agreements

- Strengthened economic parameters & increased fiscal allocations
- Going forward, the Government remains committed to further reducing electricity tariffs through multiple policy interventions, including
- Elimination of cross-subsidies
- Debt re-profiling
- Gradual elimination of Circular Debt stock and corresponding Debt Service Surcharge
- Renegotiation of remaining contracts with IPPs

77. ***Mr. Anjum Aqeel Khan:**

Will the Minister for Energy (Petroleum Division) be pleased to state the measures being taken by the Government to boost up production of Gas in the country and reduce reliance on imported Liquefied Natural Gas (LNG) which is costly, particularly in winter season is not enough to meet the requirement adding to problems of the public?

Minister for Energy (Petroleum Division) (Mr. Ali Pervaiz): (a) The Petroleum Division has taken the following initiatives to facilitate and promote Exploration and Production (E&P) activities:

i. **Discoveries during the tenure of current Government:**

During the tenure of the current Government, a total of 40 oil and gas discoveries has been made, reflecting sustained exploration efforts in the upstream sector. Out of these discoveries, 18 have already been successfully brought on stream. As of December 2025, the cumulative average production from these producing discoveries stands at approximately 61 Million Cubic Feet Per Day (MMCFD) of natural gas and 1,553 Barrels of Oil Per Day (BOPD). These production levels demonstrate tangible progress in converting discoveries into commercially productive assets, while the

remaining discoveries are at various stages of appraisal, development planning, and commercialization, subject to technical, commercial, and regulatory considerations. Discovery details attached at Annex-1. are

ii. **Offshore Block Award:**

After a gap of around two decades, a successful offshore bid round was undertaken with the provisional award of 23 blocks. Moreover, new local and foreign oil and gas companies have participated and secured exploration blocks.

iii. **Onshore Bidding Rounds:**

Government is undertaking bi-annual bid round in the onshore for few years. During last three years 05 bid rounds were undertaken and 46 blocks were awarded for exploration and production activities.

iv. **Basin Study:**

A comprehensive high resolution Basin Study for hydrocarbon potential is underway which will open new avenues for future E&P activities in the country.

V. **Tight Gas Policy 2024:**

Tight Gas policy has been approved by the CCI in February 2024 with additional pricing incentives over petroleum policy 2012.

vi. **Amendments in Petroleum Policy 2012:**

- (a) Another chance to E&P companies to opt policy 2012 through conversion
- (b) Zone - IF incentives for existing license holders.
- (c) Expiry at the end of commerciality.

vii. **Third Party Sale Regime:**

E&P Liberalizing the gas market, companies have now been allowed to sale 35% of gas from new oil and gas discoveries to any third party through competitive bidding.

(b) Beside the above efforts on exploration side, keeping in view the peak winter demand in country, maximum i.e. 12 LNG cargoes have been planned in coordination with Qatar Energy and ENI during peak demand season, under long term agreements. With addition of RLNG into system, sufficient system gas/RLNG volumes are available to cater the demand of all sectors and supply is ensure accordingly.

78. ***Ms. Shaista Pervaiz:**

Will the Minister for Science and Technology be pleased to state:

(a) *the steps taken by the Ministry taken to ensure that major food industry players are registered, audited and linked to national standards; and*

(b) *the status of implementation of those reforms?*

Minister for Science and Technology (Mr. Khalid Hussain Magsi): (a) Pakistan Standards and Quality Control Authority (PSQCA) working under the administrative control of Ministry of Science and Technology is the sole National Standards Body, established through PSQCA Act-VI of 1996. PSQCA is mandated to formulate the standards of food and non-food products as Pakistan Standards.

The Federal Government has notified 174 products, including 44 food products, under mandatory standards list of PSQCA to check / monitor the quality. List of the products is as **Annex-A**.

After the 18th amendment provinces had established their own Food Authorities to regulate the quality of food products. According to Council of Common Interest (CCI), in its 44th meeting decided that Formulation of Standards, Certification Mark logo and labeling shall be the mandate of Federal Government (i.e. PSQCA) and the registration of food business, monitoring and enforcement of the quality of products fall

under the jurisdiction of provinces (i.e. Provincial Food Authorities). Decision of CCI is enclosed as **Annex-B**.

PSQCA has taken the measures to ensure the availability of harmonized food standards across the country, same were also provided to all Provincial Food Authorities and made available on PSQCA website.

Further PSQCA has issued 1546 no. of Certification Mark Licenses after complete audit of the quality control infrastructure of industry / factory across the country (**Annex-C**).

(b) Reforms After the CCI Decision:

1. According to CCI decision, PSQCA had harmonized all food standards with Provincial Food Authorities for ease of doing business and removal of technical barriers to inter-provincial trade.
2. PSQCA is issuing the Certification Mark logo to major food industries under the mandatory standards schemes for those products which are notified by the Federal Government. Presently 1546 no. of licenses are issued.
3. Regarding the registration of food business, enforcement and monitoring of food products and licensing of factory establishment for food products is the sole responsibility of Provincial Governments.

79. *Mr. Muhammad Tufail:

Will the Minister for Energy (Power Division) be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether it is a fact that in the year 2017, the then Prime Minister, allocated an amount of Rs.100 Million to Multan*

Electric Power Company Limited (MEPCO), for new electrification in NA-143;

- (b) the reasons for non-completion of the said project despite the fact that the funds had already been transferred to the relevant head of WAPDA, including the causes of delay;*
- (c) the names of the officers/officials responsible and whether any action has been taken against them; if not, the reasons thereof; and*
- (d) if the answers to part (a) and (b) are in the affirmative, time by which the new electrification project will be completed from the said funds?*

Minister for Energy (Power Division) (Sardar Awais Ahmad Khan Leghari): (a) A PC-1 titled “Supply of Electricity to various villages of Chichawatni” was submitted by MEPCO for approval. A surrender order amounting to Rs. 100 million was received in the Power Division on 04.01.2018 from Planning Commission.

(b) The project could not be approved during the meeting of DDWP held on 25.04.2018 due to the ban imposed by the Election Commission of Pakistan (ECP) vide notification dated 11.04.2018. Accordingly, no TSG case was submitted to ECC.

(c) No, as The allocation of funds for electrification schemes under SDGs are dealt by the Cabinet Division and approved by the Steering Committee on SDGs Achievement Program.

(d) No such scheme is pending.

80. ***Mr. Awais Haider Jakhar:**

Will the Minister for Communications be pleased to state the time by which the roads of Layyah-Taunsa bridge will be constructed?

Minister for Communications (Mr. Abdul Aleem Khan): The National Highway Authority (NHA) has completed the bridge section of the Layyah-Taunsa Bridge Project; however, the omission of the said project for the balance crucial components i.e., Approach Roads and River

Training Works (Package-II) were proposed by NHA for inclusion in NHA PSDP 2025-26. However allocation was not made by the Ministry of PD&SI and the scheme was dropped.

This project's progress has been consistently monitored during National Assembly Standing Committee on Inter Provincial Coordination (IPC meetings), where the NHA and other stakeholders have emphasized the critical need to include the remaining project elements in the PSDP for the fiscal year 2025-26.

Despite the NHA's formal submission for PSDP inclusion, the final PSDP released in June 2025 did not reflect this project.

Consequently, on October 8, 2025, Ministry of Communications requested the Ministry of Planning to ensure the "Construction of Approach Roads and Guide Banks of Layyah-Taunsa Bridge" to include in the PSDP 2025-26 on priority (**Annex-A**). Till date, a response to this effect is pending.

The NHA's ability to commence the construction of essential approach roads and river training works is contingent upon the project's inclusion in the PSDP and the subsequent allocation of adequate funding.

The following outlines the salient project details:

- **Package-I:** Main Bridge Construction (Completed).
- **Package-II:** Construction of 2-Lane Approach Roads connecting Layyah with Taunsa and Training Works.
- **Contractor:** M/S KNK JV
- **Project Cost:** Rs. 3834 Million
- **Date of Commencement:** 20-January-2022
- **Date of Completion:** 19-January-2024
- **Progress:** 10.07% (against the planned 100%)

The primary reason for the delay in Package-II stems from the poor performance and subsequent abandonment of the project by the contractor, M/S KNK JV, after achieving only 10% completion.

Consequently, the NHA initiated action against the contractor, culminating in the formal cancellation of the contract on 4-December-2023.

It is crucial to recognize that the omission of the project from PSDP 2025-26 effectively postpones the tendering and procurement processes until Financial Year 2026-27, contingent upon the allocation of funds in the subsequent PSDP 2026-27. Therefore, expedited action is imperative to ensure the timely completion of the Layyah-Taunsa Bridge Project and realize its intended socio-economic benefits.

81. ***Syed Hussain Tariq:**

Will the Minister for Energy (Power Division) be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether the National Energy Efficiency and Conservation Action Plan 2023-2030 endorsed under the 2023 National Energy Efficiency and Conservation Policy 2023 recognizes the lack of any fuel economy standard for automobiles in Pakistan;*
- (b) *the proposes development and enforcement of a National Fuel Economy Standard (NFES) and vehicle/fleet retirement age policy by 2026;*
- (c) *what is the current status of NFES, whether a draft standard has been prepared;*
- (d) *if so, the details thereof; if not, the expected date for its finalization and formal adoption alongwith proposed scope related to vehicles and fuel types covered;*
- (e) *details of Regulatory Framework or legal instrument under which NFES will be enforced once adopted, which agency/agencies will be responsible for certification, testing, enforcement and compliance checking;*
- (f) *will compliance be made mandatory for all new and imported vehicles;*

- (g) *the implementation timeline and phased targets for NFES rollout from which model year onwards requirements apply;*
- (h) *will there be labeling/disclosure on fuel consumption/CO emissions for all new vehicles; and*
- (i) *what are the projected energy, emissions and foreign exchange savings from full NFES implementation?*

Minister for Energy (Power Division) (Sardar Awais Ahmad Khan Leghari): (a) Yes, the National Energy Efficiency and Conservation Action Plan 2023-2030, endorsed under the National Energy Efficiency and Conservation Policy 2023, recognizes the absence of a fuel economy standard for automobiles in Pakistan.

(b) Yes, the Action Plan envisages development and phased implementation of a National Fuel Economy Standard (NFES), subject to availability of institutional capacity and regulatory approvals.

(c) NFES is presently at a preliminary stage. Initial stakeholder outreach was undertaken in 2024 by NEECA through formal correspondence with automotive Original Equipment Manufacturers (OEMs); however, no responses were received.

(d) At present, a definitive timeline for finalization and formal adoption of the National Fuel Economy Standards is not available. However, NEECA has carried out preparatory work and stakeholder engagement to advance the initiative.

In this regard, NEECA convened a multi-stakeholder round-table consultation on 11 January 2024 with relevant competent authorities, including NTRC, EDB, Ministry of Climate Change & Environmental Coordination, OGRA, Ministry of Petroleum, and Provincial Transport Departments. The consultation reaffirmed fuel economy standards as a national priority and emphasized a phased, data-driven approach, taking into account vehicle classification, the existing vehicle fleet (including two- and three-wheelers), alignment with international best practices, fuel quality, road infrastructure, and EV adoption.

Subsequently, a consultative session with Automotive OEMs was held on 10 September 2024, in collaboration with EDB and PSQCA, under the directions of SIFC. OEMs highlighted implementation considerations such as testing infrastructure, fuel quality constraints, and the need for Pakistan-specific standards, and expressed willingness to cooperate subject to clarity on scope, methodology, and enforcement readiness.

Based on these consultations, it is envisaged that the proposed scope would initially cover newly manufactured internal combustion engine vehicles, with phased inclusion of other vehicle categories, subject to availability of baseline data, testing capacity, and enforcement mechanisms. Further technical consultations are planned prior to finalization and formal adoption of the NFES.

(e) The regulatory framework, enforcement mechanism, and designation of certification, testing, and compliance authorities will be determined upon formal development and approval of NFES in accordance with applicable legal instruments.

(f) Mandatory compliance requirements for new and imported vehicles will be notified after approval of the NFES framework

(g) The implementation timeline and phased targets will be proposed at the time of NFES finalization.

(h) Provisions relating to fuel economy labeling and emissions disclosure will be considered during NFES development, in line with international best practices

(i) As per NEECA Action Plan 2023-2030, full implementation of NFES is expected to enhance vehicle fuel efficiency by up to 25%, leading to annual fuel savings of approximately 0.23 MTOE (petrol and diesel), with an estimated financial benefit of USD 165 million per year and a reduction of around 0.78 million tonnes of CO₂ emissions annually.

82. ***Mr. Asif Khan:**

Will the Minister for Energy (Power Division) be pleased to state:

(a) *the reasons for continuing debt service surcharge of Rs.3.23 per unit on electricity consumers to recover power sector*

circular debt over the next five to six years, despite repeated public concern that consumers are bearing losses caused by systemic in-efficiencies in DISCOs;

- (b) the total amount expected to be recovered from consumers under this surcharge;*
- (c) why the surcharge remains in place even as circular debt reduction plans are underway;*
- (d) what measures the Power Division has taken to reform DISCOs operational in-efficiencies, reduce system losses and protect consumers from under financial burden;*
- (e) whether there is a time table for phasing out the surcharge; and*
- (f) what alternatives have been considered to minimize cost pressures on households?*

Minister for Energy (Power Division) (Sardar Awais Ahmad Khan Leghari): (a), (b), (c), (d) & (e) The DSS is currently applicable under section 31 (8) of the NEPRA Act to finance the bank installments under Circular Debt (CD) settlement plan. Once the CD is settled, the currently applicable DSS will also no longer be required.

Under the existing arrangement, the annual installment amounts to PKR 310 billion. This annual installment is to be fully financed through collections generated from the surcharge.

The efficiency target setting and strict monitoring along with the reconstitution of the Boards of DISCOs will contribute to a reduction in inefficiencies within the distribution companies, supported by other parallel reforms including technological interventions and privatization/concessions are aimed at systematically addressing and eliminating existing operational and governance inefficiencies.

(f) The savings from IPP negotiations and improved macroeconomic indicators have already been passed on to all consumers in CY 2025-26 annual rebasing, The negotiations with remaining IPPs are under process and the relief shall be passed on to the consumers once the negotiations are finalized.

In parallel, High-cost and non-essential generation projects have been removed from the development pipeline, with approximately 7,967 MW excluded from the Committed Category. The revised approach prioritizes low-cost, indigenous, and renewable/clean energy sources. As a result of project cancellations, deferrals, and rationalization of implementation schedules, projected savings are estimated to exceed USD 17 billion. Furthermore, least-cost planning principles, grounded in merit-order dispatch and national economic interest, have been introduced for the first time at scale. New prosumer regulations will also help to reduce consumer end tariffs, including domestic consumers.

83. ***Mr. Sher Afzal Khan:**

Minister for Energy (Power Division) (Sardar Awais Ahmad Khan Leghari): (a) It is apprised that the Promotion Induction Board of diploma holders LM-I (on seniority-cum-fitness basis) was convened according to promotion / induction mechanism and prevailing policy adopted by the Board of Directors PESCO (**Annexure-I**).

It is added that HR directorate PESCO has issued instructions /directives from time to time for strict adherence to completion of 05 years' service in the present post along with other codal formalities for further career progression of employees (**Annexure-II**).

The employees not considered fit for promotion were mainly due to non-completion of 5 years' service in the present post or non-completion of Annual Confidential Reports (ACRs) as evident from the tabulated copy of proceedings mentioned in part b.

(b) A meeting of the promotion board for promotion of Diploma Holder line staff Assistant Lineman (ALM), Lineman Grade-II (LM-II) & Lineman Grade-I (LM-I) to the rank of Line Superintendent Grade-II BPS-14 [Literate] was held on 24.04.2025 (**Annexure-III**).

- (b) *the number of start-ups supported and the generated export or revenue value;*
- (c) *how much Ministry supported the research projects which are classified as “commercialized” (i.e, generating revenue or licensed);*
- (d) *what target has the Ministry set for the year 2026 for commercialization and export value from such projects;*
- (e) *what mechanism ensures that private industry is actively involved from the inception of research and development projects (co-funding, contracts, monitoring); and*
- (f) *how is Ministry monitoring the follow-up to ensure industry use, not just for academic publication?*

Minister for Science and Technology (Mr. Khalid Hussain Magsi): (a) During the year 2024-2025, organizations operating under the Ministry of Science and Technology developed and transferred technologies and projects to industry under Ministry-supported programs, as detailed below:

- During 2024-2025, Pakistan Council of Scientific & Industrial Research (PCSIR) **developed and transferred 121 technologies / processes to industry (Annex-I)**. These technologies were transferred through leasing, MoUs, and consultancy arrangements and covered areas including pharmaceuticals, and nutraceuticals, food and allied products, chemicals, materials, textiles and leather, minerals, agriculture, engineering materials, and energy.
- During the year, National University of Technology (NUTECH) **developed 03 technologies**, which are currently under incubation and development, and industry involvement has been initiated. The details of these projects are attached at **Annex-II**.

(b) During the year **2024-2025**, organizations operating under the Ministry of Science and Technology generated export or revenue value through start-ups, which are detailed below:

During 2024-2025, COMSATS University Islamabad (CUI) generated the following:

- **01** faculty start-up, namely MY Health Care Solutions, has been established.
- **04** start-up submitted. applications have been
- **15** student start-ups have been incubated.
- The total estimated revenue of companies is approximately **PKR 78.9 million**, while the approximate revenue through the rent collection model is **PKR 2.2 million**.
- During 2024-2025, Pakistan Council of Scientific & Industrial Research (PCSIR) supported **578 exporters / entrepreneurs and SMEs** through facilitation, including pilot-scale facilities, leasing of technologies, consultancy services, technical and feasibility reports, testing and calibration services, and formulation development and standardization. These services helped industries meet national and international standards and facilitated exports using PCSIR analytical and testing reports. Complete details are provided at **Annex-III**.

(c) & (d) During the year 2024-2025, research projects classified as commercialized or licensed by organizations working under the Ministry of Science and Technology are as follows:

- During 2024-2025, Pakistan Council of Scientific & Industrial Research (PCSIR) commercialized **10 research projects** in areas such as chemicals, materials, food technologies, and emerging technologies including AI-based applications (**Annex-IV**).
- In addition, PCSIR has set a target to commercialize at least **11 research projects** during the year 2025-2026 (**Annex-V**).
- During 2024-2025, COMSATS University Islamabad commercialized **04 research Projects**. The list of the projects is attached at **Annex-VI**.

(e) Organizations operating under the Ministry of Science and Technology ensure active involvement of private industry in R&D projects through mechanisms such as industry problem identification, co-funding, formal technology transfer instruments, and monitoring processes, as detailed below:

Pakistan Council of Scientific & Industrial Research (PCSIR):

- PCSIR engages private sector entrepreneurs and SMEs through industry-driven technical enquiries.
- These enquiries are taken up by relevant scientific divisions for R&D at laboratory, pilot, or semi-commercial scale.
- Upon completion, technologies are demonstrated to clients and transferred through MoUs, Technology Transfer Agreements, or consultancy-based handover protocols.
- In 2024-25, PCSIR executed several contracts and MoUs with industries, and the results were utilized by the private sector.

Pakistan Science Foundation (PSF)

- PSF ensures industry involvement through programs such as CRP Triple Helix, Product Development Call, and PSF TUBITAK cooperation.
- Industry partners are engaged from proposal stage to project completion, with involvement formalized through cash or in-kind support.
- Under the CRP Triple Helix Program, industry partnership is mandatory.
- **61** industries contributed **Rs. 64.862 million** in cash / in-kind support across 57 projects.
- Project progress is monitored through biannual and annual reports, external expert evaluation, and review meetings.
- **10 projects** under the Product Development Call and **09 PSF-TUBITAK** projects involve active industry participation.

COMSATS University Islamabad (CUI)

- CUI's engages industrial and clinical partners at the proposal stage through consent and support letters.
- Upon approval, projects proceed through co-funding or contractual arrangements.
- Currently, no unified framework exists; it is stated that the Ministry may establish SOPs or legislation for industry-integrated R&D governance.

National University of Technology (NUTECH)

- NUTECH acquires industry problems through Chambers and business associations and converts them into research projects.
- Projects are undertaken by faculty and students, with collaboration from other universities when required.

- Research outputs are consolidated and implemented in industry, while trained human resources are fed back to industry.
- Some solutions result in startups, which either merge into mainstream industry or operate independently.

(f) The Ministry and its attached organizations follow a structured monitoring and follow-up mechanism to ensure that R&D outputs are used by industry and lead to commercialization.

Following are the details:

Pakistan Council of Scientific & Industrial Research (PCSIR):

- PCSIR follows a defined monitoring and evaluation framework to ensure effective implementation and socio-economic impact. This includes regular progress reporting through quarterly, annual, and completion reports, and monitoring of commercialization indicators such as patents filed or granted, technologies licensed, products developed, revenues generated, startups or incubations created, and industrial adoption of prototypes.
- Each funded project is overseen by a Project Steering Committee, comprising MoST representatives, industrial experts, academia, and PCSIR or relevant organization officials. Through these mechanisms, the Ministry ensures that R&D outputs result in commercialization, industrial application, and economic impact, rather than remaining academic-only outcomes.

Pakistan Science Foundation (PSF)

In academia-industry research projects funded by PSF, follow-up to ensure industry use is done through:

- Continuous monitoring of project milestones
- Close industry-academia coordination

- Evaluation at project completion
- Industry feedback through meetings /visits

Under PSF's Industry Linkage Program and CRP Triple Helix framework, these steps support commercialization. In addition, the PSF-TÜBİTAK Türkiye Academia-Industry Cooperation Call ensures continued engagement between researchers and industry partners on both sides.

National University of Technology (NUTECH)

NUTECH has a well-structured mechanism in place to ensure effective follow-up and industry, utilization of its research outputs.

- The University periodically conducts follow-up meetings and engagement sessions with relevant industry partners to share the developed ideas, prototypes, and projects.
- A close monitoring process is maintained to track progress, ensuring adherence to timelines, availability and utilization of funds, and alignment with industry requirements.
- This coordinated mechanism enables continuous feedback, improved commercialization potential, and practical industry uptake beyond academic publication.

- ii. Minimum 51% shares of CEO / Owner in case of Partnership
- iii. Category of award based on experience:
 - C4/04 - 5 years experience
 - C3/03 - 10 years
 - C2 - 20 years

(b). Non Engineer Based Firm

No formal education is required. However, he/she must be adult and have valid CNIC/NTN. The firm has to employ required number of engineers as per desired category. Detail attached at **Annex-A** (Table A & B)

Consultant/Consulting Firms:

- i. Professional Engineer (PE) with a minimum of ten (10) years of professional experience.
- ii. Professional Engineer (PE) with a Master Degree qualification with a minimum of five (05) years of professional experience.
- iii. Minimum of 51% shares of PE as Lead Partner in case of Partnership.

Will the Minister for Energy (Petroleum Division) be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether it is fact that despite depositing the amount of Demand Notices under the Account IDs, 67021665244 dated 30-10-2025, 37567512597 dated 11-11-2025, 76532710241 dated 31-10-2025, 95343455515 dated 15-11-2025, 32864315331 dated 10-11-2025 residents of Chak Nos.81/JB and 82/JB, Jaggat Pur, Pensara and Pendoori Dijkot Road Tehsil and District Faisalabad, the authorities concerned have failed to install meters of natural Gas against aforesaid demand notices;*
- (b) *if so, the reasons thereof; and*
- (c) *what steps are being taken by the Government to install the said meters against aforesaid demand notices at an earliest?*

(a) *whether it is a fact that the electricity meter of Jamia Masjid Hasnain Kareemain has been installed on an electric pole which is located far away from the said Mosque that the supply cable to the Mosque is dangerously hanging over private property without proper support;*

(b) *whether it is also a fact that an alternate option to provide electricity connection to the Mosque from the opposite direction-through the Islamabad Electric Supply Company (IESCO) owned transformer and poles is available at a much shorter distance;*

(c) *if so, the reasons for not providing the electricity connection to the said mosque directly from the nearby electricity poles?*

Minister for Energy (Power Division) (Sardar Awais Ahmad Khan Leghari): (a) No, it is not fact, the single phase electricity meter of Jamia Masjid Hasnain Kareemain has been installed on the nearest Low Tension (LT) pole within the prescribed distance.

The outgoing Polyvinyl chloride (PVC) Cable is passing through right of way provided by the management of the Mosque at a safe height.

(b) No, it is not fact. There is no alternate source or option for provision of electricity connection to the said mosque.

(c) The connection is already provided from the nearest LT line.

18. **Jam Abdul Karim Bijar:**

Will the Minister for Energy (Petroleum Division) be pleased to state:

- (a) *the number and names of the persons who deposited the demand notice for installation of urgent Gas connections at Mohallah Salmanabad near Friend Hospital Westridge-III, Rawalpindi;*
- (b) *whether it is a fact that the survey has also been conducted at the houses for installation of Gas connections;*
- (c) *if so, the time by which the Gas connections will be installed?*

Minister for Energy (Petroleum Division) (Mr. Ali Pervaiz):

Demand Notices to following 06 consumers have been deposited for installation of urgent gas connections so far. Gas connections to two consumers have been provided while remaining connections will be provided on their turn/merit basis. Details are as follow:-

(c) Gas, connection shall be provided as per turn/merit basis, subject to unforeseen circumstances.

19. **Syed Rafiullah:**

Will the Minister for Energy (Power Division) be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether it is a fact that electricity line is passing through over the houses by touching the roof walls of the different houses at Village Dhoke Bahawal Khan near Railways Phatak, Tehsil Gujar Khan, District Rawalpindi, causing inconvenience as those lines are also very dangerous for human lives living in houses of above said areas;*
- (b) *if so, the time by which the above said lines will be shifted/transferred away from the houses of the residence in the public interest?*

Minister for Energy (Power Division) (Sardar Awais Ahmad Khan Leghari): (a) As per standard practice, the electricity lines are generally installed on approved routes and right off way before any private construction to observe prescribed safety clearances.

The electricity lines mentioned here were installed in 1980s, before construction of any building underneath. The residents of the area were also served notices by SDO Mandra (**Annex-A**).

It is a fact that presently, the electricity line is passing over the roofs of houses at Village Dk. Bahawal Khan near Railway Phatak, Tehsil Gujar Khan, District Rawalpindi and an estimate for removal of safety hazard line under DOP (Distribution of Power) head has been prepared which will be implemented after completion of codal formalities.

(b) In this regard, the above said safety hazard work will be executed & HT line will be rerouted after necessary approvals; approx. within 2 x Months, subject to provision of right of way.

20. **Syed Rafiullah:**

Will the Minister for Foreign Affairs be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether it is a fact that the Chairman Departmental Transfer Committee (DTC), Director General (HR&CP), did not follow the prescribed criteria for the selection and posting of staff of the Ministry to various foreign Missions;*
- (b) *if so, what criteria was adopted for the allocation of Missions to the staff, particularly in the case of Assistant Private secretaries (APSs), where certain missions not included in the approved allocated DTC list;*
- (c) *whether postings to missions such as Houston USA, were made outside the DTC approved allocations;*
- (d) *if so, the reasons therefor and the action already taken or proposed to be taken to ensure transparency and adherence to the approved criteria in future postings?*

Minister for Foreign Affairs (Senator Mohammad Ishaq Dar):

(a) The Departmental Transfer Committee (DTC) is a recommendatory body, headed by Chairman, i.e. Director General (HR&CP). In line with the approved posting policy of MoFA officials, the Committee examines the entire service profile, ACR record, previous postings, marks obtained in the posting evaluation test, as well as professional and functional requirements of the Mission to finalize its recommendations.

(b) A standard criteria has been devised for posting of MoFA staff, including Assistant Private Secretaries (APS), which is uniformly applied by the DTC to ensure utmost objectivity and transparency. In exceptional circumstances, external factors, including court orders or other pressing medical / education related concerns, are also taken into consideration by the DTC to minimize undue hardship of the staff members at the place of their posting.

(c) An official currently selected for posting to Houston was earlier posted to Ottawa, Canada, however, due to some unavoidable reasons including inordinate delay in issuance of Canadian visa, he could not proceed to Ottawa. It is placed on record that Houston was not vacant during the DTC, therefore, was not included in the vacant station list that time.

(d) DTC is tasked with the significant responsibility to fulfill human resource requirements of Pakistan's Missions abroad. It is not possible to discharge this responsibility solely on the basis of seniority or length of stay at Headquarters. DTC cannot overlook functional requirements of the Mission, professional standing and specific expertise acquired by staff (e.g. protocol duties, handling high level delegations, consular or administrative experience), or any pressing humanitarian considerations, while arriving at its recommendations. To this effect, in addition to service record/ ACRs of the officials, a mechanism of posting evaluation tests is introduced to assess specific skill sets of the staff. Efforts are being undertaken to make the process more dynamic and result oriented.

21. **Ms. Tahira Aurangzeb:**

Will the Minister for Energy (Power Division) be pleased to state:

- (a) *whether it is a fact that High Tension (HT) poles are passing through the Village of Chakri Wakilan, Tehsil Gujar Khan, District Rawalpindi and installed in curve from Al-madina Market;*
- (b) *whether it is also a fact that due to this curve the dangerous HT lines are passing through and over the roof of the buildings, such HT poles required to be shifted on the other side of the road as a safety measures;*
- (c) *if the answers to part (a) and (b) are in affirmative, then, what measures are being taken by the IESCO to shift these HT poles to the other side of the road?*

Minister for Energy (Power Division) (Sardar Awais Ahmad Khan Leghari): (a) Yes, it is a fact that 11KV Thakra feeder is passing through Village of Chakri Wakeelan Tehsil Gujar Khan District Rawalpindi from Al-Madina Market.

(b) No, it is not a fact that due to this curve the dangerous HT line is passing over the roofs of buildings (Al-Madina Market and other existing buildings). However, a new building has been constructed near to an already passing HT line, as a result of which, one HT pole is now located in front of the main gate of this newly constructed building, that

the consumer wants to relocate. As per NEPRA Consumer Service Manual, clause 3.1.3, the relocation in this case is to be done at the applicant's expense along with provision of right of way of by the applicant (**Annex-A**).

(c) In this regard, an estimate for shifting of the HT pole has been prepared on a cost-deposit basis and approved by XEN (E). IESCO Operation Division, Gujar Khan, vide letter No. 772-73 dated 02.02.2026. Demand Notice No. 245 dated 02.02.2026 has been issued to the consumer. After receipt of payment, the work will be executed in due course of time.

(b) Yes, it is a fact that no work has been carried out so far. The reason for the delay pertains to technical non-feasibility of the scheme to be carried out under Sustainable Development Goals Achievement Program (SAP).

As per the guidelines of SAP, a scheme must be identified by at least 10 residents of the area to be considered for electrification under SAP, which was not the case in instant matter (**Annex-A**).

(c) For the provision of new electricity connections to the concerned residents they have been intimated and advised to submit application to IESCO for installation/extension of Low Tension (LT) Structures on cost deposit basis as per IESCO SOP.



وزیر برائے مواصلات (جناب عبدالعلیم خان): (الف) جی ہاں، حکومت پاکستان اس امر

سے پوری طرح آگاہ ہے کہ پاکستان کی موٹرویز کے اطراف حفاظتی باڑ (فیئنگ) کے ٹوٹنے کے واقعات پیش آتے رہے ہیں، جس کے نتیجے میں جنگلی جانوروں اور پیدل افراد کی شاہراہ پر آمدورفت کا خطرہ بڑھ جاتا ہے اور مسافروں کی جان و مال کو نقصان پہنچنے کا اندیشہ ہوتا ہے۔

اس ضمن میں معزز وزیراعظم پاکستان کی ہدایات کی روشنی میں موٹروے نیٹ ورک کے ساتھ نصب حفاظتی باڑ کو پہنچنے والے نقصانات کا جامع جائزہ لینے اور اس کی از سر نو تنصیب کے لیے ایک مفصل منصوبہ

ترتیب دیا گیا۔ چنانچہ تمام باڑ کے شکاف فوری طور پر پر کر دیے گئے تاکہ شاہراہ استعمال کرنے والوں کی سلامتی کو یقینی بنایا جاسکے۔ مزید برآں، مستقبل میں باڑ کی چوری اور تخریب کی روک تھام کے لیے نیشنل ہائی وے اتھارٹی (NHA) اور نیشنل ہائی ویز اینڈ موٹروے پولیس (NHMP) کی جانب سے مفصل معیاری عملی طریقہ کار (SOPs) وضع کیے گئے ہیں، تاکہ اس اثاثہ کی حفاظت اور کسی بھی نقصان کی صورت میں فوری مرمت کو یقینی بنایا جاسکے (نقل ہائے ضمیرہ - الف)۔ بعد ازاں، NHA اور NHMP کی فیلڈ فارمیٹرز باقاعدگی سے حفاظتی باڑ کی نگرانی کرتی ہیں۔ کسی بھی چوری یا نقصان کی صورت میں فوری طور پر قانونی کارروائی عمل میں لائی جاتی ہے اور ملزمان کے خلاف ایف آئی آر درج کی جاتی ہے۔ NHMP کی جانب سے چوری شدہ سرکاری اثاثہ کی برآمدگی کے لیے بھی بیرونی کی جاتی ہے (چند ایف آئی آرز کی نقول ضمیرہ سب میں منسلک ہیں)۔ اسی طرح NHA کی جانب سے باڑ کے شکاف فوری طور پر پر کیے جاتے ہیں۔

2025 کے اعداد و شمار کے مطابق فی صارف اوسط ماہانہ کھپت 162 کلوواٹ آور رہی۔

یہ۔ تو نہ پل منصوبے کے تحت مرکزی پل کی تعمیر مکمل کر لی ہے۔ تاہم، منصوبے کے باقی نہایت اہم اجزاء، یعنی اپروچ سڑکوں اور دریا کی تربیتی تعمیرات (پہنچ- II) کو نیشنل ہائی وے اتھارٹی کی جانب سے PSDP 2025-26 میں شامل کرنے کی تجویز دی گئی تھی، مگر وزارت منصوبہ بندی، ترقی و خصوصی اقدامات (PD&SI) کی جانب سے اس میں کوئی مالی تخصیص نہ کیے جانے کے باعث یہ اسکیم PSDP سے خارج کر دی گئی۔

اس منصوبے کی پیش رفت باقاعدگی سے قومی اسمبلی کی قائمہ کمیٹی برائے بین الصوبائی رابطہ (IPC) کے اجلاسوں میں زیر غور آتی رہی ہے، جہاں NHA اور دیگر متعلقہ فریقین نے مالی سال 2025-26 کے PSDP میں منصوبے کے باقی اجزاء کو شامل کرنے کی فوری ضرورت پر زور دیا۔ پی ایس ڈی پی میں شمولیت کے لیے این ایچ اے کی جانب سے باضابطہ طور پر جمع کرائی گئی تجویز کے باوجود، جون 2025 میں جاری ہونے والے ترمیمی پی ایس ڈی پی میں یہ منصوبہ شامل نہیں کیا گیا۔

بعد ازاں، 18 اکتوبر 2025 کو وزارت مواصلات نے وزارت منصوبہ بندی سے باضابطہ طور پر درخواست کی کہ منصوبہ ”یہ۔ تو نرسہ پل کی اپروچ سڑکوں اور گائیڈینکس کی تعمیر“ کو ترجیحی بنیادوں پر پی ایس ڈی پی 2025-26 میں شامل کیا جائے (منسلک۔ الف)، تاہم تا حال اس حوالے سے کوئی جواب موصول نہیں ہوا۔

(ج) ایک افسر جسے حال ہی میں ہیوسٹن تعینات کیا گیا ہے، اس سے قبل اوٹاوا (کینیڈا) کے لیے منتخب کیا گیا تھا، تاہم بعض ناگزیر وجوہات، بشمول کینیڈین ویزا کے اجراء میں غیر معمولی تاخیر کے باعث وہ اوٹاوا روانہ نہ ہو سکے۔ ریکارڈ پر یہ امر بھی موجود ہے کہ اس وقت حکمانہ تبادلہ کمیٹی کے اجلاس کے دوران ہیوسٹن کی آسامی خالی نہیں تھی، لہذا اسے خالی اسٹیشنوں کی فہرست میں شامل نہیں کیا گیا تھا۔

It is clarified that while investigating such cases, it is found that majority of the reported explosions have primarily resulted from unsafe handling of gas cylinders that results in gas leakage and on catching electric circuit from nearby sources. Further investigation by OGRA and provincial authorities have revealed that such incidents are largely attributable to:

- i. Improper handling and unsafe usage by consumers.
- ii. Illegal decanting and filling operations at unauthorized locations/shops.
- iii. Non-compliance with prescribed safety standards by certain market players/decanterers.

As per Federal Government policy & LPG Rules, OGRA is regulating the LPG sector as per safety standards mentioned therein, including cylinder manufacturing, filling, safe handling, transportation, storage, and marketing. These includes public advisories and safety guidelines for consumers on safe handling/use of LPG cylinders. Consumers are advised to purchase LPG only from licensed distributors and avoid uncertified cylinders. The details of authorized LPG cylinder manufacturing are also available on OGRA website and the same has been advertised as well. OGRA's Enforcement Department conducts routine and surprise inspections of LPG storage / filling plants and marketing operations. Non-compliance results in sealing of facilities with the help of District Authorities, issuance of show-cause notices, financial penalties, suspension or cancellation of licenses. In addition, OGRA coordinates with Provincial Governments, District Administrations, and law enforcement agencies to curb illegal decanting and sale of substandard cylinders. Furthermore, OGRA has transferred powers under Section-29 of OGRA Ordinance 2002 to the local government for taking action against the illegal activities.





Will the Minister for Energy (Petroleum Division) be pleased to state;

a) whether the Government has taken notice of the recurring Liquefied Petroleum Gas (LPG) related accidents across Pakistan, including recent fatal incidents in Islamabad, Multan, Lahore and Mardan;

b) the role of the Oil and Gas Regulatory Authority (OGRA) in regulating LPG safety standards;

c) the actions taken against violators during the last three years; and

d) whether the Government intends to introduce stricter regulations or amendments to existing laws to prevent LPG related accidents and protect public safety?

Yes, the Government has taken serious notice of recurring LPG-related accidents in various parts of the country, including the incidents reported in Islamabad, Multan, Lahore, Mardan, and other cities. Oil and Gas Regulatory Authority (OGRA), in coordination with provincial governments and district administrations, have reviewed these incidents and are actively engaged in strengthening regulatory oversight, enforcement actions, and public safety awareness measures. Preliminary investigations have indicated that most accidents are attributable to illegal decanting practices, use of substandard or uncertified cylinders, unauthorized filling facilities, and non-compliance with prescribed safety standards.

OGRA grants license to the LPG sector under the OGRA Ordinance, 2002, LPG (Production and Distribution) Rules, 2001, and the LPG Policy, 2016.

- i. Issuance of licenses to LPG marketing companies, storage / filling plants, and registration of LPG equipment / cylinder manufacturers / bowsers.
- ii. Ensuring compliance with license conditions
- iii. Conducting inspections of licensed facilities.
- iv. Taking enforcement actions against illegal/ non-compliant licensees.

Coordinating with provincial and district authorities to curb illegal LPG operations.

During the last three years, enforcement actions have been taken against violators in proportion to the severity of the violations. Substantial penalties were imposed, and in cases involving loss of life or injuries, compensation was recovered from the responsible violators in accordance with the applicable legal framework. Details are provided in **Annex-I**

In order to curb illegal LPG activities by the culprits, OGRA has proposed amendments in the section 285 & 286 of Pakistan Penal Code to create deterrence.

THE ACTIONS TAKEN DURING THE LAST THREE YEARS IN LPG SECTOR

A) OGRA's Actions

- 1) **Direct Public Interface and Public Awareness Campaigns:** OGRA is regularly issuing public notices and advertisements through the print & electronic media on safety compliance of LPG cylinders. The same are enclosed at (F/A).
- 2) **OGRA's Field Enforcement Actions in Lahore, Sheikhupura, Gujranwala, Multan and Karachi:** OGRA's regional offices are conducting enforcement inspections at illegal LPG Manufacturing Factories and OGRA registered manufacturers, to curb and control the substandard/ off-spec cylinder manufacturers. Pictures and details of OGRA's field actions are enclosed at (F/B).
- 3) **Constitution of Joint Enforcement Teams in Lahore Division:** OGRA has collaborated with Punjab Home Department, to constitute the Joint Inspection Team, comprising OGRA Officers, concerned Assistant Commissioner and Civil Defence Officer, Department of Explosives, and OGRA's TPI, for taking effective actions against illegal cylinder manufacturers in Lahore and adjoining areas.
- 4) **Sealing of Illegal Factories and registration of FIRs:** The following three (03) illegal Manufacturers, located in Sheikhupura were sealed on 18th May, 2025 and FIR registered against their operators:
 - a) **Hafiz Engineering:** Unregistered/ illegal Manufacturer located adjacent to Hameed & Sons at Kot Abdul Malik, Tehsil Ferozewala, District Sheikhupura.
 - b) **Imran Engineering:** Unregistered/ illegal Manufacturer located adjacent to Mughal Steel Mill at Kot Pindi Das, Mughal Steel Road, Tehsil Ferozewala, Sheikhupura).
 - c) **Un-named Factory:** No title board displayed. An Unregistered/ illegal Manufacturer located parallel to Imran Engineering and Mughal Steel Mill at Kot Pindi Das, Mughal Steel Road, Tehsil Ferozewala, Sheikhupura.
- 5) **Imposition of Penalties on Non-compliant Registered Manufacturers:** A penalty of Rs. 01 Lacs each has been imposed on M/s Unique Engineering Ltd. and M/s Elite Metal Works Ltd. on account of off-spec and substandard manufacturing, besides issuance of strict warnings for future compliance.
- 6) **Sealing and Delisting of Non-compliant Manufacturers –** M/s Hi-Tech Engineering Ltd and M/s Unique Engineering Ltd. were sealed on 28-03-2025 on account of safety violations. Besides, OGRA has delisted M/s Hi-Tech Engineering with the direction to ensure future compliance, prior to restoration.
- 7) **OGRA's directions to Marketing Companies to sell LPG in standard cylinders only to authorized Distributors:** OGRA is taking strict compliance on LPG Companies to develop standardized quality LPG cylinder inventory. Also, LPG Bottling Plants to provide LPG filled cylinders only to their authorized distributors.
- 8) **Eradication of Illegal LPG Decanters:** OGRA in collaboration with district authorities and Civil Defense Department is sealing the illegal LPG decanters, besides registration of FIRs and confiscation of their illegal equipment/ filling pumps/ substandard cylinders.

In addition to above, during the last three years, an LPG accident has been reported in Multan. Following the occurrence, necessary enforcement action was initiated against the responsible violators, details of which have been placed at (F/C) for reference.

OGRA is committed to ensuring a safe and reliable LPG supply chain across Pakistan. In line with the LPG Rules, 2001 and LPG Policy, 2016, all LPG Marketing Companies are hereby directed to register their active LPG Distributors with OGRA, maintain safety compliance, and curb the supply of LPG to unauthorized decanters and outlets.

Due to the alarming rise in unsafe practices involving substandard cylinders and illegal decanting, all LPG Marketing companies must:-

1. Approve and register all Distributors with OGRA.
2. Conduct inventory audit of all Distributors and replace any substandard LPG cylinder.
3. Supply LPG only to authorized Distributors supported by valid sales invoices and gate passes.


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

<p><i>Will the Minister for Communications be pleased to state:</i></p> <p>a) <i>whether the Government is aware that boundary walls along with several Motorways are broken or damaged at multiple locations, there by posing serious risks to the lives and valuable property of daily commuters; if so, the details thereof;</i></p> <p>b) <i>whether any assessment has been conducted in recent times in this regard; if so, the Motorway-wise details thereof;</i></p>	<p>Yes, Government of Pakistan is fully aware of the issue of broken fence along motorways of Pakistan which may cause serious threat to road commuters due to unwanted entries of stray animal and pedestrians. In this regard a comprehensive plan was made with the directions of the Honorable Prime Minister of Pakistan to assess the extent of damages of fence along motorways network of Pakistan and its re-installation. Accordingly, all fence gaps were plugged on war footing for the safety of the road commuters. Furthermore, for prevention of the fence from future theft and damages, detailed Standard Operating Procedures were developed by NHA and NHMP for safety and security of this vital asset and to ensure plugging of gaps in case of theft/damage (Copies enclosed at Annex-A).</p> <p>Since then NHA and NHMP field formations maintain record of installed fence and in case of any theft or damage, immediate cognizance of offence is taken in which FIRs are lodged against the offenders. The same is also followed up by NHMP for recoveries of the theft asset from the culprits (copies of some FIRs are enclosed at Annex-B) and immediate plugging of fence gaps by NHA is also ensured.</p> <p>It is pertinent to mention here that damage and theft of fence is recurring process. However, in this regard, amendment in relevant laws is also under process with recommendations of Law & Justice Division for increase in penalties against offenders. Joint Survey of damaged/theft fence for the month of January 2026 has been prepared (enclosed at Annex-C.)</p> <p>Yes, Joint Assessment of damaged/theft fence along motorways is carried out by NHA & NHMP on monthly basis and its report is shared with Ministry of Communications. The latest assessment of damaged/theft fence along motorways for the month of January 2026 has been made jointly by NHA and NHMP (enclosed at Annex-C)</p>

<p>c) <i>whether the absence of effective oversight, inadequate patrolling and lack of regular monitoring has aggravated security and safety concerns on these Motorways; and</i></p>	<p>A comprehensive oversight mechanism is in place to ensure security on Motorways. Patrolling operations are monitored in real time through technology-based systems, supplemented by mandatory daily supervisory patrolling at all levels. Random checks by supervisory officers further ensure compliance with prescribed standards. Patrols are deployed as per approved strength to maintain adequate coverage. Consequently, crime has decreased by 40%, from 81 cases in 2024 to 48 cases in 2025, due to focused identification of crime-prone areas, enhanced patrolling, deployment of anti-crime squads and strengthened liaison with other LEAs.</p>

NHMP has developed a regular monitoring mechanism, elaborated in part-c of the question.</p>

Mechanism & Standard Operating Procedure for Management of Fence

Preamble:

As per NHA Code, NHA is responsible for maintenance and preservation of its network, refurbishment of safety devices, guard rail and chain link fence, etc. Installed fence along motorways is a costly road safety infrastructure element which is vulnerable to frequent damage and theft. Keeping the fence free of gaps is essential to ensure safety of commuters. For this purpose, effective coordination is required between NHA, NHMP and Local Law Enforcement Agencies. In this regard, following mechanism has been formulated for effective coordination and for management of installed fence to keep it gap free:

Monitoring & Reporting of Incidents:

- Protection of fence is exclusive responsibility of NHMP. Section 90 of National Highway Safety Ordinance 2000 empowers NHMP to inspect and oversee installation of such other facilities on or along the national highways as are necessary for ensuring good order and safety of the public, to take cognizance of offences committed thereon, to undertake initial investigation in respect of offences committed on national highways and then transfer the cases to concerned police station for investigation and to keep the highways clear from any encroachment.
- In discharge of above stated responsibility, NHA Field staff shall keep close liaison with NHMP and shall extend full support. Any incident of theft or intentional damage noted by NHMP and reported to NHA shall be followed through by the Deputy Director (Maintenance) for confirmation of FIR registered along with its follow up by NHMP. During routine inspection, if any such unreported theft or damage found, the same shall also be notified to concerned NHMP officers for cognizance of offence, registration of FIR and further legal action.

Keeping the fence Gap Free

- Refurbishment/Re-installation of fence is responsibility of NHA. DD (Maintenance) unit shall maintain stock of barbed wire sufficient for installation of 1,000 meters' length of fencing (as per NHA approved specifications) in store through the Routine Maintenance Contractors. Upon report received from NHMP of any gap developed through theft or damage or any such gap noted by field staff (to be simultaneously notified to NHMP), concerned Deputy Director (Maintenance) shall ensure plugging the gap within 24 hours and shall get the store replenished within 48 Hours.
- All repair/Re-installation of fence shall be carried out under written directions of Deputy Director (Maintenance) containing exact length and RD of the fence to be repaired/re-installed. Copy of the same shall be provided to NHMP for ensuring effective monitoring.

- In case of failure by the RM Contractor to re-install/replenish the barbed wire, the DD (Maintenance) shall arrange installation/replenishment of store through other means including EM etc. the DD (Maintenance) shall fine the RM contractor double the amount of re-installation cost (as incurred by NHA) and initiate the case for termination of contract of company in case of repeated failure.
- Upon completion of the rectification, DD (Maintenance) shall forward Completion Report to Director (Maintenance) and GM (Region) along-with Photographs containing GPS location and shall also maintain the inventory of the same duly countersigned by NHMP.

Coordination and Follow-up:

- AD/Inspector shall submit Fortnightly Report on prescribed proforma to DD (Maintenance) Unit, who shall reconcile the same on monthly basis with the Sector Incharge of NHMP and shall submit monthly report to GM (Region) through Director (Maintenance).
- GM (Region) shall submit monthly report comprising inventory, latest status and Fence theft/reinstallation, FIRs and Follow-up Status on prescribed proforma to Member (Zone) and RAMD.
- GM (Region) and Member (Zone) shall hold coordination meetings on monthly basis with their NHMP counterparts i.e. DIG (Zone) & Add. IG (Region) respectively. The meetings shall be attended in person by the concerned officers and shall be held in the offices of NHA & NHMP on alternate basis. The meeting shall review status of fence, registration of FIRs, follow-up and recovery and punishments.
- A monthly meeting shall be held between Member (E-C) and Add. IG (Operations) HQ in the offices of NHA & NHMP on alternate basis to review status of fence, registration of FIRs, follow-up, recovery & sentences. Performance of NHA & NHMP field formations shall also be reviewed.
- A quarterly review meeting shall be held between Chairman NHA and IG NHMP.
- Proper inventory of fence shall be maintained by concerned units on all highways, motorways and expressways for inspection by superior offices of NHA.

Expenditure and Adjustment:

- Expenditure for re-installation / replenishing of theft shall be reconciled by GM (Region) with GM (Finance) NHA HQ on quarterly basis. However, on yearly reconciliation, 50% of Cost of theft/ intentional damaged fence (on rates approved by NHA and NHMP joint committee) less the cost of recovered items shall be shared by NHMP from the RSF Fund, as per TORs jointly approved by IG NHMP and Chairman NHA.

Responsibility & Accountability:

- It is responsibility of NHA field formation to keep the fence free of gaps.

9/4/25.

- Any gap observed by NHA Staff or reported by NHMP or through any other means is required to be plugged immediately but not later than 24 Hours. In case of failure, action shall be taken as per E&D rules against the field formation.
- This SOP shall be made part of the Contract Documents of Routine Maintenance Contracts.

The key terms and details of the contract governing the supply of natural gas from the Qadirpur Field are attached as *Annex-A*. The pricing framework for Qadirpur Gas Field is governed by the Natural Gas (Well-Head Price) Regulations, 2009, under which the Oil & Gas Regulatory Authority (OGRA) has the legal power to determine and notify a field-specific well-head gas price. As per OGRA's pricing notification dated 7th February, 2025, the wellhead price of natural gas of agreed specification, produced from Qadirpur Gas Field effective from January, 2025 is Rs. 839.87 per MMBTU.

The details of current daily production of natural gas from Qadirpur Oil and Gas Field is as under:-

Gas Sales & Purchase Agreement was made between OGDCL, which is operator of Qadirpur gas field and SNGPL which is Buyer. Qadirpur gas field is located in District Ghotki of Sindh Province. It was agreed between Seller and Buyer from 01st delivery date i.e. 23.09.1995. Annual Contractual Quantity (ACQ) will be **200 MMCFD** for two succeeding Contract Years. After that revised Quantity increased to **300 MMCFD**.
- 2. Supplemental Agreement to the GSA for Qadirpur Field Dated 18th December 2003.**
The supplemental Agreement was made on 18th December 2003 between OGDCL and SNGPL. Under this Supplemental Agreement, ACQ revised as under:

 - W.e.f. 15th Jan 2004, revised Quantity **365 MMCFD**.
 - W.e.f. 28th Feb 2004, revised Quantity **405 MMCFD**.
 - W.e.f. 31st Mar 2004, revised Quantity **450 MMCFD**.
- 3. Second Supplemental Agreement to the Qadirpur Gas Sales and Purchase Agreement Dated 10th October 2009.**
The second Supplemental Agreement was made on 10th October 2009, wherein working interest of JV partners (OGDCL, KPBV, PPL & PKPEL) was revised.
- 4. Third Supplemental Agreement to the Qadirpur Gas Sales and Purchase Agreement Dated 27th October 2016.**
The Third Supplemental Agreement was made on 27th October 2016, wherein contract period was extended from 23rd Sept 2015 till validity of Qadirpur lease and gas quantity was also revised as follow:
M/s OGDCL provided gas quantities for CY 2025 Qadirpur field is **50 MMCFD**, dated 27.02.2025.
M/s OGDCL provided gas quantities for CY 2026 Qadirpur field is **37 MMCFD**, dated 26.01.2026.
- 5. Gas Sales & Purchase Agreement for Permeate Gas Dated 30th September 2008.**
This Permeate Gas Sale & Purchase Agreement (Permeate GSA), signed on 30th September 2008, involves OGDCL, KPBV, PPL, PKPEL, and PKPEL2 (Sellers) and Sui Northern Gas Pipelines Limited (Buyer). It governs the sale of 75 MMSCFD of Permeate Gas, a by-product of Qadirpur Gas Field processing plant, containing high H₂S and CO₂. The gas is supplied to Engro Energy Limited for power generation via a dedicated pipeline.
- 6. First Supplemental Agreement to the Qadirpur Gas Sales and Purchase Agreement for Permeate Gas Dated May 2023.**
This First Supplemental Agreement, signed in May 2023, extends the Permeate Gas Sale & Purchase Agreement (Permeate GSA) beyond its original expiry date of 31st December 2017, aligning it with the Qadirpur Lease's validity. It revises the Daily Contract Quantity (DCQ) based on quarterly reservoir assessments, with Permeate Gas production expected to range between 14-31 MMSCFD from 2022-2027.



<p>Will the Minister for Communications be pleased to state the time by which the roads of Layyah-Taunsa Bridge will be constructed?</p>	<p>The National Highway Authority (NHA) has completed the bridge section of the Layyah-Taunsa Bridge Project; however, the omission of the said project for the balance crucial components i.e., Approach Roads and River Training Works (Package-II) were proposed by NHA for inclusion in NHA PSDP 2025-26. However allocation was not made by the Ministry of PD&SI and the scheme was dropped.</p> <p>This project's progress has been consistently monitored during National Assembly Standing Committee on Inter Provincial Coordination (IPC meetings), where the NHA and other stakeholders have emphasized the critical need to include the remaining project elements in the PSDP for the fiscal year 2025-26.</p> <p>Despite the NHA's formal submission for PSDP inclusion, the final PSDP released in June 2025 did not reflect this project.</p> <p>Consequently, on October 8, 2025, Ministry of Communications requested the Ministry of Planning to ensure the "Construction of Approach Roads and Guide Banks of Layyah-Taunsa Bridge" to include in the PSDP 2025-26 on priority (Annex-A). Till date, a response to this effect is pending.</p> <p>The NHA's ability to commence the construction of essential approach roads and river training works is contingent upon the project's inclusion in the PSDP and the subsequent allocation of adequate funding.</p>

The following outlines the millent project details:

- Package-I: Main Bridge Construction (Completed).
- Package-II: Construction of 2-Lane Approach Roads connecting Layyah with Taunsa and Training Works.
- Contractor: M/s KNK JV
- Project Cost: Rs. 3874 Million
- Date of Commencement: 20-January-2022
- Date of Completion: 19-January-2024
- Progress: 10.07% (against the planned 100%)

The primary reason for the delay in Package-II stems from the poor performance and subsequent abandonment of the project by the contractor, M/S KNK JV, after achieving only 10% completion.

Consequently, the NHA initiated action against the contractor, culminating in the formal cancellation of the contract on 4-December-2023.

It is crucial to recognize that the omission of the project from PSDP 2025-26 effectively postpones the tendering and procurement processes until Financial Year 2026-27, contingent upon the allocation of funds in the subsequent PSDP 2026-27. Therefore, expedited action is imperative to ensure the timely completion of the Layyah-Taunsa Bridge Project and realize its intended socio-economic benefits.





The National Highway Authority (NHA) has successfully completed the bridge segment of the Kallur Kot Bridge Project over River Indus, in accordance with the decision made by the Central Development Working Party (CDWP) dated 12-Sep-2017. According to this decision, the construction of approach roads on each side is the responsibility of the respective Provincial Governments of Punjab and KP and completion of approach roads is a technical prerequisite for the installation of Guide Banks. Nevertheless, both the approach roads and the Guide Banks remain unconstructed even after the passage of eight (8) years, hindering the project's overall functionality and restraining the project from achieving its full operational potential.

2. Additionally, approach roads and River Training works of Layyah - Taunsa Bridge over River Indus are yet to be completed and require immediate attention. Similar to the Kallur Kot Bridge, this bridge is also crucial for enhancing regional connectivity and ensuring smooth / seamless travel for commuters, serving the greater public interest.

3. Furthermore, the status of both the Kallur Kot and Layyah - Taunsa Bridge Projects has been a topic of discussion in all meetings of the National Assembly Standing Committee on Inter-Provincial Coordination (IPC). During these meetings, stakeholders - including representatives from the Planning Commission - have collectively and unanimously agreed and stressed on the urgent need to include these projects in the Public Sector Development Program (PSDP) for the fiscal year 2025-26. Although the NHA included both these projects in its PSDP 2025-26 submission to Planning Commission, however it is disconcerting to note that none of these projects has been included in the final PSDP 2025-26 released by the MoPD&SI in June 2025.

4. In light of these considerations, it is imperative that the matter may kindly be taken up with Ministry of Planning, Development & Special Initiatives to ensure the inclusion of both the Kallur Kot and Layyah-Taunsa Bridge Projects in the PSDP for FY 2025-26.

Subject: - DISCUSSION/DIRECTION OF THE 204TH MEETING OF BOARD OF DIRECTORS, PESCO.

PESCO Board of Directors in its 204th Board meeting held on 12-07-2024, deliberated the following agenda point. The discussion and the resolution of the Board is as under: -

Agenda Point # 13

Adoption of Policy for Seniority placement, Promotion Mechanism amongst Qualification and Non-Qualification based Seniorities for Line Staff, Upper Technical Subordinate (UTS) and GSO staff of PESCO.

Manager (HR) presented the case to the Board, explaining that during its 201st meeting held on April 30, 2024, the PESCO Board of Directors directed the management to:

- Evaluate the proposal from the Chief Engineer Technical and present a viable solution to the HR & Nomination Committee on a priority basis.
- Urgently process all pending promotions for line staff, GSO staff, and junior engineers.
- Require prior NOC from PESCO for considering higher qualifications, and prevent acceptance of concealed higher education later.
- Expedite promotions for B-Tech, DAE, Matriculate, and UTS LS staff, addressing any seniority issues and finalizing the proposal.

Manager (HR) reported that, in compliance, the policy developed under the Chief Technical Officer's supervision has been thoroughly reviewed by the (HR) department and is comprehensive.

Manager (HR) outlined the current quota system for UTS staff at PESCO:

- **Direct Quota (70%):** 207 reserved seats, with 143 availed and 64 remaining.
- **Induction of UTS Staff (Graduate Engineers, 5%):** 15 reserved seats, 16 availed, resulting in a 1-seat deficit.
- **Promotion of UTS Staff (B.Tech Honours, 5%):** 15 reserved seats, 13 availed, 2 remaining.
- **Promotion of UTS Staff (Diploma Holders, 12.5%):** 37 reserved seats, 29 availed, 8 remaining.
- **Promotion of UTS Staff (Matriculation, 7.5%):** 22 reserved seats, 4 availed, 18 remaining.

Manager (HR) also presented the proposed quota allocation in the table below:

Manager (HR) further appraised that the existing working strength under 12.5% DAE i.e. 15 Nos. & 7.5% UTS Matric i.e. 04 Nos. [prevailing policy] will be adjusted against the 15% Open quota [new policy] to avoid audit/legal objections at a belated stage. The integrated seniority list of UTS under the proposed policy was also presented before the Board.

Manager (HR) further elaborated the following recommendation to BOD for consideration:

- Adoption of the proposed policy framed by the committee headed by Chief Technical Officer PESCO, regarding seniority placement, promotion mechanism amongst qualification and non-qualification-based seniorities for line staff, Upper Technical Subordinate Staff and GSO Staff, with immediate effect.
- As HR Directorate has already carried out promotion against various quotas on prevailing policy, therefore, the working strength of those Junior Engineers promoted under the prevailing reserved quota UTS (DAE i.e. 12.5%) & (Matriculate i.e. 7.5%) shall be adjusted/ counted against the new proposed OPEN quota (15%) for all UTSS, to avoid complications / audit / legal objections at a belated stage.

- c. be merged being qualification-based seniority similar to the seniority of LM-I (Matric) & LM-I (Non-Matric) which have been recommended for merger / consolidation as per Clause-A (15) and Clause-B (5) & Clause-B(6) of the proposed new policy.
- d. The qualification for hiring of ALMs shall be Matriculation only (Minimum & Maximum) as already clarified / conveyed by Ministry of Energy (MoE) Islamabad.
- e. With immediate effect, ALMs already working in PESCO with matric qualification may acquire higher qualification during service, if interested and deemed fit by the competent authority by requesting for proper No Objection Certificate (NoC) and getting prior approval from the competent authority.
- f. Those ALMs have already possessed over & above matriculation qualification shall not be allowed any financial benefits or promotion and shall not be included / considered for qualification-based seniority lists / qualification-based promotion.
- g. ALMs who already possess higher qualification shall not be allowed Ex-post Facto NOCs/ approvals under any circumstances.
- h. In future, the competent authority shall initiate strict disciplinary action against ALMs, who already possess higher qualification but conceal it at the time of apply / recruitment process, so that the rights of matriculate candidates could be protected, and they are not discriminated in the written tests/ exams etc.

Manager HR appraised the BOD that almost 27 officials will be promoted under the new policy while 10 officials were able to be promoted under the old policy.

COO PESCO, CE T&G, FD PESCO and CE PMU also recommended the subject policy for adoption as it will facilitate the promotion of staff.


Various queries were raised by the board members regarding UTS quota of graduate engineers which were clarified by the management.

RESOLUTION 204-BOD-R15

After detailed deliberation & discussion, upon the request of the management and recommendation of the 4th HR, Legal & Other Miscellaneous Matters Committee, the Board accorded approval for Adoption of the proposed new policy regarding seniority placement, promotion mechanism amongst qualification and non-qualification-based seniorities for line staff, Upper Technical Subordinate staff and GSO staff, with immediate effect.

All the recommendations of PESCO Management, considered by BOD/BOD HR Committee must be incorporated in this policy and final version of policy be circulated to all concerned for implementation as per rules.

In future, all the DAE qualified ALM/LM-II, have to pass the DPT meant for normal line of promotion, as well, i.e. T-200 & T-300, required for seniority cum fitness basis promotion in normal line of promotion, as per integrated seniority lists at circle level, and as well as, all the DAE qualified ALM/LM-II will have to pass D-500 DPT for induction quota on the basis of higher qualification as per seniority list maintained at HQ level.
 - For example, an ALM whom acquires DAE has to pass both DPT i.e. T-200 and D-500, similarly a LM-II whom acquires DAE has to pass both DPT i.e. T-300 and D-500 for being considered in both promotion/ induction lines as per both seniorities lists maintained at Circle and HQ level respectively. However a LM-I whom acquires DAE has to pass only the higher qualification DPT i.e. D-500 for being considered in both type of promotion/induction (Seniority cum fitness basis and that of higher qualification basis) as per seniority list maintained at HQ level.
9. The seniorities of the operational line-staff will be fixed, on the basis of date of induction/promotion of the line staff as per normal practice. (Whichever is later).
10. After adoption of the proposed policy, any line-staff (Operational) whom acquires or otherwise possesses DAE degree may also be eligible to apply for placement in both line of promotion/ induction and seniorities subject to departmental permission/NOC and duly verified from the concerned Technical Board.
11. After adoption of the proposed policy, the operational line staff upon acquiring/ possessing DAE with NOC during service, the official has to serve for at least 2 years in the same post, after date of completion/ issuance of DAE qualification, for being considered for induction under DAE induction quota. (This is proposed so as to remove discrimination and to equalize the conditions with GSO staff).
12. Other promotion/induction parameters already under consideration as per practice in vogue will remain intact (also mentioned above in "Mechanism for Induction/ Promotion Boards").
13. The word/term acquiring of qualification will now be replaced with words/terms "acquiring or possessing" of qualification.
14. All employees will be required to disclose their higher qualification within one month, after implementation of new proposed policy, regarding their already possessed higher qualification which has not been disclosed to department/PESCO. Similarly no regularization of higher qualification will be given in future which has been acquired during the service without NOC/ permission of the department because dodging the department, concealing and insubordination are serious misconduct, thereby strict disciplinary action shall be taken against the delinquents.
15. There will be no discretionary power of IIR/PESCO management, regarding issuance of NOC for getting/acquiring higher qualification. i.e. no discrimination between influential employee and ordinary employee. If NOC is allowed to any employee then it

It has come in to the notice of highups that the Promotion and Time Scale Upgradation cases considered at Circle level under your respective competencies vary from case to case basis as well as the practice amongst the Circles also requires uniformity to avoid complexities at any belated stage.

In light of the above, the guidelines / instruction for convening the Promotion/Time Scale Upgradation Board have been conveyed from time to time. However, it is once again conveyed that while considering the Promotion / Time Scale Upgradation cases at Circle level the following codal formalities/eligibility parameters should be followed in true letter & spirit and these parameters shall be assessed through departmental committee wherein S.E/PD/Manager concerned shall be the convener along with 3 other officers of the concerned circle as members.

- **61 industries contributed Rs. 64.862 million** in cash / in-kind support across 57 projects.
- Project progress is monitored through biannual and annual reports, external expert evaluation, and review meetings.
- **10 projects** under the Product Development Call and **09 PSF-TÜBİTAK** projects involve active industry participation.

COMSATS University Islamabad (CUI)

- CUI's engages industrial and clinical partners at the proposal stage through consent and support letters.
- Upon approval, projects proceed through co-funding or contractual arrangements.
- Currently, no unified framework exists; it is stated that the Ministry may establish SOPs or legislation for industry-integrated R&D governance.

National University of Technology (NUTECH)

- NUTECH acquires industry problems through Chambers and business associations and converts them into research projects.
- Projects are undertaken by faculty and students, with collaboration from other universities when required.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Research outputs are consolidated and implemented in industry, while trained human resources are fed back to industry. • Some solutions result in startups, which either merge into mainstream industry or operate independently.
<p>f. how is Ministry monitoring the follow up to ensure industry use, not just academic publication?</p>	<p>The Ministry and its attached organizations follow a structured monitoring and follow-up mechanism to ensure that R&D outputs are used by industry and lead to commercialization. Following are the details:</p> <p>Pakistan Council of Scientific & Industrial Research (PCSIR):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • PCSIR follows a defined monitoring and evaluation framework to ensure effective implementation and socio-economic impact. This includes regular progress reporting through quarterly, annual, and completion reports, and monitoring of commercialization indicators such as patents filed or granted, technologies licensed, products developed, revenues generated, startups or incubations created, and industrial adoption of prototypes. • Each funded project is overseen by a Project Steering Committee, comprising MoST representatives, industrial experts, academia, and PCSIR or relevant organization officials. Through these mechanisms, the Ministry ensures that R&D outputs result in commercialization, industrial application, and economic impact, rather than remaining academic-only outcomes.

Pakistan Science Foundation (PSF)

In academia-industry research projects funded by PSF, follow-up to ensure industry use is done through:

- Continuous monitoring of project milestones
- Close industry-academia coordination
- Evaluation at project completion
- Industry feedback through meetings / visits

Under PSF's Industry Linkage Program and CRP Triple Helix framework, these steps support commercialization. In addition, the PSF-TÜBİTAK Türkiye Academia-Industry Cooperation Call ensures continued engagement between researchers and industry partners on both sides.

National University of Technology (NUTECH)

NUTECH has a well-structured mechanism in place to ensure effective follow-up and industry, utilization of its research outputs.

- The University periodically conducts follow-up meetings and engagement sessions with relevant industry partners to share the developed ideas, prototypes, and projects.
- A close monitoring process is maintained to track progress, ensuring adherence to timelines, availability and utilization of funds, and alignment with industry requirements.
- This coordinated mechanism enables continuous feedback, improved commercialization potential, and practical industry uptake beyond academic publication.

a) whether it is a fact that High Tension (HT) poles are passing through the Village of Chakri Wakilan, Tehsil Gujar Khan, District Rawalpindi and installed in curve from Al-madina Market;	Yes, it is a fact that 11KV Thakra feeder is passing through Village of Chakri Wakeelan Tehsil Gujar Khan District Rawalpindi from Al-Madina Market.
b) whether it is also a fact that due to this curve the dangerous HT lines are passing through and over the roof of the buildings, such HT poles required to be shifted on the other side of the road as a safety measures;	No, it is not a fact that due to this curve the dangerous HT line is passing over the roofs of buildings (Al Madina Market and other existing buildings). However, a new building has been constructed near to an already passing HT line, as a result of which, one HT pole is now located in front of the main gate of this newly constructed building, that the consumer wants to relocate. As per NEPRA Consumer Service Manual, clause 3.1.3, the relocation in this case is to be done at the applicant's expense along with provision of right of way of by the applicant (Annex-A).
c) if the answers to part (a) and (b) are in affirmative, then, what measures are being taken by the IESCO to shift these HT poles to the other side of the road?	In this regard, an estimate for shifting of the HT pole has been prepared on a cost-deposit basis and approved by XEN (E), IESCO Operation Division, Gujar Khan, vide letter No. 772-73 dated 02.02.2026. Demand Notice No. 245 dated 02.02.2026 has been issued to the consumer. After receipt of payment, the work will be executed in due course of time.

CHAPTER 3

RELOCATION OF DISTRIBUTION FACILITY AND TEMPORARY CONNECTION

3.1 RELOCATION OF DISTRIBUTION FACILITY

3.1.1 Due to Public Works

If, for public improvement such as road construction, street widening, grading, excavating sidewalk spaces, or for other reasons DISCO has to move distribution facilities from the existing position or new facility is to be provided for improvement of the system, the shifting/relocation/addition of the facility shall be carried out at the cost of the sponsoring agency.

3.1.2 On Applicant's/ Consumer's Request

If an applicant/ consumer requires the relocation of a distribution facility i.e. HT/LT lines, transformers, structures, etc. for convenience, because of construction, or otherwise DISCO shall, at the consumer's expense, relocate the distribution facility, if found feasible. In such case, the provision of right of way will be the responsibility of the applicant/consumer.

3.1.3 If any person constructs a house, shop or a building etc. near /under any existing distribution facility and subsequently applies for relocation of the same, it shall be relocated at the applicant's expense along with provision of right of way of by the applicant.

3.1.4 DISCO cannot construct any distribution facility over any house/building etc. without consent of the owner/consumer. If the DISCO constructs distribution facility over any house/building etc. without the consent of the owner/consumer, the DISCO shall relocate the facility at its own cost, on request of the owner/consumer.

3.1.5 In the event of relocation, overhead system or any part thereof may be converted into underground system or vice versa, as the case may be in accordance with the ground situation.

3.1.6 Shifting of Distribution Line/ Pole/ Transformer etc:

The applicant shall make payment through Demand Notice as under:

- i. Shifting and installation charges @ 10 % of cost of material (at prevailing rates) to be shifted at new site.
- ii. Cost of extra/new material required for shifting of distribution facility at the new site/ place including 12% Store handling charges/Store Issue rate.
- iii. 8% of the new/extra material cost as installation charges.



Note: The above provisions are also applicable for relocation of transmission facility.

b) whether it is also a fact that till date no work has been carried out so far, reasons for delay thereof; and	Yes, it is a fact that no work has been carried out so far. The reason for the delay pertains to technical non-feasibility of the scheme, to be carried out under Sustainable Development Goals Achievement Program (SAP). As per the guidelines of SAP, a scheme must be identified by at least 10 residents of the area to be considered for electrification under SAP, which was not the case in instant matter (Annex-A).
c) What measures are being taken by the IESCO to complete the aforesaid project as the people of the vicinity are suffering?	For the provision of new electricity connections to the concerned residents they have been intimated and advised to submit application to IESCO for installation/ extension of Low Tension (LT) Structures on cost deposit basis as per IESCO SOP.

No. F. 1(1)/2020-SO(Dev-II). Federal Cabinet has been pleased to revise Sustainable Development Goals Achievement Programme (SAP)'s Guidelines in terms of its decision vide case No.166/Rule-19/2020 dated 05.03.2020, with the recommendations of Steering Committee made in its 9th meeting dated 23.01.2020, to meet on ground difficulties and address the actual needs of community in different socio-economic regions.

2. The schemes of following Sectors would qualify from SDGs achievement Programme (SAP) to develop human resources and ensure balance regional growth:

- i. Education
- ii. Health
- iii. Clean Drinking Water
- iv. Roads (including Streets, Culverts, Bridges etc.)
- v. Sanitation
- vi. Gas (Missing gas infrastructure, subject to availability of Gas, duly certified by the Petroleum Division)
- vii. Electricity
- viii. Interventions leading to SDGs (i.e. Graveyard, Janazagah, Places of all Worship, Playgrounds, Public Parks and other Community Development initiatives etc.).

3. The following procedure will be adopted for implementing the programme:

- i. At least 10 residents of the area, will identify the scheme(s), and the scheme(s) with estimated cost ranging between Rs. 0.25 million to Rs. 50 million shall be included in the Programme. In case of the Gas Sector Scheme(s), the upper limit will be up to Rs. 300 million. In case of the Power Sector scheme(s) the lower limit shall be Rs. 0.15¹ million.
- ii)(a) The request of schemes shall be forwarded by the residents to the concerned Deputy Commissioners for processing and approval from the approving forum as per rules / policy / instructions.


- b) The request of schemes may also be forwarded by the residents to the federal executing agencies of respective Ministries / Divisions for processing and approval from the approving forum as per rules / policy / instructions.
- iii) Steering Committee is authorized to recommend release of lump-sum allocation of proposed funds to the Provincial Governments, Federal Ministries and Divisions for further release/ utilization by the executing agencies against approved schemes. The funds will be released in form of Sanction Letter/ Surrender orders. The Provincial Governments and Federal Ministries/ Division will ensure following:-
- a. The scheme (s) are feasible and are in public interest.
 - b. No other executing agency has undertaken or is undertaking the same scheme(s) in the area.
 - c. Federal Executing Agencies will obtain NOC from the Provincial Governments / District Governments that they will bear Operation and Maintenance (O&M), and recurring cost of the schemes after completion.
- iv) Land for the purpose of development scheme(s) where applicable, shall not form part of the cost estimates of the scheme. In case private land is offered by the community, its mutation in the name of designated government agency shall be effected prior to execution of the scheme. In exceptional cases, land acquisition will be processed under the provisions of Land Acquisition Act, 1894, with approval of the Steering Committee.
- v) PPRA rules shall be followed wherever applicable.
- vi) Unspent funds / savings against gas development schemes can be spent in any district / province for new and old gas development schemes with the approval of the SAP Steering Committee.²
- vii) PAOs of Ministries / Chairman (P&D Board) ACS (Dev) shall be responsible to ensure the quality of work and furnish to Cabinet Division the monthly progress on physical work and utilization of funds (Proforma enclosed).
- viii) Expenditure shall not be incurred on purchase of equipment (if not part of the scheme), vehicles, fixtures, salaries, printing of diaries/ calendars/ banners, holding of official meetings and dinner parties etc. Similarly, no administrative overheads shall be charged by any agency for execution of these schemes.
- ix) The PAOs/ Chairman (P&D Board) /ACS (Dev) will obtain completion status (Proforma enclosed) of the schemes from the respective executing agencies / districts and furnish a certificate to Cabinet Division.
- x) The Provincial Governments / Federal Ministries and Divisions shall be responsible for utilization / expenditure and disbursement of funds under the programs. Funds disbursed and utilized on the schemes under the

- xi) The concerned Federal Ministries/ Provincial Governments/ Executing Agencies will ensure to fulfill all the legal / codal formalities for utilization of funds. They will be responsible for statutory audit of the funds and clearing all the liabilities as a result of any adjudication / legal dispensation.
- xii) The Divisional Commissioner shall oversee the progress of schemes in the districts by establishing Divisional level monitoring setup and submit monitoring reports to Steering Committee through respective Planning and Development Departments.
- xiii) Steering Committee headed by a Federal Minister and Parliamentarians as members, to be nominated by the Federal Cabinet shall be constituted and will be responsible for overall supervision of the programme including approval for allocation/release of funds. Terms of References (TORs) of the Steering Committee are as under:

ToRs

- a. Steering Committee shall approve release / surrender of funds to Provincial Governments, Federal Ministries and Divisions.
 - b. Ensuring implementation of the programme through Provincial Governments and line Ministries/Divisions as per approved policy.
 - c. Periodically review the progress of the programme.
 - d. To resolve the issues arising during the implementation process of the programme.
 - e. To oversee the financial aspects of the Programme.
 - f. Any other matter related to the programme.
4. The above approved Revised SAP's Guidelines supersede the earlier SAP Guidelines.
